

Dear Friends in Christ:

Having just celebrated the Nativity of the Lord with the birth of Jesus, the Christmas season continues today as we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. This feast is an important reminder

that family life is a full-time responsibility and has to have cooperation from each member of the family. For a family to grow in holiness requires from each member of the family love, respect, reverence, forgiveness and generosity, all rooted in a life of prayer.

In our Catholic tradition, the family home is called the "domestic church." The family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is made holy because of the presence of Jesus. The same can be true of our families. God can make our families channels of grace when we make time to pray together as a family, when we love, respect, offer reverence, and forgiveness and generosity. For the presence of Christ to increase in our homes, prayer has to be the fabric of our family life.

We are on the threshold of a new year of God's grace this week and it is a time for a fresh start. If we are looking for Christ to be an even greater part of the life of our family, then now is the time to dedicate time for our families to pray together more often, to ensure that we look for more ways to practice love and respect; offer reverence, and forgiveness and generosity.

If we enter the coming New Year of 2022 determined to improve the quality of our family life, we will have taken a valuable lesson from our recent celebration of the Nativity of the Lord in the birth of Jesus at Christmas. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph is for us both a model and inspiration, but it cannot be just a nice image in our mind – it must be for us a lived reality in our own homes. If we truly desire to follow in the footsteps of the Holy Family, then prayer needs to be the center of all our daily family gatherings and we must find greater ways to give love, offer respect and reverence and be more forgiving and generous.

May this season of Christmas be for you and the members of your family an experience of deepened faith and an occasion for a deeper relationship with Christ our Savior!


Prayer to the Holy Family

Every priest and religious brother or sister has an obligation to pray five times a day the psalms, readings, and prayers of the *Liturgy of the Hours* (also called the Divine Office). Traditionally, on the eve of Christmas day just before the Midnight Mass begins the office of Matins (from the Latin word *matutinas- of the morning*) and the first lines of the prayer are above "Christ is born to us, come ye let us adore Him! What a beautiful and true Christmas greeting for all those who have prepared for this day during the season of Advent! What a delightful refrain to

welcome in the joyous season of Christmas! Indeed, Christ is born and he invites each one of us to continue to adore Him every day for the rest of the days of our life.

Oplatki for Purchase

One of the customs of Christmas is Oplatki. This tradition originated in Poland during the early Christian times. It is also popular in eastern Europe, including Lithuania and Slovakia. The Christmas custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity of the Lord. The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically as the Christmas meal begins. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing.

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that we as Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive the Lord's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. Consider making this tradition part of your family Christmas meal.




