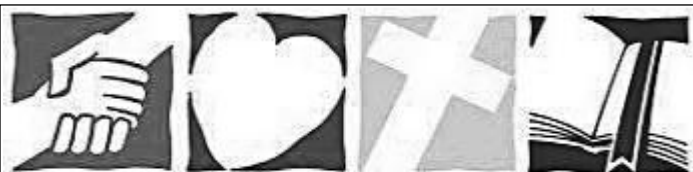

### *Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Consistent with last Sunday, the opening passage brings another prophecy from Isaiah that symbolizes the prophetic suffering of the Messiah through his song about the “suffering servant.” Mark reports on Jesus’ self-revelation of His being the Messiah to His disciples. He amplifies Isaiah’s “suffering servant” prophecy of Jesus as the Messiah.

The Isaiah passage comes from the part his book that is called “Hymns to the New Jerusalem” and is also called “Israel in Darkness.” The main character is a disciple of Yahweh. He prayerfully receive God’s word, before he can teach it to others. Like prophets before him, he is ignored and maliciously, maltreated by the people. Yet he declares that he is not disgraced by their treatment and provides a stark contrast in the confrontations of his good with the peoples’ evil treatment.

Setting himself like flint symbolizes a face covered with spittle. He asserts no fear from such horrific treatment, for “the Lord God is my help.” Every detail that he announces is a preamble to Jesus’ passion, suffering, and death as Jesus’ earthly mission as the Messiah.

Mark’s gospel is the revealing of the suffering servant prophecy of Jesus’ first declaration to His disciples that He is the Messiah and must suffer. In terms of time, the Mark selection for this Sunday’s passage corresponds to John’s “Bread of Life” discourse where Peter acknowledges Jesus as the Holy One sent by God but not a messianic title. The second question is directed to specifically to the disciples for they are the “you” in Jesus’ query. In answer from the other disciples’ response to Jesus’ question of His identity, they reply with a list of other past holy men. What follows in the remaining part of this passage, Jesus has entrusted them with the secret of God’s kingdom while “those people” seen everything about Jesus as an unsolvable enigma.

Jesus directs the disciples that they are not to tell the others His identity, even though they do not understand that the son of man must suffer and die. Peter takes offense and rebuffs Jesus in spite of his calling Jesus the “Christ” which means “the one anointed by God.” They do not grasp Jesus’ mission that He must suffer and die. Jesus rebukes Peter with the statement “get behind me Satan” much like His reply to the real Satan in the wilderness. But this use of Satan is meant that he Peter is not ready for leadership and must remain as a follower for he and the others have much to learn.

Jesus now turns to the crowd to show that the life He teaches demands a style that man too will suffer to regain his inheritance of an eternal life. Life on earth is not definitive, but transitory and relative. That life is the means to acquire a definitive life in heaven. He adds that those who wish to save the earthy life will lose their eternal life. But whoever loses his earthly life for Him, Jesus, will earn eternal life. In the ending verses of this passage, Jesus specifies the “path” to achieve eternal life.

Jesus has shown that He is the “suffering servant” prophesied by Isaiah that displays the “way” to an eternal life. God want man to re-earn his inheritance and sends His Son to establish that “way.”

## **Buses planned for Pennsylvania March for Life Sept. 27**

Pro-life supporters from across the state will gather in Harrisburg for the first Pennsylvania March for Life Sept. 27. The event will include a rally on the Capitol steps at 11 a.m. and the march at noon. Four buses, one from each county of the Diocese of Greensburg, are planned; there is no cost, thanks to an anonymous donor, but meals will not be provided. Seats can be reserved by contacting the following coordinators (departure and return times and additional details will be forthcoming):

- Armstrong: Mary Anne Galonski, 724-664-4878; bus will leave from Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, Kittanning
- Fayette: Chuck Kosco, 724-437-3943; bus will leave from Uniontown Mall
- Indiana: St. Bernard of Clairvaux Parish, Indiana, 724-465-2210; bus will leave from the parish
- Westmoreland: St. Agnes Parish, North Huntingdon, 724-863-2626; bus will leave from the parish

**MASS ATTENDANCE** has been 70-80% of our pre-pandemic attendance (310) leading up to, and since, the Sunday obligation was re-instated. Similar estimates have been reported for other parishes, suggesting on-going COVID concerns or possibly a lasting effect that may require intense post-pandemic outreach efforts to overcome.

**LITANY TO ST. JOSEPH** will be prayed immediately after the 8:00 am Mass each Wednesday during this Holy Year in honor of St. Joseph.

**NOW IS A GOOD TIME to inquire about the possibility of becoming a Catholic!** A small group of interested persons is beginning to form. The process, called *the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)*, is expected to get underway before the end of September. Just call the Parish Office.

**OUR PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL** currently has only four members. At least three new members will be sought to serve on this important team of advisors to the pastor. Parishioners who are practicing our Catholic faith and are dedicated to advancing the mission of the Church within our St. Florian Parish Faith Community qualify. If you would like to be considered for this service, or to recommend someone, please call the parish office or let Fr. John know. Thank you.

#### 10-YEAR LOAN REPAYMENT REPORT

As of September 2<sup>nd</sup>, we have paid back \$152,840.54 (including \$15,449.75 in interest) on our \$300,000 loan plus \$36,335.54 interest. Due to an increase in the interest rate from 2.25% to 2.5% in July, the loan will be paid off with regular payments in November, 2026, one month later than previously forecasted. This is still 20 months ahead of the original schedule due to extra payments made early, and is expected to save us \$9,754.93 in interest.

#### DIOCESAN LENTEN APPEAL (DLA) 2021

Total pledges now total \$55,547.31 with 176 households contributing; \$51,349 has already been paid! *Thank you so much for your amazing generosity. May God reward you!* And remember that assessment-free gifts to the DLA can be made until the end of 2021. DLA reports will be given each month.
