### *Seventh Sunday of Easter*

The first reading establishes the leadership of Peter whom Jesus has already named as such. He is to become the first leader of the Church that Jesus has been building. He is the first pope and the other first Apostles will be the first bishops. The passage from the Gospel of John is an actual prayer by Jesus to His Father. Jesus must have prayed aloud for John to have been able to cite this prayer in three parts.

The Acts reveal Peter addressing the group of 120 disciples locked in the upper room. This number is actual for the *Mishna*, a collection of rabbinical opinions, states that a community's elected officials must number 1/10 of the numerical strength of the group. To have a return to the original number of twelve, caused by Judas' defection, as the leader, Peter sets prerequisites for this office. The electee must have had prior service as a disciple, have been a witness to Jesus' baptism by John, and have been with this disciple group from that baptism to Jesus' resurrection and His ascension.

Two men are named, one is Joseph and the other is Matthias. Nothing is known about these candidates except for what is stated in this passage. With Joseph having the greater information given about him, one may have anticipated that he will be the new 12<sup>th</sup> Apostle. Matthias is chosen. The group prays for God's guidance, and use the traditional way of voting by drawing lots that allow God to do the choosing. This system is taken from Leviticus 16: 7-10; Numbers 26:55-56; 1 Samuel 14: 41-42. Peter has displayed his leadership during this process.

The accompanying Gospel is from John that repeats a prayer from Jesus to His Father. In the first part Jesus prays for Himself and in the final part, He prays for all who believe. The middle part is today's Gospel. It is a prayer for His disciples. This incident occurs in the upper room during the Last Supper.

Immediately after having prayed, Jesus leaves for Gethemane where He experiences His agony in prayer to the Father. He has been accompanied by 11 of His Apostles. Judas has left during the meal to begin his betrayal of Jesus.

Jesus prays for the unity among the disciples as He has with the Father. This divine unity is the model for them to emulate, for He has revealed this divine unity in His actions and in His teaching. Peter and the other Apostles are to maintain the same unity with Him, the Father, and themselves. This unity is one of the keys to continue and to maintain what Jesus has already established during His earthly mission.

The final part of this section of Jesus' prayer is an appeal to the Father to consecrate the Apostles in the "truth." Consecrate means to set aside, make holy for a particular divine mission. The Apostles and those who are given authority from these Apostles are also to be consecrated. This consecration is to be more personal and intimate for they are being consecrated in "truth." This Apostolic mission for the Church is the same as that which had been given to Jesus to teach the way, the light, and the path to salvation.

**COVID LIMITATIONS ARE TO BE REDUCED** starting Memorial Day. Effective May 31<sup>st</sup>, *social distancing will no longer be required* at Mass or other gatherings inside or outside of parish buildings and limitations on the number of people gathered will also be lifted. Masks will still be required, and most of the other precautionary measures now in place will remain in effect. However, routine pastoral visits will resume. Watch for more details.

#### **DIOCESAN LENTEN APPEAL (DLA) 2020**

Total pledges have now climbed to **\$54,582.31**, with **174** households contributing. *Thank you so much for your EXCEPTIONAL generosity. May God reward you!* And remember that assessment-free gifts to the DLA can be made until the end of 2021.

#### **10-YEAR LOAN REPAYMENT REPORT**

As of May 5<sup>th</sup>, we have paid back \$141,664.06 (including \$14,041.48 in interest) on our \$300,000 loan plus \$36,335.54 interest. Due to an increase in the interest rate from 2.25% to 2.5% last July, the loan will be paid off with regular payments in November, 2026, one month later than previously forecasted. This is still 20 months ahead of the original schedule due to extra payments made early, and is expected to save us \$9,754.93 in interest.

Everyone is encouraged to stop in each day if possible at a convenient time, and to sign our log-in time sheet so that we can gauge participation in this. Please help us toward perpetual adoration. These are unprecedented times invite our full turning to the Lord. Thank you for your response!

#### **Parish Festival 2021 Cancelled**

We have been deliberating this decision for many weeks now. However, due to the continued Covid related restrictions, the uncertainty in the lifting of such restrictions in a time frame in which we can plan, and the expected hesitancy of our volunteers to participate, we see no other choice at this point but to cancel.

Please know that a plan is already being formed to replace the income loss that this will create. As you know we ran 3 tickets fundraisers this past year to replace the loss of last year's festival. The first 2 profited over \$29,000 and the third is set to profit about \$13,000 more. This has done well to keep us financially stable this past year during the pandemic. The plan for this next fiscal year will be a similar ticket fundraiser, although the ticket will look slightly different. We are looking at making next year's prizes a little more attractive. While this will decrease our profit a bit, the hope is to keep the interest for the fundraiser going. Plans for this new round of tickets should be finalized soon.
