

Live the Liturgy

January 2, 2022 The Epiphany of the Lord

Aware of the significance of the blessed star and drawn by its distinctive light, the magi traveled from distant lands to reach Bethlehem. They are the first people outside the immediate area to come and greet the newborn king.

Let us not forget that the magi relied on both science and faith to guide them to the Lord. They observed the night sky and studied the movement of the stars and planets, drawing conclusions from the travels of these heavenly bodies. This got them as far as Jerusalem, but a few miles from their destination they needed guidance from the chief priests and scribes to direct them to Bethlehem. By science or faith alone, they did not know enough. Together, they found the Lord.

Today we gather thousands of miles from Bethlehem, not to mention over two-thousand years from the holy event. Yet we, too, are drawn by our faith to this holy place to seek out the Son of God and do him homage. Let us in turn make Christ manifest to others wherever we go.

Ouestion of the week:

How do I use both science and faith to find my way to Jesus?

What Symbols Do I Use On The Door?

The symbols change each year, but For 2022 this is what you will write on your door in chalk:

20 + C + M + B + 22

What Do The Epiphany Door Symbols Mean?

The Epiphany door blessing includes symbols for all 3 kings, plus the numbers from the current year. Here's what the chalked numbers on the door mean: The first number "20" is for the first 2 numbers of the year, and the last number "22" is for the last 2 numbers of the year.

Epiphany House Blessing

The traditional date of Epiphany is January 6, but in the United States it is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2 and January 8.

The Epiphany house blessing of the door is a Catholic tradition for families. It's very simple to

do, it's not complicated or scary, and you can do it yourself. All you need is a piece of chalk! You can take your piece of chalk to mass with you and have your priest bless it, or you can bless the chalk yourself.

Here's what the chalked letters on the door mean:

The 3 letters are the first Initial of each of the kings (Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar).

The "C, M, B also stands for the Latin blessing *Christius Mansionem Benedicat* which means "May Christ Bless this House".


