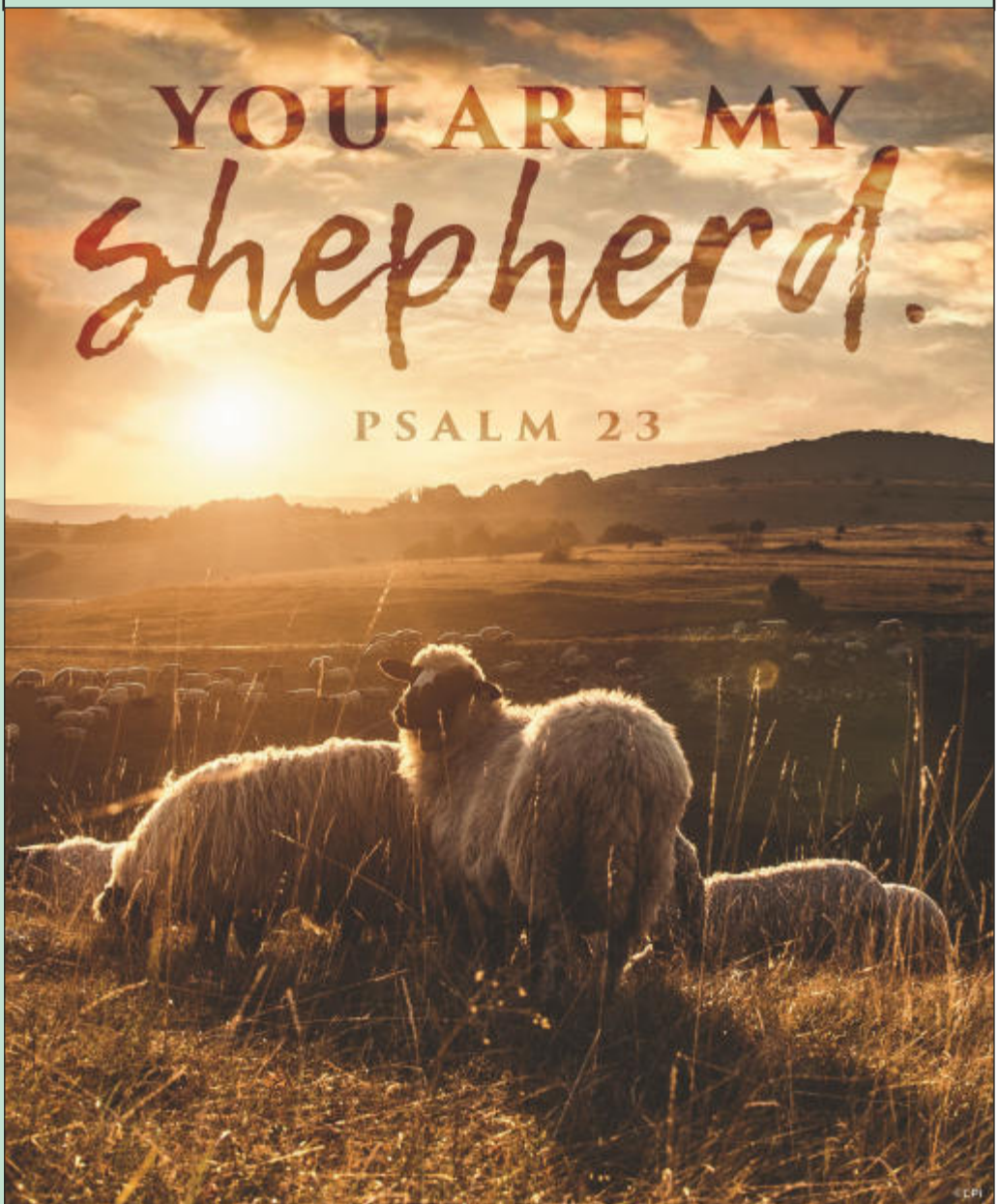

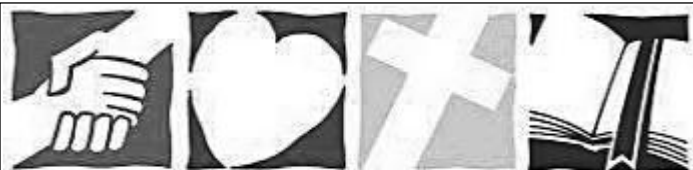

### **Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

This Sunday like last Sunday sets a contrast of doom against one of success. Jeremiah is presented as an oracle, one who is sent by God to give a divine revelation. He is inspired to give a revelation about the last king, Jehoiachin. He has surrendered to the Babylonians and is deported. Mark's Gospel centers on the return of the Apostles to Jesus to report on "all they have done and taught." The kings have failed their leadership while the Apostles are elated with success.

