From the Desk Of....

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

You might have heard the story of the priest who gave the Christmas Eve homily at the early 4 PM Mass that is largely attended by young families with young children. Father called all the children brave enough to come and sit up front on the sanctuary floor, not far from the nativity displayed in the church. Father had a large bag, almost like a Santa Claus bag full of boxed items. As the children came forward, he introduced the bag to the children and started to take out the wrapped gifts inside saying, "Children, I want to show these gifts to you. Over the past few weeks families and friends have dropped off these gifts for me and I am waiting until Christmas morning to open them. We all get excited by gifts don't we..." And the children started to nod their heads, raise their hands and talk about the gifts that they were hoping to get on Christmas morning too. Father kept pulling out more and more boxes from his bag stacking them up between the children and the nativity. When he was finished, he said with excitement, "Look at all these gifts. I can't wait to open them tomorrow morning. I'm sure you will be excited tomorrow too when you see gifts at home around a tree and want to open them all at once." The children continued to nod and talk about Christmas toys and gifts even louder. Father said, "But look! I have so many gifts, I've blocked all of you and me from seeing the nativity on the other side of the gifts. And this is sad because the most important gift that we are able to receive on Christmas is the one in that nativity, Jesus, born as a baby boy for us. In fact, that's the whole reason we even have any gifts at Christmas." He then started to move the gifts to the side of the nativity so that the children could see the figures in the nativity and especially the baby Jesus in the manger.

It's a simple message that we all know. Yet, it's also true that sometimes during the Christmastide, we get so full of the stuff surrounding Christmas that we forget about Jesus Christ, who is the reason for it all. Let's enjoy the gifts and glitter, the music and lights, the time with family and friends. All of that is good, but if it keeps us from celebrating the most important part of Christmas, God's Word born into our world in the person of Jesus Christ, then all we'll be doing is having a party. Jesus makes our celebration of Christmas transcend our material world, drawing us into a greater purpose that can be for all

people in even the most darkest moments of our lives good news of great joy (cf Luke 2:10). May Jesus always be our first reason for Christmas joy!

Along with Father George and Father David, with our resident Father Jinto and our Deacons Joe, Tim and Frank, we offer to all our Holy Family community a blessed Christmas, filled with the holy joy that comes from our celebration of the birth of our savior, Jesus Christ. We hope that you are able to be with us for our second feast of the Holy Family on Sunday, December 26 and throughout the New Year!

(This reading is for Feast of the Holy Family - Christmas Readings are in the Worship Aid)

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." And he said to them, "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

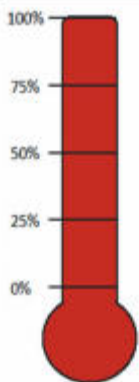

The Traveling Vocation Chalice is all about vocation awareness!

Everyone is endowed by God with special gifts and talents. Every baptized Catholic is called by God to share their gifts and talents to serve Him and His Church. The visual of a priest's chalice in our home fosters praying and respect for vocations, not only to the priesthood and religious life, but to all vocations and all the ways God calls us to use and adapt our gifts and talents in the kingdom. **Traveling Vocation Chalices** are available at all 5 Holy Family Parish churches to encourage daily prayers for vocations. Families or individuals may reserve a week to take one of the chalices to their home. The process is easy:

1. Accessing holyfamilyparish.org/vocation-chalice online enables you to view a 30 second "how-to" video and to sign-up to reserve the chalice at the church and week of your choice.
2. Each carrying case includes a priest's chalice and copies of a booklet of prayers for each day. Depending on the available time of the family or individual, daily praying may be short brief prayers or longer prayers followed by reflection questions to encourage conversation.
3. When you attend Mass the following weekend the chalice is returned to the same church.
4. Place the chalice on the table with the bread and wine before Mass begins.
5. At the Offertory, the chalice is brought up with the offertory gifts and used as the chalice during Mass.

All Parish and School Volunteers

New Protecting God's Children Training Requirement

All volunteers of Holy Family Parish and Holy Family School are required to complete a NEW Protecting God's Children training. Because there is so much new information on how to create a safe environment for children, which also includes the protection of vulnerable adults, the Safe Environment Office at the Diocese of Pittsburgh felt it was essential that all volunteers be updated with this important information. The name of the new training is *Protecting God's Children Maltreatment 3.2 and Vulnerable Adults*. This re-certification training for all clergy, employees and volunteers is a follow-up from the Protecting God's Children course everyone completed initially. Re-certification with an updated Protecting God's Children training will be required every three years. The diocesan Safe Environment Office previously sent emails with instructions for the new training to all volunteers, but some still need to complete the training. In January, those people will be receiving a letter with the information needed to log in to complete the online course, which includes your User ID and password. If you would like to complete this training before you receive your letter in January, or if you have any questions, please contact Barb Pronio at 412-793-4511, ext. 401 or safe@holyfamilypgh.org.

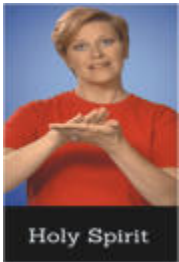

Holy Family Parish Angel Tree Donations

The people of Holy Family Parish heard the desires and needs of individuals and organizations through the Angel Tree, and responded with great heart!

St. Vincent DePaul was able to fulfill the wishes of many families. The Skilled Care Facilities received personal care gifts, nightgowns, and slippers for those designated in need. Bedrooms of St. Joseph House of Hospitality, which are quite drafty, have become cozier with the 47 blankets and 26 sheets that were donated and the parish made a separate donation of \$3,000 to support the outreach to homeless men. The Little Sisters of the Poor received \$3,000 from the parish along with \$705 of WalMart gift cards that the residents use when The Little Sisters take them shopping. Intersection in McKeesport was given \$750 of food gift cards to feed their hungry along with the parish donation of \$3,000 and the homebound received the oils of St. Joseph, and prayer cards along with a gift card or gift.

The parish donations to St. Joseph House, The little Sisters and Intersection are made possible through parishioner donations to the Social Ministry fund. Another \$25,000 will be distributed to local food banks in the new year from Social Ministry due to the generous donations received in 2021.

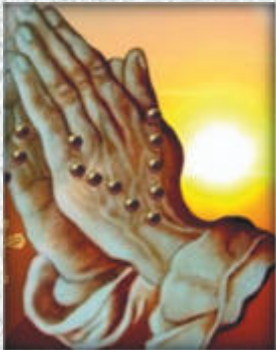
