## **Gospel Summary & Question of the Week** Read Sunday's Gospel, Jn 6:41-51

## 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Cycle B

### **Gospel Inspiration:**

Are we willing to be taught by God? If we are, then we will begin to see things and make judgments using a Divine lens. Often, we perceive things with purely human eyes and reference points. When we do this, reality can lose its ing spark and we miss what God is trying to say. When using human eyes exclusively, Jesus is at best perceived simply as a prophet who has some wise things to say. The human element has a difficult time seeing Jesus' divinity and recognizing him as the Bread of Life that comes down from heaven. We can easily get stuck on Jesus' human associations and overlook the marvelous wonders God wants us to see. If we really allow ourselves to be taught by God, we will then come to see the truth about Jesus and the abundant everlasting life God offers. Jesus becomes the key that unlocks all our relationships: with God others, ourselves, and creation. He, as the true and lasting bread from heaven, shows us the gifts of faith, hope, and love that God bestows on us. Through this divine lens we see that all life sparkles and glows with God's love.

The lens of our faith asks us to learn from Jesus Christ. Jesus, as the real Bread of Life, shows us our eternal destiny and completes and frames our lives. It is only in allowing ourselves to be taught by Jesus, that faith, hope, and love take on much greater importance. All the relationships in our lives are now structured and ordered using God's primary commandment of love. Jesus, then, is not just some man who lived at some point in history. Jesus is the incarnate Son of God who shows us the way, the truth, and the life. Using this lens changes things up a great deal. Looking at the creation that surrounds you and the special unique people you love, what is God trying to teach you about His love for you and the eternal life He wants you to have?

## **Question of the Week:**

We hear today John's account of Jesus' rejection by his own people. The Jews struggle to think of Jesus as "the living bread that came

down from heaven." What are some of Jesus' words that challenge you or cause you to struggle?

Stop murmuring" Jesus told the disciples in today's gospel. Complaining is a dead-end; constant complaining is nagging. We might feel better but others feel bitter. Silence or grumbling will not resolve the problem. Address differences honestly and respectfully.

Dear Parishioners,

Elsewhere in the bulletin today we address our young people who are going off to college or are in the military.

We would like to know there whereabouts because they are an extension of our parish family, wherever they may be. Here, I'd like to address young adults who are beyond that age and stage of life. If you have completed schooling and/or military, you are considered an "adult" in your own right in this sense: wherever you live, this is your spiritual home. The Church would want and expect you to register in a parish near where you live. You have the right to the spiritual care of your local pastor, whether it be in time of need or desire. The Church gives some leeway (the traditional time is six months) for those who have yet to settle in place. But, please note, this is YOUR responsibility. Do not presume that you are registered in a parish simply because you grew up there or went to school there. As Pastor, here, for example, I have no right to offer you the Sacraments of Baptism or Marriage without the permission of the Pastor who is truly responsible for you - the Pastor where you live. If you are still here in Saint Marys, please register. We need you to take responsibility for your own spiritual well-being and have a spiritual "home." We are thrilled if you choose QW. But, you have other choices. We cannot presume that you belong here. Evidence of membership, from the spiritual point of view, is, where one practices the faith, i.e., regularly attends Sunday Mass. If that is not happening, this is a good time to start again. From an external point of view, membership is also evidenced by your support of your parish - ministries, activities, and yes, Offertory and other financial gifts. These are the concrete ways we realize who is upholding and furthering the mission of the parish and the Church. There is no time like the present to make these things happen. All too often, we get calls asking for or demanding things we cannot do - give sacraments, sponsor certificates, even letters of recommendation - because people are not registered, and have no idea that as adults, this is YOUR responsibility, not ours. In today's world, banks will "close out" old accounts that have been inactive. No one seems to mind that. But, they don't make the translation to the world of the Church. As an organized structure, we have our ways, too, of knowing who belongs and is part of our family and our mission. I am trying to clarify this so that, when you call, fully expecting some quick service, you might grasp better what parish membership means and how it is expressed. We are thrilled to have whoever wants to come to Mass, but eventually, one needs a place to call "home." And since you have the right to choose that "home," you have to make the effort to let that be known. Typically, as adults, where one lives is their "home," not the place where they formerly lived or belonged. I hope this helps so many of our young people who evidently did not get this message as they finished their high school years here or elsewhere. The bottom line is -- we need you -the Church needs you -- the Lords needs you. Your "belonging" is very important, mostly for your sake, but also, for ours. --- fr jeff

#### ALL-IE ALL-IE IN-FREE!!!

Remember that call through the neighborhood at the end of a game of tag? It's time for everyone to come in. Well, we have reached the end of the dispensation which was necessary during the pandemic. The expectation is that the vast majority of us can now return to the regular practice of our faith - Sunday Mass attendance. Those who are homebound, ill, compromised, unvaccinated, or otherwise unable to be present, as always, are encouraged to make a judgment call that is best for their own well-being. As for the rest of us, let us take up this call to restore Sunday Mass to its proper place in our spiritual lives. We are walking through the "Bread of Life" teaching of Jesus in John's Gospel, Chapter 6. As His disciples, let us appreciate this most awesome blessing of the Lord's gift of Himself in Word and Sacrament, the staple nourishments of our spiritual lives.

#### SOME PROTOCOLS STILL IN PLACE

We recently received our instructions from the Diocese, outlining how we will celebrate Mass and "do Church." Largely, it is just time for the dispensation to be removed and a few minor changes. We will use Eucharistic Ministers and process again for the reception of Holy Communion.

But there is still to be no Holy Water in large containers or in any shared way. There is to be no collection taken through the congregation. Servers will help in a limited capacity, not assisting during the Preparation Rite. The Sign of Peace remains verbal, or by gesture (not touching).

Here at QW, we will reserve the Pews in the Back Left (St. Jude section) for those who need Social Distancing. And, we will sanitize between weekend Masses and after daily Masses.

If anyone is unable or uncomfortable processing forward for Holy Communion, please use the seating reserved for those with disabilities. There are also a few loose chairs available near the front.

Thanks to all of you for following closely our guidelines. And thanks to our Ushers, sanitizers, and helpers who have been faithful about keeping us as safe and healthy as possible.

### **ADORATION**

Join us Thursdays from after morning Mass until 6:30 pm for quiet time before the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. While we are celebrating the Bread of Life gospels, this is a great time to connect our Sunday with the personal prayer time before the Blessed Sacrament. Evening Prayer and Benediction take place to conclude our parish day of prayer - join us when you are able.


