Of Many Things

- ◆ **“This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel . . .” [Jesus] said to [Simon and his brother Andrew], “Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.”** Mark 1: 14-20

Like the Galilee fishermen, Jesus calls us to become “fishers of men”: to use whatever “nets” we have to “catch” those around us drowning in a sea of violence, despair, poverty or abuse. To be the “fishers” that Christ calls us to be is to be ready to “cast the net” of God’s love that we have experienced upon the troubled waters of those drowning on our Galilee. **Question for the Car:** What am I willing to give up – in order to follow the Lord?

- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup.
- ◆ **Winter Weather Advisory** – Our “senior” parishioners should be cautious about coming to church when the weather is severe – or when the streets and sidewalks are icy. You are not expected to take your life in your hands to fulfill your Sunday obligation (dispensed during COVID). It would be better to pray at home safely – so that you can be healthy enough to attend Mass the following week when the weather is, hopefully, better.
- ◆ **As you know – the wearing of masks in the Church and Chapel is required – both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners.** Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so.
- ◆ I have been asked whether someone who has been vaccinated will be allowed in church without a mask. I think we’ll probably be asking you to wear masks for the foreseeable future. **The issue is not just that you are “safe” – but that the virus can still be present in your nose and throat – potentially a risk to others when you breathe, sneeze, or cough.** An expert opinion: *“People who have been vaccinated will be recommended to wear masks until at least the public health emergency is somewhat behind us,” says infectious disease expert Amesh A. Adalja, M.D., senior scholar at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security. That means both case counts and deaths will have to decrease significantly; space will also have to increase in intensive care units. “The general public is not going to have access to this vaccine until the summer of 2021. There are still a lot of people who can get infected and die [in the meantime],” Dr. Adalja says.*
- ◆ **Volunteers needed** – Since we started having public Mass once again, the Knights of Columbus have been most helpful acting as **greeters and ushers** for those who are in attendance. We appreciate their service and would like to augment their numbers. We are also interested in knowing whether any of our **EMHCs** are comfortable resuming their ministry at Mass. We are at the point now that having a few more women and men volunteers to call on for this service would be helpful. If you find yourself comfortable with attending Mass in person – **and would be willing to serve as a greeter/usher or EMHC from time to time – please contact Sandy Michaels (330-688-6412, Ext. 250) or michaels@holymfamilystow.org.** With sufficient volunteers, we might need to schedule folks only once or twice per month.
- ◆ **Latin America and El Salvador Collection -- 23-24 January 2021 --** The Latin American Collection will take place on 23-24 January 2021. This is the only appeal made by the Diocesan Mission Office for the Cleveland Latin American Mission in El Salvador. It is the main support for two Diocese of Cleveland priests who work in the two parishes served by our Mission Office. This appeal also makes a contribution to the Collection for the Church in Latin America that is managed by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops and benefits projects and the formation of seminarians, religious and lay leaders in 23 countries across Latin America. Envelopes for this purpose are included in your January packets – and can be submitted throughout the month of January. *Faith Direct* participants can designate a donation online.

- ◆ **Year of St. Joseph** -- Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of St Joseph," beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a tender and loving, obedient father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. This Apostolic Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.
- ◆ **2021 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal** -- kicks off in late January with the theme "Love your Neighbor." During the week of 25 January, close to 100,000 households will receive a letter from Bishop Malesic encouraging support for the 2021 Appeal and asking each of us to "help our brothers and sisters in need." The Appeal goal is \$13.5 million and is needed to continue to serve more than 400,000 people in need. Donations can be made online or by texting CCHOPE to 41444.
- ◆ **Sacramental Marriage** – Couples who may be in a marriage – or may be planning a wedding -- that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church (civil marriage, destination wedding, etc.), might find that now is a good time to consult with one of the priests to see whether that situation can be rectified or considered more carefully. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church's blessing. Issues involving divorce and remarriage can also benefit from pastoral guidance. In that way, one would become/remain eligible to receive the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. The priests are always happy to discuss such matters and offer appropriate pastoral assistance. Just give one of us a call or Email in the coming weeks.
- ◆ **Capital Campaign** – We are most grateful that the gifts of generous parishioners to the **Our Faith-Our Family-Our Future** capital campaign have allowed us to go forward during this past Summer with the **replacement** of the antiquated and unpredictable heating system in the school building. The new equipment has been installed and is up and running in the School. Our children and teachers thank you. **Thank you – Holy Family Parishioners!!** Meanwhile, work has been completed on the "connector" between the Rectory and the Church Hall. This will serve as the base for the new HVAC equipment for the Church – scheduled to be installed in the church **next Summer**. Because the pledges have been coming in on a regular basis, we have been able to plan accordingly. **Thank you!**
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your "typical" circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you will need to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*

Immigration:

“Ensuring Access to Lawful Status and Citizenship-Part 1

“So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God’ (Eph 2:19). It is not just about migrants: it is about building the city of God and man.”

