Of Many Things

- ◆ **Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, “What are you looking for?” They said to him, “Rabbi” — which translated means Teacher —, “where are you staying?”** John 1: 35-42 **Philip found Nathanael and said to him, “We have found him about whom Moses in the law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus son of Joseph from Nazareth . . . Come and see.”** John 1: 43-51

In today’s Gospel, the first disciples meet Jesus and ask where he is staying — “Come, and you will see.” Jesus dwells in every place where all are welcome and cared for; Jesus makes his home where everyone is assured a place; Jesus stays wherever compassion and forgiveness are readily offered. **Question for the Car:** Does Jesus stay in my home? Are compassion and forgiveness readily offered there?

- ◆ **Thank you** for your extraordinary generosity – remarkable, especially considering COVID -- to Holy Family at Christmas. **A grand total of \$73,732 was received in the Christmas Collection** – before Christmas, on Christmas itself, and in the days before New Year’s. We are also most grateful for the “end-of-the-year giving”, from IRA’s and other funds, which several folks exercised -- benefitting both our Christmas collection and our Capital Campaign and Endowment Funds. **God bless you in this New Year! Fr. PJR.**
- ◆ **As you know – the wearing of masks in the Church and Chapel is required – both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners.** Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so.
- ◆ **Volunteers needed** – Since we started having public Mass once again, the Knights of Columbus have been most helpful acting as **greeters and ushers** for those who are in attendance. We appreciate their service and would like to augment their numbers. We are also interested in knowing whether any of our **EMHCs** are comfortable resuming their ministry at Mass. We are at the point now that having a few more women and men volunteers to call on for this service would be helpful. If you find yourself comfortable with attending Mass in person – **and would be willing to serve as a greeter/usher or EMHC from time to time – please contact Sandy Michaels (330-688-6412, Ext. 250 or michaels@holyfamilystow.org.** With sufficient volunteers, we might need to schedule folks only once or twice per month.
- ◆ **Catholic University Collection -- 16-17 January 2021 --** Located in the heart of the nation’s capital, Catholic University of America offers graduate and undergraduate courses in more than 180 academic programs. By giving to the National Collection, you will help support more than 6,000 students who are seeking a faith-filled education at an institution that supports cutting-edge research in multiple fields. Your investment will enable the University to continue to support the Church and to advance its work of preparing the next generation of leadership, both religious and lay, of our Church and nation. - ◆ **Latin America and El Salvador Collection -- 23-24 January 2021 --** The Latin American Collection will take place on 23-24 January 2021. This is the only appeal made by the Diocesan Mission Office for the Cleveland Latin American Mission in El Salvador. It is the main support for two Diocese of Cleveland priests who work in the two parishes served by our Mission Office. This appeal also makes a contribution to the Collection for the Church in Latin America that is managed by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops and benefits projects and the formation of seminarians, religious and lay leaders in 23 countries across Latin America. Envelopes for this purpose are included in your January packets – and can be submitted throughout the month of January. *Faith Direct* participants can designate a donation online.
- ◆ **Year of St. Joseph** -- Pope Francis has proclaimed a special “Year of St Joseph,” beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a tender and loving, obedient father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. This Apostolic Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

- ◆ **2021 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal** -- kicks off in January with the theme "Love your Neighbor." During the week of 25 January, close to 100,000 households will receive a letter from Bishop Malesic encouraging support for the 2021 Appeal and asking each of us to "help our brothers and sisters in need." The Appeal goal is \$13.5 million and is needed to continue to serve more than 400,000 people in need. Donations can be made online or by texting CCHOPE to 41444.
- ◆ **Capital Campaign** – We are most grateful that the gifts of generous parishioners to the **Our Faith-Our Family-Our Future** capital campaign have allowed us to go forward during this past Summer with the **replacement** of the antiquated and unpredictable heating system in the school building. The new equipment has been installed and is up and running in the School. Our children and teachers thank you. **Thank you – Holy Family Parishioners!!** Meanwhile, work has been completed on the "connector" between the Rectory and the Church Hall. This will serve as the base for the new HVAC equipment for the Church – scheduled to be installed in the church **next Summer**. Because the pledges have been coming in on a regular basis, we have been able to plan accordingly. **Thank you!**
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your "typical" circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you will need to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*

“Guaranteeing Just and Humane Border Policies

As Catholics, we believe that every person has the right to a safe and dignified life.

