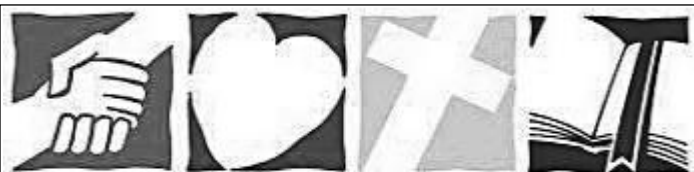

### Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The passages for today place the prophets Jesus and Elisha into situations that require them to go against the norms of every life. Elisha turns his gift of to the people and Jesus preforms a miracle to fed 5000 men. Both passages illustrate the compassion of Good Shepherds to aid people in need.

The time of Eliha's story is 850 B.C. in the era of his tenure as a prophet. His name means "God has saves." He is called by the prophet Elijah to succeed him as a prophet. Elijah gives his mantle, symbolic as a sign of his prophetic stature, and a double portion of his prophetic spirit. A double portion is usually the inheritance to the first-born son. This gift indicates that although not related by blood Elisha is his spiritual son. Elijah is nearing his death and is assumed into heaven.

This Old Testament story begins with an individual from Baal-shalechah who has brought barley loaves made from the milled grain of the first harvest. This gift of twenty loaves to Elisha indicates the esteem that the prophet holds, for the first harvests are sacred and given to Yahweh as a gift of gratitude for the harvest.

When Elisha insists that the bread be given to the people, the servant is unbelieving at this command. Elisha's calm and self-assured attitude forces the servant to obey. The words of "having their fool of food with some left over" is a common theme of gratitude as well for those who show faith and practice that faith in Him

The account of Jesus' feeding 5000 is a suited companion to be paired with the passage of Elisha's story of his of the first fruits to the people , for Yahweh will see that "all shall eat in due season."

Jesus' teaching and miracles have garnered great crowds, In this reading John narrates one of the more easily remembered stories of the many signs that Jesus has performed. John's gospel reports only seven signs (John uses signs instead of miracles). The growth of the crowds is created by these signs out of curiosity and not just faith. Any faith based on signs only without some belief in the performance would be transitory, short lived.

Food is important to John for it is in the Passover meal that Jesus creates the food for the spirit, the Eucharist. At this point in Jesus' public ministry, He is a year away from His passion and death. There are three Passovers mentioned in scripture and John's gospel mentions all three which help to develop the background and meaning of the Eucharist.

In these passages relating to food it is God through His Son Who supplies the food for man's substance. However man's needs are also for a spiritual life as well. He sends Jesus to create the means for man to regain his inheritance through the Eucharist. Man must live a spiritual sustained by the Eucharist created by His Son to merit that inheritance for eternal life.

Scripture often illustrates God caring for His people. These passages are some points of reference where He does "provide."