–Pope Francis, 105th World Day of Migrants and Refugees (2019)

The work of Justice for Immigrants (JFI) is inspired by and conducted in light of Catholic social teaching, which requires the right to life and the dignity of every human being, including migrants. People migrate for different reasons—protection, family, work, or a combination of these—and the Catholic Church believes that the U.S. immigration system must provide fair, orderly, and stable legal pathways for all these justifications. Yet over 11 million people in the U.S. remain undocumented without a pathway to legal status and many others face obstacles to attaining or maintaining legal status. Therefore, we urge the Biden Administration to take the following actions:

1. Introduce and enact legislation ensuring access to permanent legal status and a path to citizenship: JFI strongly supports the Administration’s proposal to pass a legalization program for undocumented people in the U.S., including Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) recipients, undocumented parents of DACA recipients, Temporary Protected Status (TPS) holders, and undocumented farmworkers. Such legislation is high priority and needs to be introduced within the first 100 days of the new administration. Additionally, we strongly encourage in any legalization effort:

- * Rescind Proclamations 10014 and 10052 in order to restore nonimmigrant work, study, and other visas.
- * Create an earned legal status program for agricultural workers, which includes visa transportability, improved conditions, access to healthcare, and pathways to citizenship.
- * Make the Non-Minister Special Immigrant Religious Workers Program permanent, given that religious workers provide vital services to underserved and vulnerable American communities. A permanent program would better facilitate these essential services, made even more crucial by COVID-19.
- * Protect from deportation, and provide work authorization to, undocumented immigrants serving as essential workers during the COVID-19 pandemic, with a path to citizenship thereafter.”

"MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE **FRANCIS** FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE
54th WORLD DAY OF PEACE

1 JANUARY 2021

A CULTURE OF CARE AS A PATH TO PEACE

Part 1. **At the dawn of a new year**, I extend cordial greetings to Heads of State and Government, leaders of International Organizations, spiritual leaders and followers of the different religions, and to men and women of good will. To all I offer my best wishes that the coming year **will enable humanity to advance** on the path of fraternity, justice and peace between individuals, communities, peoples and nations.

The year 2020 was marked by the massive Covid-19 health crisis, which became a global phenomenon cutting across boundaries, aggravating **deeply interrelated crises like those of the climate, food, the economy and migration**, and causing great suffering and hardship. I think especially of all those who lost family members or loved ones, and all who lost their jobs. I think too of physicians and nurses, pharmacists, researchers, volunteers, chaplains and the personnel of hospitals and healthcare centers. They have made, and are continuing to make, great sacrifices to be present to the sick, to alleviate their sufferings and to save their lives; indeed, many of them have died in the process. In paying tribute to them, I renew my appeal to political leaders and the private sector to spare no effort to **ensure access to Covid-19 vaccines** and to the essential technologies needed to care for the sick, the poor and those who are most vulnerable.

Sad to say, alongside all these testimonies of love and solidarity, we have also seen a surge in various forms of nationalism, racism and xenophobia, and wars and conflicts that **bring only death and destruction** in their wake.

These and other events that marked humanity's path this past year have taught us how important it is **to care for one another and for creation** in our efforts to build a more fraternal society. That is why I have chosen as the title of this year's Message, *A Culture of Care as a Path to Peace*. A culture of care as a way to combat the culture of indifference, waste and confrontation so prevalent in our time...."



The Sunday TV Mass is moving to a new TV channel, and a new time.

The weekly television Mass produced by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland is moving.

Starting on Nov. 22, the Sunday television Mass will be seen at 10 a.m. on WUAB Channel 43, the CW43. This change provides viewers with an opportunity to take part in the weekly celebration of the Mass at a much more convenient time. In addition, WUAB Channel 43 is an over-the-air station that is accessible even to those without cable TV. Those with cable TV need only to check their local cable system listings to determine where WUAB is located on their local channel line-up.

The weekly TV Mass is produced by the Diocese of Cleveland and it originates from the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland. The televised Mass has been a staple of religious programming on Northeast Ohio airwaves for decades, cultivating a dedicated and faithful following. It is hoped that viewers will continue to tune in on this new station at this new, more convenient time.

The TV Mass also can be accessed on demand starting Saturday evening and running throughout Sunday on the Diocese of Cleveland website, dioceseofcleveland.org. In addition, the Mass can be heard on the radio, at 4 p.m. Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. Sundays on AM 1260 The Rock. Also, radio station WINT-1330 AM airs the Mass at 9 a.m. each Sunday and Cox Communications cable subscribers can view the Mass at 11:30 a.m. Sunday on channel 45.


