

The Church in her liturgy now enters into the period of the liturgical season of Ordinary Time until the season of Lent which begins on Ash Wednesday, this year on March

### January 22: Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), no. 373, designates January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance for abortion, called the "Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children." Full relevant section from the GIRM: "373. Masses for Various Needs and Occasions are used in certain situations either as occasion arises or at fixed times. Days or periods of prayer for the fruits of the earth, prayer for human rights and equality, prayer for world justice and peace, and penitential observances outside Lent are to be observed in the Dioceses of the United States of America at times to be designated by the Diocesan Bishop.

In all the Dioceses of the United States of America, January 22 (or January 23, when January 22 falls on a Sunday) shall be observed as a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. The liturgical celebrations for this day may be the "Mass For Giving Thanks to God for the Gift of Human Life" (no. 48/1 of the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions), celebrated with white vestments, or the Mass "For the Preservation of Peace and Justice" (no. 30 of the Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions), celebrated with violet vestments."

On Saturday, January 22, 2022, at the conclusion of the 4 PM Mass, Father Ed will lead a Eucharistic Holy Hour with Solemn Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament followed by benediction and reposition. Father Ed will lead the Litany for Life during the Holy Hour. Come and join us for this time of prayer and a greater respect for human life!

After realtor commission and splitting closing costs, proceeds from sale were \$77,417.90. Legacy Debt from former Saint Agnes Parish: \$733,797.61. Father Yuhas acquired *Church Alive!* Parish in Need Grant in 2020 for \$488,000.00 which was applied to parish legacy debt. Beginning September 2021 we are required to pay \$819.00 on the debt every month until paid off.

#### Second Collection THIS WEEKEND January 15/16, 2022

The second collection THIS WEEKEND January 15/16, 2022 will be taken for the Saint Anthony School Programs and the DePaul School for Hearing and Speech.

#### Saint Anthony School Programs

Saint Anthony School Programs offers inclusive education to students ages 5-21 with the primary diagnosis of autism, Down syndrome and other developmental delays. Students attend regular classes based on their individual abilities and supplement their learning with fully-certified special education teachers in their Resource Rooms. The inclusive nature of their program allows the students to develop academically, socially and spiritually in a caring and respectful environment.

Students between the ages of 18-21 attend the vocational program at Duquesne University. At the postsecondary level, students train vocationally at local job sites to learn the functional aspects of jobs as well as proper business attire and appropriate work related behaviors. In addition, they practice independent living skills such as cooking, shopping and cleaning at the Life Skills Training Apartment. It is the goal to provide the education and resources each student needs to live life as independently as possible after graduation.

Saint Anthony School Programs provides hope and encouragement to families in need of their services. As an inclusive program, it allows siblings to attend the same school and interact together as part of the same student body, while meeting the special learning needs of each child. It helps children develop friendships and a deeper love for God, while preparing them to become active and contributing members of the community.

#### **DePaul School for Hearing and Speech**

DePaul School for Hearing and Speech, founded by the Diocese of Pittsburgh and the Sisters of Charity of Seton Hill as DePaul Institute, is a State Approved not-for-profit school dedicated to auditory/oral education as well as spiritual and personal development of deaf and hard of hearing children from birth to age 14. Students are offered a full scholarship for academic programs. A comprehensive continuum of clinical and family support programs are also offered free of charge to parents and caregivers.

Auditory/ oral education teaches children to learn to use whatever hearing they have, in combination with lipreading and contextual clues (speech-reading) and the latest technologies such as cochlear implants and digital hearing aids, to understand and use spoken language. The goal is to give children the necessary academic language skills to fully participate in the speaking and hearing world. Virtually all of the students mainstream to their neighborhood schools during their elementary or middle school years with minimal supports.

DePaul School for Hearing and Speech is the only program of its kind in western Pennsylvania and among just a handful of state providers to offer a center-based educational program for children under the age of three. Visit the website: <u>www.speakmiracles.org</u> for more information.

Safe Environment Requirements for Renewing Volunteers


Several parish volunteers have asked me about the requirements for renewing volunteers. I am listing them here for you to clear up any confusion there may be. Three items need to be updated when they expire.

- 1) **FBI Waiver**. This needs to be read and signed every five years.
- 2) **Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance**. This needs to be redone every five years. The form requires that you list where you have lived since 1975 and household members since 1975.

3) Protecting God's Children Maltreatment and Vulnerable Adults Training. There is new training every three years which involves watching twelve videos and then answering a question for each situation. It takes about 90 minutes to complete. This is a new renewal requirement as of May 2021.
