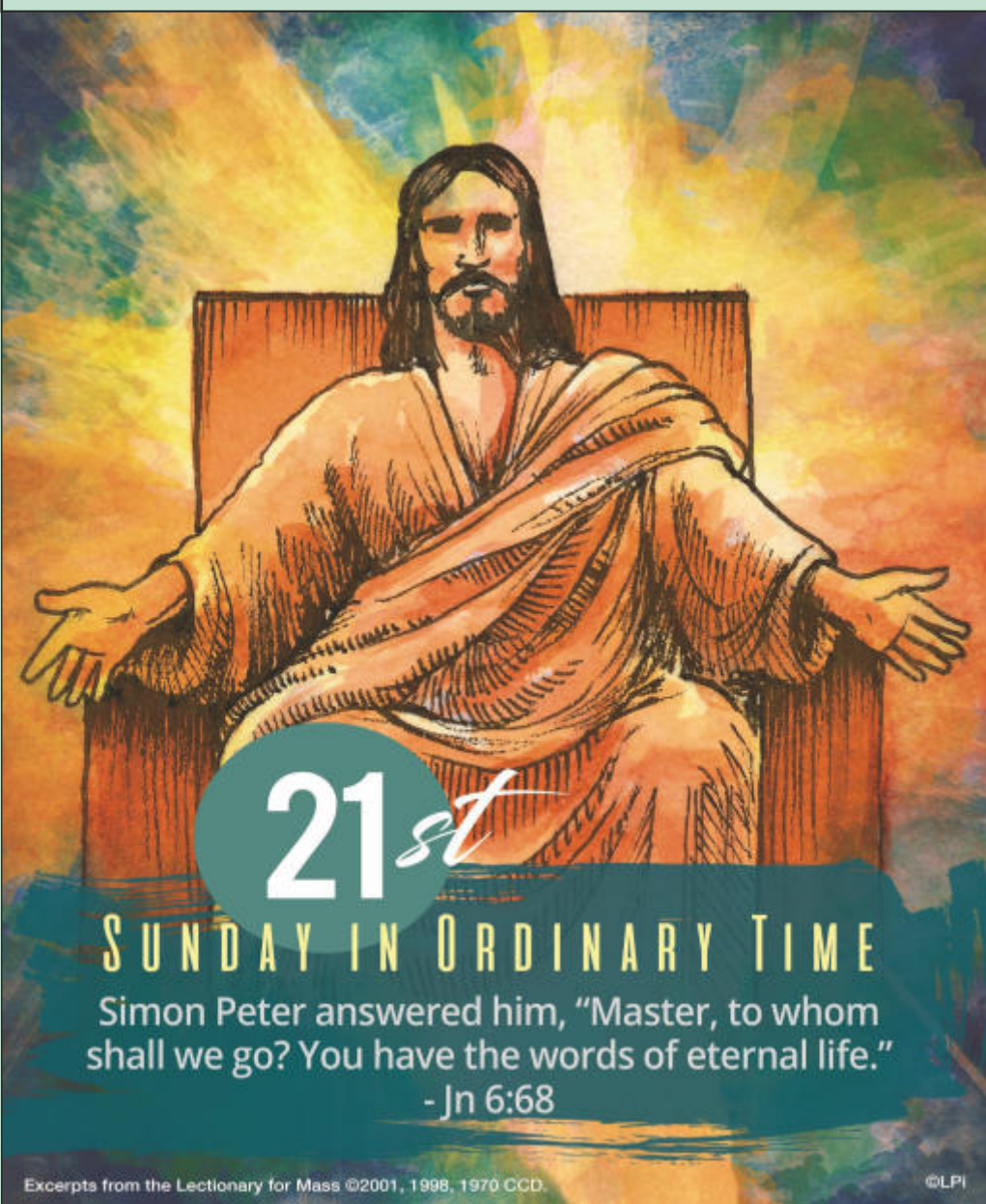

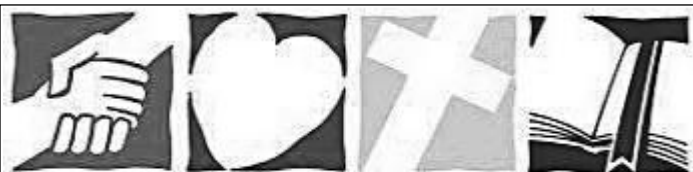

### **Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time**

The passages for today raise the necessity for man to make a decision whether to follow the Lord, be it Yahweh or Jesus, for the instance of truth has come.

Joshua (in Greek - Jesus; in Hebrew - Yeshua) is the one chosen by Moses to replace him as the leader of Israel in full authority with the exception of priestly power which is given to Eleazar. Moses also changes his name from Hoshea to Joshua which means "Yahweh is salvation," and he leads the Israelites to victory over the Amalekites, who occupy the land promised to them by Yahweh while Moses prays.

Joshua has gathered the tribes at Shechem and the shrine here may have contained the Ark of the Covenant, by the words "when they stood in ranks before God." He orders the people to choose between Yahweh or other gods to serve. The Amorites occupy the land they are about to enter as the "promised land." Joshua asserts his choice of loyalty to Yahweh. The people then recall the Lord's many miracles He has given them on the trek from slavery in Egypt. Their affirmation expresses the formation of a confederation whose unity is religiously based. They worship Yahweh and Yahweh only. They have become a covenant people, hence the possibility of the Ark of the Covenant being in their presence as a reminder of Yahweh, loyalty to them, His chosen ones.

John's Gospel completes his presentation on Jesus' Bread of Life discourse, that not only the Catholics but also the Episcopal and Lutheran Churches to consider these 45 verses important enough to devote these past four weeks once every three years. Like the first reading it is necessary to the experience a moment of truth as to what they, not just the apostles and disciples but also the crowd, to make a decision to follow the teaching of Jesus' of who He is and what He represents.

The opening verse relates the signs of Jesus' feeding these large crowds who have been following Him. The murmuring from the disciples expresses their doubt about Jesus' claims of His identity of being the Messiah, for they know His family and that He looks like a human. How then can He give eternal life, that is the bread of life, that is the work of God? If He is the bread of life and man must eat His flesh, drink His blood. That is cannibalism and is forbidden by the Law. All of this difficult to comprehend. Jesus refuses to make any attempt to repeat, explain, or elaborate on this teaching. He defends Himself with "This is the work of God that you believe in Him whom He has sent. If you don't believe in him, then you don't believe in what he is saying." They can not see a spiritual life in His words.

Their lack to understand cause many to leave and to turn their back on Jesus and the eternal life that He is teaching. He faces His trusted friends to ask if they too want to leave. Peter answers that they have no other choice. They have acknowledged that He speaks the words of God. They have not fully discerned His message but have faith in for He has come from God. The apostles are coming closer to knowing Jesus in all His fullness as the Messiah.

The themes from both readings of the need to develop and accept faith in a spiritual life based on Jesus' teaching or the acceptance of Yahweh as the one true and worthy God to worship that leads to the inheritance of eternal salvation that God has planned for man.
