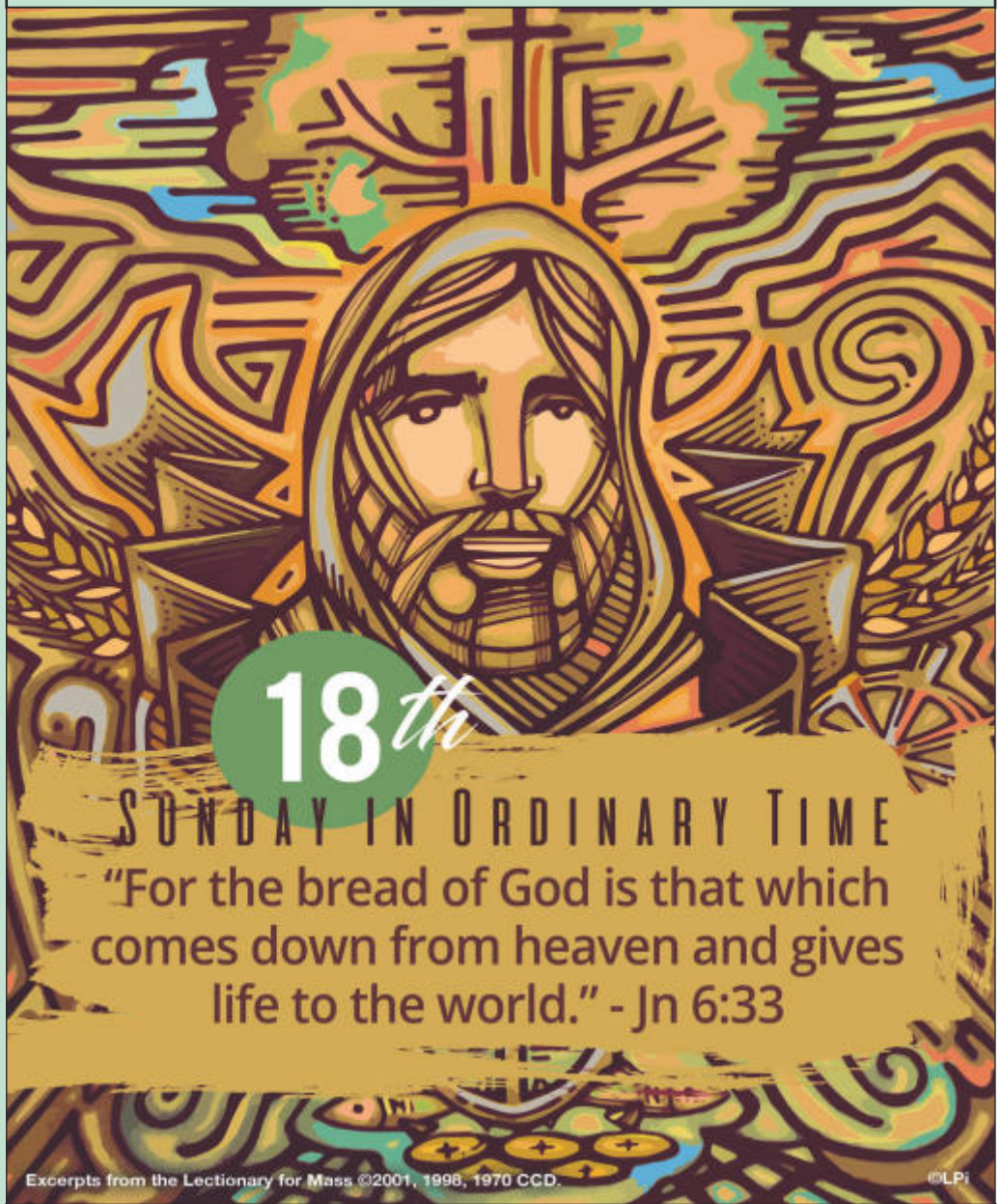

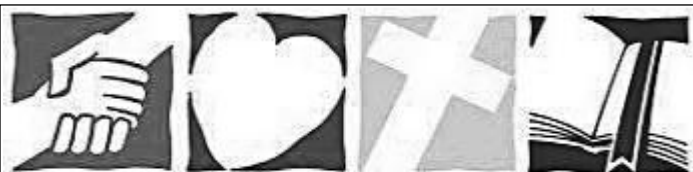

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Both passages for today center on bread and the need of bread for human or spiritual life. The Exodus account deals with the bread that sustains human physical life. The gospel of John discusses Jesus' discourse on the "Bread of Life" which man needs to enter a spiritual life. Two and a half months after having left Egypt, Yahweh creates a test to the Israelites to see if they will obey His command. The people complain to Moses about the lack of food, but their real complain is directed to Yahweh. As slaves in Egypt, the Pharaoh had provided food in great abundance and now with the Lord they are starving. The Lord tells Moses He will supply the people with food twice a day to know that "I the Lord, am your God."

Both quail and manna appear daily for forty years. The quail are migratory birds that leave their summer homes in northern Europe to fly south to winter in Africa. The miracle or the Lord's providence comes in spite of the normal seasonal patterns of the quail. Manna is the honey-like droppings from the tamarisk tree, which come from scale lice. Great quantities of this liquid appear in the spring from the twigs for the lice to collect nitrogen for their grubs. This liquid has no protein just glucose and fructose. When it drops from the tree, it becomes firm from the cool night air; however it has a low melting point and must be collected before the sun melts it. Since it appears daily, double portion must be taken the day before the Sabbath. Again this appears daily for forty years not just in the spring. The Lord proves that He is their God and has provided food that sustains their physical needs.

The main part of the gospel brings the crowd's attention to Jesus' mission which is spiritual, not physical. The crowds have become awed with the miracles. They have not understood the true meaning of these signs (John's word for miracles).

Jesus accuses them of no interest in Him only that they have eaten the loaves and are seeking another handout. He tells them that they must work for food that sustains and develops a supernatural life which lasts forever. Through God's infinite, God has given man His Son as nourishment for his soul. This special gift of Jesus is stated as "God has set his seal." When a seal is imprinted on wax, the wax receives the complete form of that seal. Hence, Jesus has received the entire form of God His Father.

When the people ask how can they do this work of God, He explains that their task is to believe in Him, in what He teaches not because of miracles but because of Who has sent Him. They continue to misunderstand Him. They ask if He can compare to Moses. His answer uses a double "amen" to remind to remark that God npt Moses had provided the manna. He adds that God's bread is not food but life to the world.. This shift from "bread from heaven" to "the bread of God." They still do not understand. They respond with words like the woman at the well in John 4:15. They do not understand that this bread is Jesus Himself. They see that Jesus can give them this bread .now, as bodily food. He stresses that He is the food, "I am the bread of life". He is the gift from God that supplies everlasting life.

In this final verse, Jesus declares that they must have faith in Him to approach God. He, Jesus, meets all of man's needs .to achieve salvation, that brings eternal life with God and Him.
