From the Desk Of....

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend, we are celebrating the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In secular culture the Christmas season begins around Halloween and ends on December 26. However, in the Roman Catholic Church, the liturgical season of Christmas only begins on December 25 and lasts much longer! The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops explain, "The liturgical season of Christmas begins with the vigil Masses on Christmas Eve and concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts, and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him... including the fact that he was born to die for us." At the same time, the historical Christmas cycle extended even past the Baptism of the Lord. Traditionally the feast of Candlemas (the Presentation of the Lord) occurs on February 2 and marked the final conclusion of the "Christmas cycle." Candlemas celebrates the event that occurred 40 days after Jesus' birth and was his first introduction to the Temple. In other words, it is the final "baby Jesus" feast day on the Church's liturgical calendar. Christmas is a beautiful season in the Catholic Church, one that doesn't end on December 26, but extends as far as February! Liturgically we will conclude the Christmas season this weekend. Nativity sets and decorations will be taken down.

As Christians we continue to celebrate the presence of Christ with us. At Holy Family Parish, we are continuing to offer faith formation for adults in two very popular and easily accessible ways. First, we are offering a second Alpha program. Over 200 parishioners attended in the fall and had high praise for the program. It has been described as "dinner and a movie and discussion with friends." That is essentially what happens at Alpha. It's the first step at reinvigorating our lives of faith as spiritual human beings. Come to the first few sessions and find out more. Sign up information is in the bulletin, page 9.



The second way we will offer adult formation in our faith is Jesus 101 – Adult School of Faith. We chose the Jesus 101, like a college course title. It's a beginning step, to make sure no one is intimidated by the level of discussion. However, it is for adults, a step beyond CCD programming. Think of it like RCIA for cradle-Catholics.

Almost everyone who has gone through RCIA at Holy Family Parish (and OPV) in the last few years is inspired and increasingly interested in the Christian and Catholic faith that they experience. Come and find out why RCIA is so encouraging. Each session will be offered twice, once in Oakmont and once in Plum every other week. No registration is necessary. Catechists are skilled in teaching adults and will offer a presentation and facilitate a bible study on the readings for the upcoming Sunday.



I hope that many parents and grandparents, as well as single adults are able to take advantage of Alpha or Jesus 101 starting this month. May we continue to discover Christ in our lives from his birth at the nativity and throughout the mysteries of our faith.

MARCH FOR LIFE



A few people have inquired about the annual March For Life that will be held in Washington, DC on January 21, 2022. Holy Family Parish had planned a bus for this event, but we found out in September, that the organizers are promoting local Marches instead. We were too late to change our bus reservations for the September 27, 2021 March for Life in Harrisburg, PA, but moved our bus plans for this month to September, 2022, presuming there will be a PA March for Life in the fall again. Last year, we had a local March for Life in Boyce Park, due primarily to COVID concerns then. This year, we will have two local March For Life events on Friday, January 21, the same day as the March for Life in Washington.

1. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament 10 AM to 1 PM at SJB, with March for Life beginning at 1 PM with Rosary led by Holy Family School Students (March will walk the grounds of the SJB property perimeter).
2. Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament 6 PM to 7 PM in SJV church narthex for inside or outside adoration, with March for Life beginning at 6 PM with Rosary led by Parishioners at SJV walking around the SJV property, or under the pavilion if weather is inclement.

SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE BISHOP'S GROUP

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring a Holy Hour, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, is prayed every day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest or bishop. You may know that each of the priests of Holy Family Parish has a different Seven Sisters group praying for them. The commitment for one year is for; one woman, one day of the week, one Holy Hour, one priest, one heart of prayer.

Recently a group has begun for Bishop Zubik. A bishop's group is a little different in that it consists of three complete groups for one bishop. There are three Holy Hours prayed every day exclusively for a bishop.

If you are a woman who feels called to serve the Church through a commitment of prayer, please consider this apostolate. Seven Sisters has spread all over the world, with groups in all fifty states in the USA. There are still only a handful in the Diocese of Pittsburgh. Let's grow this beautiful ministry to support our priests and Bishop in thanksgiving for all that they do.

Christmas Brunch Volunteers

Thank you, thank you, thank you to all the volunteers who made the 2021 Christmas "Brunch" a success.



Covid may have caused a change to the menu and the venue, but our parish was able to provide brunch packages to 233 people on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

A total of 55 Holy Family parishioners from all five of our churches took time away during the busy days before Christmas to help make the package delivery possible.

In addition to assembling and delivering the packages, other volunteers delivered the brunch, marketing flyers to local food banks, senior citizen high rise apartment buildings, and senior centers; purchased the package items; managed the reservations; staffed the Grab-N-Go; and managed the traffic flow for the Grab-N-Go pickup.



Twenty parish volunteers assembled on December 22, 23, and 24 at St. Januarius Church to prepare brunch packages of pastries, fruit and packaged foods such as oatmeal, macaroni and cheese, peanut butter crackers, raisins, cereal cups, soup, and trail mix. The package also included a candy cane, a Holy Family Parish calendar, and a Christmas card made by children in the (CCD) classes.

A special thank you to the CCD students who made those wonderful cards to cheer the homebound.



Twenty-four volunteers delivered the Christmas brunch packages on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day to 192 homebound people in Verona, Penn Hills, Oakmont, Monroeville, Garden City, Apollo, New Kensington, and Plum. One of the volunteers who delivered the brunches told us about her experience delivering to an elderly



woman who lives alone. "With tears in her eyes, she said she couldn't believe the church would do such a generous thing. She couldn't thank me enough. I'm glad I was able to be part of this wonderful ministry."

Forty -one packages were available on Christmas morning for Grab-N-Go pick up at St. Januarius from 10:00 to 11:30. One of the Grab-N-Go recipients remarked, "Thank you for the Christmas Brunch and [Grab-N-] Go for me. I appreciate it and all that helped to provide it." Another called the day of Christmas to say she was so pleased with all the goodies she received and wanted to thank the delivery person, as well as the committee who put it all together.

Luke 10:27 reminds us that, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself."

Volunteers, **thank you** for embodying the spirit of Christmas through your selfless acts of kindness to ensure that those of our neighbors who might be alone on Christmas would have something special to brighten their day.

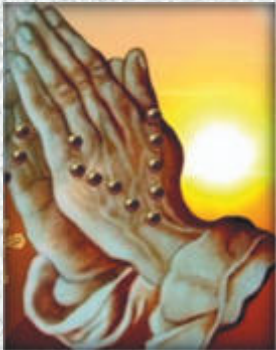
