



Pastor's Corner



Dear Friends in Christ:

As we listen to the Liturgy of the Word at Mass this weekend, in our First Reading we hear at the beginning of his ministry, Jeremiah the prophet attempted to back out of doing what God asked of him. Jeremiah protested that he was too young. But the Lord remained with Jeremiah and protected him. Despite the resistance and danger Jeremiah faced which included being mobbed, beaten severely and left in a cistern to die – he was in God's care.

With God's help, Jeremiah spoke an unpopular message and took people to task for their neglect of caring for the poor. Unfortunately, the people to whom the God sent Jeremiah chose not to listen to the warnings he offered for the good of the people.

Some 600 years after Jeremiah, God's Word was made flesh in the coming of Christ. At first when Jesus spoke, the people of his town listened, but soon, they expelled Jesus not only from their hearts and from their town, but they turned on him and we know eventually killed him. In many ways the threats and dangers that were part of the life of Jeremiah and our Lord are also felt by any who choose to follow them.

If we wish to be followers of the Lord, we must first and foremost be dedicated to lives of prayer and with humility ask ourselves some important questions: Am I self-centered? Am I unconcerned about the needs of those around me especially those in most need of my support? Do I gossip or hurt others by what I say or do or don't do?

As those who follow in the footsteps of our Lord, we must desire holiness for our lives and "strive for the greatest spiritual gifts" as Saint Paul tells us in our Second Reading at Mass today. Desiring and achieving holiness can be challenging because it calls us to look within our hearts and requires us to change and to change often. The call is to die to our old ways so that Christ may live in us.

Finally, as followers of the Lord, Saint Paul reminds us that we are called to be "patient and kind, not jealous and pompous, not seeking our own self-interests, not brooding over injury," but rejoicing. At home and among our family members, it may be the call to love more tenderly, it may be by showing patience when irritated by the shortcomings among our friends, neighbors and co-workers, it may be a readiness to excuse and overlook sharp words directed toward us because we are disciples of Jesus and are striving to live our faith. We, like Jeremiah, like Saint Paul, like Jesus and others, will encounter many reactions from those to whom we are sent, and not all of them positive.

May we draw from the Sacred Scriptures strength to continue to discover how we might best serve our Lord and make a difference by bringing Christ to the world in which we live by our words and most especially through our actions and Christian example of living our faith.
