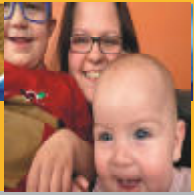

Dear Holy Family Parishioners:

Greetings and Merry Christmas! The gospel almost sounds like a children's tale this week. It begins with the majestic appeal of the magi from faraway places, who are all bringing gifts that seem quite unusual to us. We see the mysterious eastern star that leads them as the threat of the cunning King Herod looms. But where are they going, they are going to see the miracle of if an infant who was born in a stable. They were ordered by King Herod to report where they found the child; however, once they saw the awe of Him, they knew they could not. After they gave the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, they departed for their homelands as to avoid seeing King Herod. After looking at this story, you might be thinking, where was the epiphany? The Epiphany came to the magi in a dream. In a dream, they were warned not to listen to King Herod, as he did not truly want to pay the infant homage, but to harm him. After they witnessed the goodness and light of the infant Jesus, they knew in their hearts to trust what they heard in their dream and to not report a word to King Herod.

One of the characteristics of the Epiphany that I find the most astounding is the acceptance of it all. The magi were living in a community where it would become necessary to be different and follow a faith that not many others have been able to witness yet.

I was recently challenged with this goal of acceptance during the December Family Adoration Hour. I always take my two children, Jonah and Ceci, and without a doubt, people know we are there by the chatter, laughs, and sometimes cries. Jonah, being three now, has gotten better behaved and much more observant. At this holy hour we were at St. Irenaeus sitting in the front when Jonah noticed the Stations of the Cross to his left. For a moment, everything was silent, Ceci was distracted in a mix of pretzels and a book and Jonah was gazing in his imagination. Suddenly, Jonah started fighting the air like a superhero, being the Hulk specifically. I quickly stopped him,

reminding him that we don't fight in church. However, his response amazed me. He said, "Mom, but I have to save Jesus. Those bad guys aren't being nice and are hurting him." My instinctive response of disappointment that he should know better quickly diminished as I accepted the situation, and I couldn't help but begin to cry as I was able to share with him that Jesus did it all to save us.

I have to say that I am blessed with two wonderful children and a third on the way, but that doesn't negate the challenges of being a young mother in a society that isn't always supportive of that. However, I'm sure the magi thought at some point that the decision to follow their faith would be challenging, but the epiphany clarified things for them and encouraged them, even when difficult. For myself, it would be easier to not wrestle my children to pray every night, to not bring them to Mass and just watch at home, to not take a one- and three-year-old to Adoration monthly—but, then hearing that Jonah is in the beginning stages of a relationship with Jesus makes me realize that my husband and I are on the right track and accepting the struggles does make a difference. *That was my epiphany.*

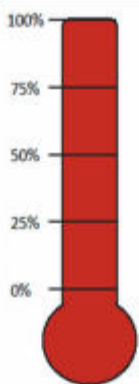

Holy Family Parish - Epiphany House Blessing 2022

The Epiphany House Blessing for the home is done each year on the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The traditional date of Epiphany is January 6, but is transferred to be celebrated on Sunday, January 2nd. Chalking the door is done on the front door of the house and uses symbols drawn with blessed chalk. Chalk will be available after all masses this weekend.

Meaning Of The Blessing 20 + C + M + B + 22

The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the three magi: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. They also represent the Latin words "Christus mansionem benedicat" which means "May Christ bless the house." The "+" signs symbolize the cross and the 20 and the 22 represent the year, 2022.

Prayer for the Epiphany Home Blessing

The leader greets those present in the following words:

Lord God of heaven and earth,
you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation
by the guidance of a star.
Bless this house and all who inhabit it.
Fill them (us) with the light of Christ,
that their (our) concern for others may reflect your love.
We ask this through Christ our Lord. R/. Amen.



The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:
May Christ Jesus dwell with us, keep us from all harm,
and make us one in mind and heart, now and forever. R/. Amen.

*You can end the celebration with a suitable song, for example,
"O Come, All Ye Faithful" or "We Three Kings."*

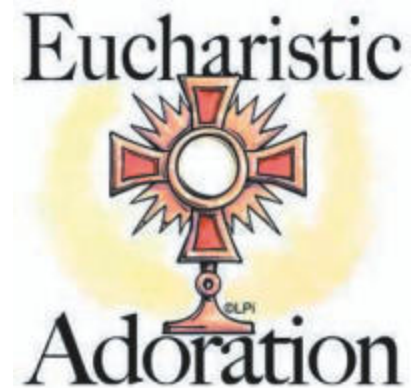

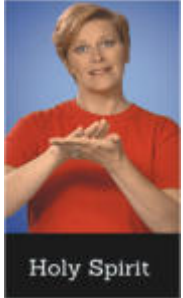

Y gracias a ello nosotros podemos agradecerle a Dios cada noche que aún no nos hayan echado de esa casa de la que todos somos indignos. Tendremos, claro, que hacer que luchar por mejorarla, pero sabiendo bien que siempre ha sido mediocre, que siempre será mediocre, como en las casas siempre hay polvo por muy cuidadosa que sea su dueña. No se sabe por dónde, pero el polvo entra siempre. Y uno limpia el polvo en lugar de pasarse la vida enfadándose con él.

En rigor, todas esas críticas que proyectamos contra la Iglesia deberíamos volcarlas contra cada uno de nosotros mismos. 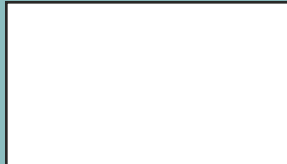

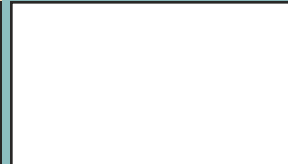
