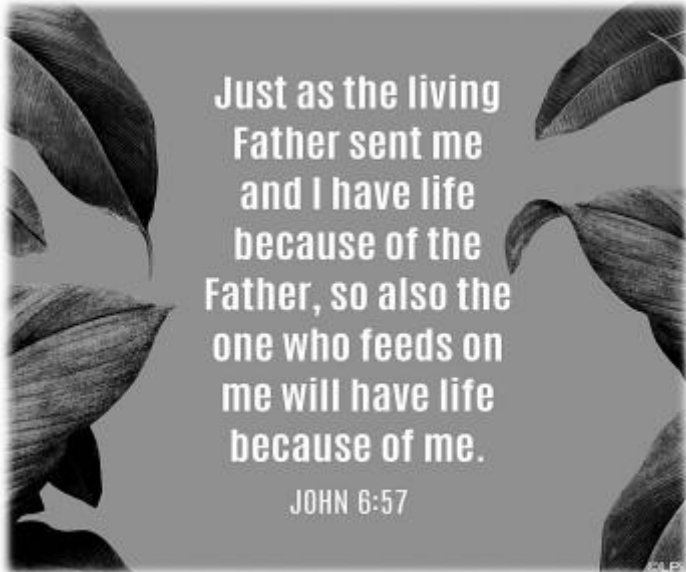

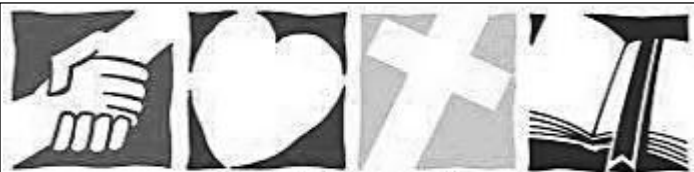

### ***The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ***

Both readings for today deal with covenants. Moses is the emissary of God, whom God has chosen to be the one to whom He will deliver the Ten Commandments in a covenant between Him and the Israelites. The second covenant in the Gospel is the one that Jesus makes at the Last Supper. Both covenants are plans by God to give man the opportunity to regain his inheritance of salvation.

The setting in the Moses story is Mount Sinai and Moses has been on this mount with God. He has returned to the people and reports to them what he and God have discussed. This presentation to the people the 10 Commandments and the ordinances that state God's expected behavior from them as His chosen people. They agree to the terms of rewards for keeping the Law and punishment for breaking them. They now prepare the solemn ritual that will binds God and the people to each other. The covenant words are recorded, an altar and pillars are set, and sacrifices will be offered.

Young men are sent to offer animal sacrifices to God as a peace offering. Each family has a priest for such liturgical services. Moses then splashes the blood gathered from the animal sacrifices on the altar. He reads aloud the terms that are the blessings and curses of the covenant. The people accept and declare an oath that binds them officially to God. Moses then splashes the remaining blood from the animal sacrifice on the people. This final sprinkling of blood shows the people and God have shared the sacrifice already given to God when the animals were offered to Him. As a result of this liturgical action. God and His people are united for ever.

The Gospel is a repeat from the Passion read on Palm Sunday.

The events that are reported deal with the plans for the Passover meal that Jesus and His disciples will share. The disciples show no amazement with the directs that Jesus orders. They go willingly and unquestioningly. Some biblical scholars believe that everything has been prearranged for divine intervention may have been involved as Jesus orders His plan as having been established.

The scene changes to the Last Supper meal where Jesus will originate the Sacrament of the Eucharist. A blessing is made and includes two aspects. One is a God direction action and then the actual blessing which is a world directed action. The Eucharist is a word from the Greek, meaning a "good gift" (eu means good and chris means gift). He continues the formation of the Eucharist Sacrament and speaks of a covenant. This is the only time He has used this word.

The apostles are leaving the room without completing the Passover ritual. Exodus 12:22 prescribes that no Israelite is to leave his house until the morning

When Jesus takes the sour wine, He says, "It is finished" (John 19:30). His words end the Passover meal, as they form the missing fourth cup not consumed at the actual meal.

Both passages have reports of covenants. Jesus' action at the Last Supper completes His earthly mission. He has founded a Church and has created the means for it to grow and spread throughout the world. This Sunday gives passages of covenants that begin and finalize God's plan for mankind's salvation.

### TWO SPECIAL SOLEMNITIES

Following the close of the Easter Season with Pentecost Sunday, the Church celebrates two Sunday Solemnities: THE MOST HOLY TRINITY last week and THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST this Sunday. How fitting it is to praise the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit into whose life and love Jesus has given us access, and whose divine glory we are to share in forever in oneness with Jesus by way of the Sacrament of His Most Holy Body and Blood. *Weather-permitting, this Sunday we will publically show our gratitude with an outdoor Eucharistic Procession before the closing Benediction at the 11 am Mass.*

### REBUILDING AS COVID RECEDES

It's time to start trying to fully re-group as a parish faith community. This rightly takes place first around the Mass. In order to ease the burden on those who carried the load of many extra, frequent assignments during the pandemic, we need to have our sidelined liturgical ministers return to service. Please get back on the regular schedule. If you need an update on your procedures this will be provided. New servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are also much needed. Update and training sessions are scheduled for the first Mondays of June, July and August. Ushers and greeters, choir members and cantors, are needed as well. Talk with Tom Ulishney about ushering or greeting. See Steven Makar about joining the choir. Volunteers for everything from Faith Formation to the Parish Festival to serving on Pastoral Council, Finance Council, Buildings & Grounds Committee or Cemetery Committee are needed. Let Dr. Dreliszak or Fr. John know you would like to help. Child Protection Clearances are required. Group sessions to get the Virtus and Mandated Reporter training will be provided. Call the parish office to volunteer or inquire. ***Finally, it's time to get back to Mass even before the obligation to do so in re-instated!*** Let's work and pray that by September we can be fully functioning as a parish faith community. Thank you.



**EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION** is the right time to place our burdens and shortcomings before the Lord. Consider what Jesus said about this to a certain Benedictine monk via locution: *“So many souls... attempt to change themselves by...purely human means, and forget that I am all-powerful, all-merciful, and ready at every moment to heal and sanctify those who entrust themselves, with their weaknesses and sins, to My most loving Heart. I do not ask for perfection from those whom I have chosen to be My friends: I ask only that they give Me their imperfection and the burden of their sins, and allow Me to do for them what, of themselves, they are incapable of doing.”* (In Sinu Jesu p. 163) For May 25-26, the following hours had only one adorers: **12 Noon, 3 PM, 9 PM, 11 PM, 1 am, 2 am, 3 am, 4 am, 5 am, and 6 am.** At least two adorers should be present for each hour. Thank you!