Additionally, recent changes to policy and practice have decimated the U.S. asylum system. The U.S. should restore and uphold access to asylum in a manner that offers a genuine humanitarian response and respects U.S. and international law.

We urge the Biden Administration to take the following actions:

- 2. Restore access to asylum and due process (continued):

Promote universal access to, and communication with, pro-bono legal representation:

- * Expand access to pro-bono legal programs including through direct representation for asylum seekers and increases in Know Your Rights (KYR), Legal Orientation Program (LOR), Information Court Helpdesk (ICH) funding.

Restore humane and comprehensive pathways to access protection:

- * Work with regional partners to strengthen their asylum systems.
- * Restore and expand programs such as the Central American Minors (CAM) program that offer children much-needed alternatives to making the long journey north to claim asylum at the U.S.-Mexico border.

Preserve protections for vulnerable groups:

- * Apply trauma-informed care to vulnerable populations, such as unaccompanied children and those escaping domestic violence.
- * Ensure there are policy interventions and funded outreach programs within border communities to assist and protect women who are subject to increasing rates of homicide specifically because they are female.”

THE *SPIRITUAL EXERCISES* OF ST. IGNATIUS LOYOLA **Spirituality Program for Adults (SPA)**

Wounded in battle in 1521, the Spanish (Basque) nobleman, Ignatius of Loyola, experienced during his recuperation a deep religious conversion and a desire "to help others." Some ten years later at the University of Paris he gathered nine fellow students and together they founded the Society of Jesus, the Jesuits. These companions elected Ignatius the superior of the new order, which rapidly expanded to about a thousand members by the time Ignatius died in 1556. His great masterpiece, the *SPIRITUAL EXERCISES*, a program for a religious retreat, which encapsulated his own experience, continues to be popular today. He was canonized in 1622 along with his friend, Francis Xavier, the great missionary, who was a member of the original group.

For 500 years the *Spiritual Exercises* of St. Ignatius Loyola have inspired countless men and women to a deeper spiritual growth, discernment, self-revelation, and a more personal, intimate relationship with Jesus. The *Spiritual Exercises* form the cornerstone of Ignatian spirituality.

For the past thirteen years The Spirituality Program for Adults (SPA) at Walsh Jesuit has offered an eight-week format of the *Spiritual Exercises*, over nine (9) consecutive weeks, to the Walsh Jesuit community—current parents, faculty, staff, board members, alumni, alumni spouses, alumni parents, and friends of Walsh Jesuit.

Retreat sessions are held once a week beginning with Mass, followed by a presentation and small-group discussions. Each retreatant is expected to spend 30 minutes a day doing the following at home:

- Pray over assigned Scripture passages (20 minutes)
 - Journal reflections on Scripture passages (5 minutes)
- Review the day (5 minutes)

The SPA Retreat is offered twice a year; in the fall and winter. You are invited to prayerfully consider making the retreat offered this Winter/Lent.

As one former retreatant said, "I walked away from the nine week experience more in tune with my prayer life, experiencing Scripture and not merely reading or listening to it, and with great satisfaction and reward—becoming closer to God."

The Sunday TV Mass is moving to a new TV channel, and a new time.

The weekly television Mass produced by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland is moving.

Starting on Nov. 22, the Sunday television Mass will be seen at 10 a.m. on WUAB Channel 43, the CW43. This change provides viewers with an opportunity to take part in the weekly celebration of the Mass at a much more convenient time. In addition, WUAB Channel 43 is an over-the-air station that is accessible even to those without cable TV. Those with cable TV need only to check their local cable system listings to determine where WUAB is located on their local channel line-up.

The weekly TV Mass is produced by the Diocese of Cleveland and it originates from the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland. The televised Mass has been a staple of religious programming on Northeast Ohio airwaves for decades, cultivating a dedicated and faithful following. It is hoped that viewers will continue to tune in on this new station at this new, more convenient time.

The TV Mass also can be accessed on demand starting Saturday evening and running throughout Sunday on the Diocese of Cleveland website, dioceseofcleveland.org. In addition, the Mass can be heard on the radio, at 4 p.m. Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. Sundays on AM 1260 The Rock. Also, radio station WINT-1330 AM airs the Mass at 9 a.m. each Sunday and Cox Communications cable subscribers can view the Mass at 11:30 a.m. Sunday on channel 45.


