

Seminarian Assistance Fund—Second Collection NEXT Weekend

As you are aware, Bishop Zubik has appointed seminarian John Kist to our parish for a "Pastoral Year Experience." John began his Pastoral Year with us June 14, 2021 and will continue through June 26, 2022. That means John will be with our parish the entire time (with the exception of a retreat and two weeks vacation). We certainly will be supporting John through our prayers on his journey to fulfill the call of Jesus the Good Shepherd to the priesthood. John like any seminarian and priest embraces self-sacrifice and devotion to God will being of humble service to others.

During the Pastoral Year, John will be engaged fully in pastoral ministry among us to learn the ropes of the priesthood. Some of John's responsibilities will include but are not limited to: pastoral visitation of the sick in hospitals, health care facilities, and individual homes of parishioners, teaching at RCIA & RCIC, and the LIFT Formation program, assistance at all weekday, weekend and holy day Masses, recruitment and training of altar servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, readers and ushers, reflection series on topics relative to the signs of the times. John will participate in all parish staff meetings, advisory council meetings, other parish meetings and assist generally wherever there is a pastoral need for service.

Given the fact that our parish is geographically complex, comprising 162 square miles John will be traveling all over our territory conducting pastoral ministry. Seminarians do receive a modest stipend from the diocese, but they do not receive a sustainable income, so our parish will hold a few special second collections during this time that John is with us to help defray costs while John provides pastoral ministry at our parish.

Synod on Synodality

Safe Environment Requirements for Renewing Volunteers


Several parish volunteers have asked me about the requirements for renewing volunteers. I am listing them here for you to clear up any confusion there may be. Three items need to be updated when they expire.

- 1) **FBI Waiver**. This needs to be read and signed every five years.
- 2) **Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Clearance**. This needs to be redone every five years. The form requires that you list where you have lived since 1975 and household members since 1975.

3) Protecting God's Children Maltreatment and Vulnerable Adults Training. There is new training every three years which involves watching twelve videos and then answering a question for each situation. It takes about 90 minutes to complete. This is a new renewal requirement as of May 2021.

<u>Masks Required</u> Effective the weekend of August 7/8, 2021 due to increase of Covid-19 cases, Bishop Zubik is requiring in the Diocese of Pittsburgh for all Greeters, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Ushers, Priests and Deacons to wear masks at Mass when in direct contact with people. This mask requirement includes fully vaccinated individuals. This mask requirement remains in effect until further notice. As the Covid-19 virus continues to change, you will be kept up to date on changing restrictions. The CDC (Center of Disease Control) earnestly recommends all individuals to wear masks in public settings in areas of high or substantial transmission, such as Washington County is currently experiencing.
