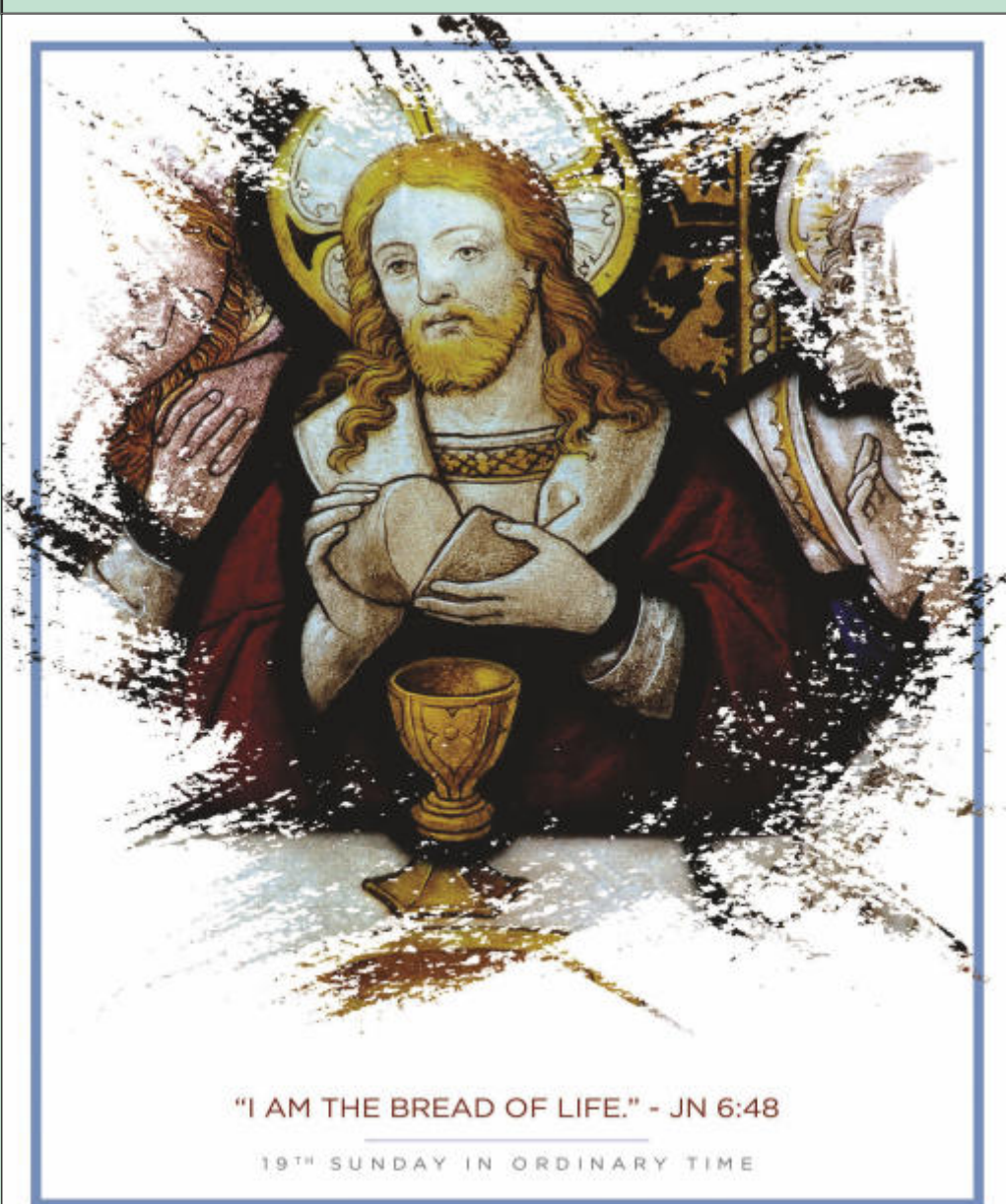

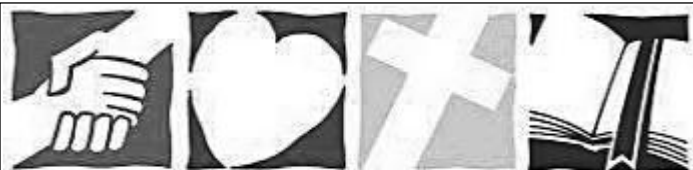

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Similar to last Sunday the passages again deal with God's provident care for His people. In the first passage, the Lord sends an angel with food to Elijah who is fleeing from the death threat of Jezebel. John's Gospel continues with Jesus' Bread of Life discourse.

