

Collaborate in the Church

When one contemplates the origin of the Church, we know that Jesus' disciples were gathered together because of their experience of the presence and power of God's Spirit, of the Christ, within them. It was not until the experience of Pentecost that these disciples, by the power of the Holy Spirit became One - the Church - the Body of Christ. The disciples came to understand how Jesus had allowed this Spirit to lead Him, and how, now together as the Body of Christ, they were to continue to be lead and inspired by the same Spirit. Pope Francis has said, it is this very empowerment of the Spirit in all the members of the church that makes the Roman Church both "catholic" and "apostolic." This means not closed, but a proclamation of the Gospel to all people through one's words and actions. "Baptism permits Christ to live in us, and to live united with Him, in order to collaborate in the Church, each according to his or her own condition, to the transformation of the world."

"Collaborate in the Church" what does that mean to YOU. When I clicked on the word COLLABORATE, this is what surfaced: cooperate, work together, join forces, team up, work in partnership. This is how one lives out their Baptismal call, to collaborate for the transformation of the world.

As St Paul said in 1 Corinthians Chapter 12, "there are many gifts but only one body" is echoed in Pope Francis' words, when he says "according to his or her own condition."

So what's the point? If we truly want to see the transformation of the world, by our baptismal call, we must be committed to work together in a Church that becomes alive with the participation of the Body of Christ, that means ALL of US.

Recently there was a brainstorming of all the domestic and international needs that Holy Family could be attentive to. An exhaustive list prepared by spirit filled individuals. It was exciting to see what could happen in our little speck of the world. However, it cannot happen without everyone assessing how the spirit of God is preparing them to work in partnership with the Church.

At Holy Family, there are many examples of individuals or groups whose lives and ministries reflect Christ's spirit. I would like to highlight a simple, humble group of 24, who quietly SHOUT Christ's message of love. They are part of the Bereavement Ministry, the VIGIL PRAYER GROUP. When a funeral is announced, faithfully, whoever is available will go to the funeral home during visitation at 3pm, and invite the family to join them in the Vigil Prayers for the Deceased. Sometimes when there is

a crowd, they will go outside and pray together. When asked why they chose to participate in this ministry these were a few of the 24 responses...

"After losing our son, I felt I could offer support to the families, but as it turns out, I receive more help than I feel I can offer through this ministry. I'm so grateful to be able to be part of this wonderful ministry of healing."

"My wife drew me into this ministry, as she was in charge of so many aspects of each funeral. I would attend the prayer services and funerals with her, but I didn't make it my ministry until after she passed away. I saw the difference our presence and prayer service meant to the families, and I feel good that I am now a faithful servant to the needs of the grieving and the church."

"I have always liked to pray for and be respectful of the dead. That's how I was raised and it has been a big part of my life."

"I love celebrating people's lives and the comfort people receive. It is a blessing to be called to this ministry."

They know they are called, and one can sense their passion and commitment to this ministry. We all are called to collaborate with the Church. Do you dare to say, "Here I am God, I come to do your will," and then wait and listen. God will answer you and God will support your efforts. The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, "Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?" They were testing him. He said to them in reply, "What did Moses command you?" They replied, "Moses permitted a husband to write a bill of divorce and dismiss her." But Jesus told them. "Because of the hardness of your hearts he wrote you this commandment. But from the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." In the house the disciples again questioned Jesus about this. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

And people were bringing children to him that he might touch them, but the disciples rebuked them. When Jesus saw this he became indignant and said to them, "Let the children come to me; do not prevent them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. 




RETURN TEAM


Movie Day

Holy Family Parish Church Properties Use and Capital Expenditures Overview Part Two of Two

Dear Parishioners, Our Holy Family Parish Pastoral and Finance Council have been advising me on various parish events, ministries, projects and church uses. I was advised that we should share with the wider parish some of our strategy in the use of space for parish ministries and events along with some of the strategy for ongoing capital expenditure projects. The first part of that, concerning the current use of our churches and buildings was summarized in last week's bulletin. What is shared now is a summary of our capital expenditures. The Council members and I are sincerely listening to parishioners' questions and thoughts about these as we move forward together. Please contact a Pastoral Council member or me to discuss further. Capital Expenditure and Savings Accounts

Sound/Video Upgrades

We learned during the pandemic how helpful it was for a large portion of our parish to be able to livestream services from our five churches. Everyone was able to watch Mass and receive spiritual Communion while churches were closed. Even after all churches have opened we will continue to livestream, not only for those at risk of health, but for those generally homebound, and for those who are exploring churches and want to see the church before attending in person. Because of this, we made a significant investment in three of our churches to make livestreaming more permanent. We now have two cameras, improved

sound and streaming capabilities at four of our five churches. The portable livestream camera that we had been using at most churches works best at our smallest church building, so we didn't have a need to upgrade the sound and video at St. Januarius. The ability to make these and some other improvements was funded by the excess in Parish Share that has been contributed by parishioners over the past two years.





SJB New Entrances and parking lot expansion

The former St. John the Baptist Parish had plans for over 25 years for two new entrances to the property, partly for safety in exiting and entering school students and parishioners. The new driveway off of Millers Lane will allow for a better line of sight in entering and exiting the property. Off of the main thoroughfare of Unity Center, parishioners were not able exit. The new entrance/exit on Unity Center will allow for more efficient entrance and exit for parishioners and especially for large events that involve the entire parish. To build up the road to Unity Center, the existing soil was able to be used from

the parish property that also allowed for a 100 car parking lot expansion. The Holy Family Festival has continued to be a huge success for community involvement as well as parish bonding. It is also our largest fundraiser. For these reasons, the Pastoral and Finance Councils advised continuing this plan and expense at this time.





Additional Investments

Our Maintenance Crew needed a pickup truck to work between all five churches and school buildings. We purchased a new truck last year for their use. Also, we were given a grant for new LED light bulbs and our maintenance crew is installing them in all of our churches, buildings and parking lots. This will mean brighter lights and at a fraction of our electrical costs to light these spaces.




