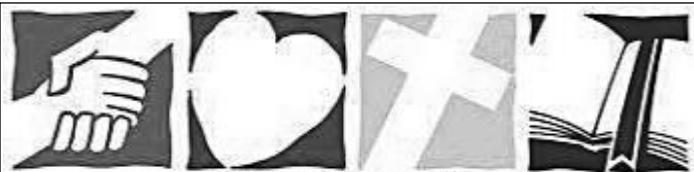

### ***The Most Holy Trinity***

**Introduction** The doctrine of the Holy Trinity describes the unique ways that mankind experiences God's presence in their lives. According to most theologians, this doctrine seems to suggest three gods who are yet one God. The mystery of creator and creation is accomplished through analogy, poetry, and symbolic language. The result through these uses of language is a description of an experience of God with His creation. The Trinity can be explained in the similar use of language. First, God becomes known through analogy of His creation and mankind's own creative acts, for mankind too reshapes something into a different form its original appearance. Second, mankind knows God in his sense experience as expressed in 1 John 4 :16 – "God is love, and he who abides in love abides in and God abides in him." Mankind feels the spirit and is inspired or reacts to God's power both spiritual and physical. Finally, mankind feels the spirit and is inspired or reacts to God's spiritual and physical power

The Old Testament selection is from Deuteronomy. God has ordered Moses to gather the people to proclaim in a revelation similar to that done at Mount Sinai. This is the center of this passage.

Moses is speaking to a new generation of survivors of the sinful acts of the Israelite men who have had sexual relations with the Moabite women and have bowed and sacrificed to their Baal gods. Phenias, a grandson of Aaron, stops a punishing plague when he thrusts his spear through an Israelite man and his Moabite concubine, Forty-four thousand of Israelites have died from the plague. The priesthood line is now passed from the Levites to the line of Phenias as a result of this punishment.

All of Moses' words are given to prepare them to enter the promised land with a conclusion to his speech with the admonition to obey the Law for such secures a lasting life of hope and happiness and due success. Sin brings misfortune and even death.

The accompanying Gospel from Matthew includes what the Protestant Bible call "the Great Commission." This commission has been given to Jesus as a means to create a Church for the Father that shall include all peoples not just the Jews. As the emissary from the Father Jesus can authorize disciples to continue His work when He returns to the Father. This granting to continue this work includes future disciples to initiate others as well. These newcomers will be initiated through baptism in the name of the Trinity, for the name is equal to the person. Other forms of initiation shall come later.

These two passages give details of the future developing for mankind's salvation. The promised land will foster the leaders to help foster the continuance of salvation history which prophesies the coming of a Messiah to finalize the will of God regarding His creation.

Matthew 27:15 reports that Judas has hanged himself. The place is not identified much like the place where the Transfiguration had occurred.. These passages give readings of the glory for man as he lives and obeys to attain all that God the Father has promised through His Son.

#### **REBUILDING AS COVID WANES**

It's time to start trying to fully re-group as a parish faith community. This rightly takes place around the Mass. In order to ease the burden on those who carried the load of many extra, frequent assignments during the pandemic, we need to have our sidelined liturgical ministers return to service. Call the parish office to volunteer or inquire. ***Finally, it's time to get back to Mass even before the obligation to do so in re-instated!*** Let's work and pray that by September we can be fully functioning as a parish faith community. Thank you.