The opening verse from the book of Jeremiah states the Lord's charge against "bad shepherds"—in this instance the failed leadership of the kings. He lists their negative behavior and concludes that He will assume control to right their failures. The passage continues to use the metaphor of positive shepherding. God reveals that the time has come for all to hear His proclamation of the one who shall rule Israel (meaning both Judah in the south and Israel in the north) like David. Both nations shall share in the message of a messiah to be God's representations.

The concluding verse of this passage continues with a play on Zedekiah's name which means "my justice is in God," and here the messiah is given the name "God our justice." Justice in both statements refers to the saving powers and actions of God. Jeremiah predicts the restoration of the Davidic dynasty, not political but consistent with the moral and religious obligations of the covenant.

Among the opening words of Mark's gospel is "apostle." This is the first use of this word to be used by Mark to refer to the original "12." It means "one who is sent." The "12" are generally labeled "disciple" to meaning "one who is a student" Mark's intentions may be means to show a difference between John the Baptist's followers and Jesus' followers.

Jesus knows the intensity of public ministry to suggest that the Apostles and He find a place to rest from their experience of ministry as well as avoiding any encounter with a crowd that is beginning to gather; however this crowd gets to the boats before Jesus and the Apostles to prevent them from reaching a restful and secluded place to rest. The size of this crowd is not anticipated.

These people have been traveling on foot and have no food. These facts set the instance for Jesus, with the aid of the Father, to feed them. He prays to create enough loaves and fish to satisfy their hunger and have enough left over to suggest the bounty of the Father's blessings for His people. This food miracle becomes the center for next Sunday's Gospel passage.

When Jesus sees the size of the crowd, he is moved with compassion and the need for spiritual guidance. Like a "Good Shepherd," He changes His plans for rest to meet the needs of the crowd and begins to preach. He always meets the needs of the people before His own.

The basic connection for these readings is meeting and delivering the needs of the people for spiritual growth. The leadership in the Jeremiah passage has ignored this need as stated in the covenant. Jesus, filled with compassion, discerns these needs and administers to the needs of the people first before tending to His own. This behavior is consistent with the teaching of the Father in the Old Testament and repeated in the New Testament by Jesus.

### REBUILDING AS COVID RECEDES

### FIVE RECOMMENDED BOOKS

- 1) *Consecration to St. Joseph* by Donald H. Calloway (Marian Press). This is must reading during this Holy Year in honor of St. Joseph in order to keep up with the Church's increasing understanding of and devotion to this greatest of saints.
- 2) *No Turning Back: A Witness to Mercy* by Donald H. Calloway (Marian Press). Fr. Calloway's conversion story is more dramatic than St. Paul's.
- 3) *A Biblical Walk Through The Mass* by Edward Sri (Ascension Press). The next to last chapter (24) on Holy Communion is the highpoint of the book.
- 4) *Seven Secrets of the Eucharist* by Vinney Flynn (MercySong IGNATIUS Press). Secret 5 explains how we are to make a reciprocal response to Jesus gift of Himself.
- 5) *The Great Religious Imperative of Our Time* by an unnamed author is a comprehensive explanation of Eucharistic Self-Offering. (Free copies are available from Fr. John.)

### DIOCESAN LENTEN APPEAL (DLA) 2020

Total pledges now total **\$55,482** with **176** households contributing. The amount paid is **\$50,363**. *Thank you so much for your amazing generosity. May God reward you!* And remember that assessment-free gifts to the DLA can be made until the end of 2021. Hereafter, DLA reports will be given monthly starting in July.

### 10-YEAR LOAN REPAYMENT REPORT

As of July 6<sup>th</sup>, we have paid back \$147,252.30 (including \$14,780.23 in interest) on our \$300,000 loan plus \$36,335.54 interest. Due to an increase in the interest rate from 2.25% to 2.5% last July, the loan will be paid off with regular payments in November, 2026, one month later than previously forecasted. This is still 20 months ahead of the original schedule due to extra payments made early, and is expected to save us \$9,754.93 in interest.
