And may the gracious care of the LORD our God be ours; prosper the work of our hands for us! Prosper the work of our hands!



SECOND READING—Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Brothers and sisters:

If you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory.

Put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly: immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and the greed that is idolatry. Stop lying to one another, since you have taken off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator. Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcision and uncircumcision, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all and in all.

GOSPEL-Luke 12:13-21

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him, "Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd, "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable. "There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!" But God said to him, 'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

ast week, the Spirit led us through a reflection on the mystical death and resurrection that is Baptism. This week, he presses further into that motif in a highly pragmatic way. If you have died and risen with Jesus Christ, then what difference does it make?

If people around us look at us and see that our lives look no different than anyone else's, then they should rightly conclude that Jesus Christ makes no difference at all. Let those words sink in. Do I live as if Jesus Christ makes no difference at all? The Spirit is asking each

of us: what difference does Jesus make? Is he worth "seeking what is above" and putting to death "the parts of you that are earthly"? Or does Jesus simply allow me to continue seeking what is earthly and putting to death whatever would elevate my vision?

What strikes me most in this reading is the admonition

to "put to death, then, the parts of you that are earthly." The Spirit does not say to limit them or to give them up for a while or even to avoid them. He says to kill them. My desire to be praised needs to be killed. My spirit of acquisition that makes it look like stuff will make me happy needs to be killed. My immorality, my impurity, my passion, my evil desire, my greed that is idolatry, my lying, all of it needs to be put to death. If that happens, then my life should look very different from the cultural norm. It will look as if Jesus Christ makes a difference.

We have "taken off the old self with its practices and have put on the new self," which should have different practices. What difference does Jesus make in your life? The word "holy" does not mean "perfect" or "better than" or "has it all figured out." It means to be set apart for the Lord's

> purposes. Holy water is ordinary tap water that has been set apart by the blessing of the Church to be used for Baptism and blessing. Holy oil is regular olive oil that has been set apart by the blessing of the Church to be used to celebrate sacraments. In short, to be holy is to be different, set apart. We do not put holy water in a glass and drink it, and we do not cook with the holy oils. As a

should look different from someone's who is not set apart for the Lord's purposes. This is not triumphalism, but it is other than.

In being set apart, in living differently, I can "be renewed, for knowledge, in the image of [my] creator." That is the Spirit's challenge this week. Seek what is above. Think of what is above. Put to death what is below. Live out the dying to the old self and rising as a child of God who lives differently. It is easier said than done, but Jesus is worth it and Jesus will help you to be able to do it.

ne of my favorite aspects of my job is meeting young families at Baptism Prep classes and talking with them about the beautiful mystery that is Christian parenting. Baptism Prep classes are for new parents (yes, you can come before your baby is born) and for parents who have not been to a Baptism class in at least four years (because we all need a refresher and a spiritual boost). Kids of all ages are welcome to come with their parents.

Of course, we discuss the signs and symbols of Baptism, but we also dig into the concept of Christian parenting and how to raise a child in the faith. Just what will you promise to the Lord during the Rite of Baptism, how does the parish plan to support you in fulfilling those promises, and what role should godparents play? We also focus heavily on your baby's Baptism as a time to renew your own relationship with the Lord. With insights from Scripture, the Rite of Baptism, and social sciences as well as times to discuss the concepts as a couple, we want you to leave this class with practical resources to strengthen your family and your own spiritual life.

first volunteered at my parish when I was a freshman in high school. The DRE was preparing for Vacation Bible School. She desperately needed someone to run the games station, and so she asked me. I was rather anxious about overseeing kids along with a handful of middle school boys not much younger than me whose parents volunteered them to "help" with games all week. I had to come up with activities on my own, communicate the plan to the ruffians assigned to me, and make sure the kids had fun without getting hurt. I was ill prepared and unsure of myself. And I loved it! It was one of earliest ways that God began to whisper that he was calling me to parish ministry. Perhaps God is whispering a similar calling to you to volunteer in our Faith Formation programs.

Being a volunteer in Faith Formation is a hugely rewarding experience. You get to be a mentor in faith by leading students to Jesus in engaging ways. We will not just lock you in a room with a bunch of kids and a textbook every Sunday for the rest of your life. We produce easy to follow lesson plans and activity plans while giving volunteers who feel comfortable the freedom to be creative. In most programs, volunteers meet regularly to pray together, share successes and failures, and prepare for the next sessions. The time commitment varies by program and role, but it can be as minimal as 45 minutes twice per month for eight months or as much as 90 minutes three to four times per month for eight months.

After I graduated college and began working in parish ministry full-time, my high school principal called me and asked if I would teach freshmen religion on a part-time basis. I was busy getting started in ministry and working towards my MA in Theology, and I was not a teacher, so I was tempted to decline the offer. I ultimately accepted it, and it was one of the best experiences of my life. By teaching faith, I gained a better grasp of doctrine. I developed wonderful relationships with my students, some of whom I have been able to teach once again in Baptism Prep classes. I learned a lot about myself and the gifts God has given me. Most importantly, teaching the faith gave me a fresh experience of God. If that sounds like something you are interested in, I encourage you to reach out to one of our Faith Formation Staff members to talk about what role you might be able to take on.



STATIONS of the CROSS







ecently I had the opportunity to attend the Bosco Conference at Franciscan University in Steubenville Ohio with Jason Gawaldo, Chris Patsch and about 500 people from around the country. On one of the afternoons, Chris and I visited the Portiuncula Chapel. Nestled in the woods on campus is a beautiful chapel surrounded by the stations of the Cross. As we walked the path praying at each station, I was overcome with emotions, and I struggled to lead the prayer on my turns on the journey. Just thinking of the pain Mary must have felt watching her son walk through the streets after being beaten, and yet she never left his side. Stop and think about that for a moment. When my kids were little and cut a knee, got sick, or even broke a bone, my stomach sank knowing they were in pain. Yet their pain quickly went away. Jesus' pain didn't just go away. Mary couldn't kiss away any tears, she couldn't wipe the wounds clean, she couldn't provide any comfort other than being there for Jesus. Her heart must have been in tatters. Her Son was the Son of God, he taught love and acceptance to everyone. Jesus' main goal was to teach us how to get to heaven. But it is our sins that cost him his life. What we do today is the reason he was beaten and killed on the cross 2,000 years ago. Jesus and Mary suffered all that pain because they love us that much.

Praying the Stations of the Cross shouldn't be put on a shelf and brought out during Lent, we should be praying the Stations of the Cross to remind us of what Jesus did for us. What he endured for us. How much Jesus loves each of us. Don't wait for Ash Wednesday to walk with Jesus. There are Stations hung up in both churches. Take some time to go into the church and walk the way that Jesus did on the day he died. As you journey, remember that Jesus did this because he loves you that much.




