CELEBRATION OF SACRAMENTS

Baptism (Infant): Preparation for parents is required and offered four times a year. Celebrations are scheduled privately or during the weekend Masses. Parents should be registered in the parish.

Sick, Homebound and Hospital Visits: Anyone requesting visits or Anointing of the Sick should notify the office. Due to the privacy laws, hospitals and care institutions are prohibited from disclosing patient information. We depend on receiving requests from family or caregivers.

Matrimony: Couples wishing to be married should contact a priest or deacon at least six months before the wedding. Couples may reserve St. Olaf church for a wedding up to twelve months prior. See the parish website for marriage guidelines and the form to request a wedding date.

ARE YOU NOT CATHOLIC BUT INTERESTED IN BECOMING ONE?: Baptized and unbaptized children of catechetical age (7-18 years old) and adults are initiated through a special rites of Christian Initiation. If you have questions about becoming a Catholic or wish to begin the process, please contact the office.

Religious Education and Sacramental Preparation (children and youth): The parish assists parents as the primary catechists of their children by offering programs of Christian formation and sacramental education. Preparation for First Confession; First Eucharist and Confirmation are separate from regular religious education, but presume that candidates are active in religious education programs. Registration forms are available in the parish commons.

Stewardship: Catholics are encouraged to support the Church in time, talent and treasure in measure of the blessings they have received from God. Financial contributions are the primary source from which parishes and dioceses can offer programs of assistance and evangelization, as well as provide for facilities for worship and ministry. Registered parishioners can contribute online, by mail or through the offertory envelope system which will track contributions for tax purposes. We thank you for your generous support.