Several events have directed the narrative for today's passage. Ahab is the King of Israel. He has married Jezebel who has followed the worship of the Canaanite baal (pagan god) in Israel. She has supported 450 prophets of the baal. Her hostility to Yahweh forces her attempt to kill all the prophets of Yahweh. When Elijah generates a movement that results in the death of these baal prophets, Jezebel decrees death for him. This death threat forces him to flee to Horeb to complain to Yahweh.

Jezebel has immediately been able to thwart Elijah's victories and stops his arduous attempt to bring Yahweh's return to Israel. He despairs and begs Yahweh for his death. God instead comforts and strengthens His prophet. An angel brings food and water. Once before an angel sent by Yahweh miraculously brings him food and ravens feed him (in 1 Kings 17:6). In this instance Yahweh twice sends His angel with food to revive His prophet to complete his journey to Horeb. Forty in Hebrew numerology is associated with trial, testing, a time of change.

The Gospel passage from John continues with Jesus' discourse on the bread of life.

John begins with the word "Jews". He uses the word as a derisive term for the leadership of Judah, not meant to refer to the people of this southern kingdom.

The Jews murmured about Jesus' declaration that He has come down from heaven. They know His genealogy is of human origin, not divine. They see Him as one of them. They judge Him with conceived prejudice rather than from the heart. Jesus restates what He has said about Himself. As a part of His rebuke, He says, "By murmuring you are behaving like your ancestors in the desert when God provided them with manna." He adds that they have seen enough signs to know that He has the power that only God has; yet they are not satisfied.

Jesus makes another attempt to them about Himself. They need God's gift of grace to have faith and understanding His teaching and of His identity. He says, "If you believe that I have been sent by God no further signs are necessary because you possess God's grace. If you do not believe I have been sent by God, no matter what signs I do perform, you won't do as I tell you because you lack grace."

He promises resurrection; however, there exists the necessity to believe so deeply in that faith "you must act on that belief and do whatever I tell you." His next step in this passage is to expand on who He is. He alone has seen God,, His Father, for He, Jesus, has come down from heaven. Man can know the Father through His Son the One that the Father has sent to reveal Him to man.

The final verses repeat Jesus' claim, "I am the Bread of Life" for a second time. He has used a double "amen" as an oath which is stated in a life and death situation. He identifies Himself for the third time "as the Bread of Life." In Hebrew numerology three represents "completion". He makes no attempt to soften or alter His teaching. All is literal to assert and strengthen His message.

He has reached the Eucharistic theme and switches to a future tense to conclude "this bread that I will give is my flesh

Heartfelt thanks to those sidelined lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, and altar servers who responded to my appeal to get back on the schedule. Profound thanks also to the individuals who offered to be trained for these ministries. So far, at least two extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion have returned for service and two new ones are scheduled for training; one lector has now returned to active ministry status and two new ones will soon be trained; five sidelined altar servers came forward to help with that ministry and one new one has undergone the initial training. May God reward you, and may your generous example inspire others to step up.

PASTORAL VISITS have resumed. If a family member of yours living at home or in a care facility has not previously been on Fr. John's monthly visitation list, and is in need of pastoral visits, please call the parish office.

DIOCESAN LENTEN APPEAL (DLA) 2021

Total pledges now total **\$55,507**, with **176** households contributing; \$51,309 has already been paid! *Thank you so much for your amazing generosity. May God reward you!* And remember that assessment-free gifts to the DLA can be made until the end of 2021. DLA reports will be given each month.

10-YEAR LOAN REPAYMENT REPORT

As of August 3, we have paid back \$150,046.42 (including \$15,180.23 in interest) on our \$300,000 loan plus \$36,335.54 interest. Due to an increase in the interest rate from 2.25% to 2.5% last July, the loan will be paid off with regular payments in November, 2026, one month later than previously forecasted. This is still 20 months ahead of the original schedule due to extra payments made early, and is expected to save us \$9,754.93 in interest.
