## *Of Many Things .....*

- ◆ *[Jesus] taught as one having authority and not as the scribes . . . Jesus rebuked [the unclean spirit] and said, "Quiet! Come out of him!"* Mark 1: 21-28

Today's Gospel portrays Jesus as a teacher who possesses an "authority" that is immediately perceived by his hearers as centered in the example of his own compassion and empathy for those he has been called to serve. Such an authority comes not from the power to coerce but from the ability to inspire. **Question for the Car:** How can I accompany others in their journey to know Jesus?

- ◆ **I have been asked by our Bishop** to assume the assignment (in addition to Holy Family) of Administrator Pro-tem of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Norton for the next several months. Fr. Lou Thomas, currently assigned to St. Andrew Parish, is scheduled to undergo liver transplant surgery this Monday, February 1, at the Cleveland Clinic. Fortunately, retired priests living near Norton are able to help with their Mass schedule. Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and I anticipate that one of us will travel to Norton each weekend while the other two remain in Stow. We will cover other needs as they arise. You might recall that we have shared with our sister parishes in a similar way over the years – St. John's in Akron, St. Ann's in Rittman, and St. Mary/Our Lady of Hope in Bedford. I appreciate Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Dennis for helping to make this possible. Please remember Fr. Lou Thomas – and his young live-donor in your prayers during these coming months.
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **Winter Weather Advisory** – Our "senior" parishioners should be cautious about coming to church when the weather is severe – or when the streets and sidewalks are icy. You are not expected to take your life in your hands to fulfill your Sunday obligation (dispensed during COVID). It would be better to pray at home safely – so that you can be healthy enough to attend Mass the following week when the weather is, hopefully, better.
- ◆ **As you know – the wearing of masks in the Church and Chapel is required – both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners.** Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so.
- ◆ **But, I've been vaccinated.** I have been asked whether someone who has been vaccinated will be allowed in church without a mask. I think we'll probably be asking you to wear masks for the foreseeable future. **The issue is not just that you are "safe" – but that the virus particles can still be present in your nose and throat – potentially a risk to others when you breathe, sneeze, or cough.** An expert opinion: *"People who have been vaccinated will be recommended to wear masks until at least the public health emergency is somewhat behind us,"* says infectious disease expert Amesh A. Adalja, M.D., senior scholar at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security. *That means both case counts and deaths will have to decrease significantly; space will also have to increase in intensive care units. "The general public is not going to have access to this vaccine until the summer of 2021. There are still a lot of people who can get infected and die [in the meantime],"* Dr. Adalja says.
- ◆ **Volunteers needed** – Since we started having public Mass once again, the Knights of Columbus have been most helpful acting as **greeters and ushers** for those who are in attendance. We appreciate their service and would like to augment their numbers. We are also interested in knowing whether any of our **EMHCs** are comfortable resuming their ministry at Mass. We are at the point now that having a few more women and men volunteers to call on for this service would be helpful. If you find yourself comfortable with attending Mass in person – **and would be willing to serve as a greeter/usher or EMHC from time to time – please contact Sandy Michaels (330-688-6412, Ext. 250 or [michaels@holyfamilystow.org](mailto:michaels@holyfamilystow.org).**

- ◆ **Snow Days** – Our policy has been in place for many years and continues in force: When the School has been closed on a particular day because of an emergency (snow storm, heat/water failure, etc.) **ALL after-school and evening activities for young people at the Parish (gym, CYO, Scouts, etc.) are cancelled later that day as well.** This allows our maintenance staff to clear the snow, make repairs, or do whatever is necessary for us to re-open as soon as possible. There are also liability issues that need to be taken into account. **Adult activities** (Bible studies, senior meetings, etc.) generally follow the same pattern. That is, they are cancelled if School has been cancelled. In such circumstances, we will try to notify the local TV stations – but this is not always possible. Best to use your good judgment. With problems developing later in the day – again – prudent judgment is called for. Because the priests live on campus, Mass will generally be celebrated as scheduled – but please exercise caution if you plan to attend.
- ◆ **Latin America and El Salvador Collection -- 23-24 January 2021 --** The Latin American Collection will take place on 23-24 January 2021. This is the only appeal made by the Diocesan Mission Office for the Cleveland Latin American Mission in El Salvador. It is the main support for two Diocese of Cleveland priests who work in the two parishes served by our Mission Office. This appeal also makes a contribution to the Collection for the Church in Latin America that is managed by the US Conference of Catholic Bishops and benefits projects and the formation of seminarians, religious and lay leaders in 23 countries across Latin America. Envelopes for this purpose are included in your January packets – and can be submitted throughout the month of January. *Faith Direct* participants can designate a donation online.
- ◆ **Year of St. Joseph** – Pope Francis has proclaimed a special “Year of St Joseph,” beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* (“With a Father’s Heart”), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a tender and loving, obedient father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. This Apostolic Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX’s declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.
- ◆ **2021 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal** -- kicks off in late January with the theme “*Love your Neighbor.*” During the week of 25 January, close to 100,000 households will receive a letter from Bishop Malesic encouraging support for the 2021 Appeal and asking each of us to “help our brothers and sisters in need.” The Appeal goal is \$13.5 million and is needed to continue to serve more than 400,000 people in need. Donations can be made online or by texting CCHOPE to 41444.
- ◆ **Sacramental Marriage** – Couples who may be in a marriage – or may be planning a wedding -- that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church (civil marriage, destination wedding, etc.), might find that now is a good time to consult with one of the priests to see whether that situation can be rectified or considered more carefully. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church’s blessing. Issues involving divorce and remarriage can also benefit from pastoral guidance. In that way, one would become/remain eligible to receive the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. The priests are always happy to discuss such matters and offer appropriate pastoral assistance. Just give one of us a call or Email in the coming weeks.
- ◆ **Capital Campaign** – We are most grateful that the gifts of generous parishioners to the ***Our Faith-Our Family-Our Future*** capital campaign have allowed us to go forward during this past Summer with the **replacement** of the antiquated and unpredictable heating system in the school building. The new equipment has been installed and is up and running in the School. Our children and teachers thank you. ***Thank you – Holy Family Parishioners!!*** Meanwhile, work has been completed on the “connector” between the Rectory and the Church Hall. This will serve as the base for the new HVAC equipment for the Church – scheduled to be installed in the church **next Summer**. Because the pledges have been coming in on a regular basis, we have been able to plan accordingly. ***Thank you!***
- ◆ ***I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you will need to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.***

**Immigration:**

**“Ensuring Access to Lawful Status and Citizenship-Part 2**

“So then you are no longer strangers and sojourners, but you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God’ (Eph 2:19). It is not just about migrants: it is about building the city of God and man.”

**–Pope Francis, 105th World Day of Migrants and Refugees (2019)**

**Prioritize family unity and reunification:**

**Family unity** is a cornerstone of the U.S. immigration system and the teachings of the Catholic Church. Families provide the primary foundation for building individual and community security and wellbeing.

The Biden Administration must establish legal pathways and waivers that **enable families to maintain unity or restore it** for those families already torn apart.

Consequently, we call for:

**Remove the three- and ten-year bars** to lawful immigration. Restore the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA) sec. 212(c) waiver.

Explore a **return-after-deportation program**, the mission of which would be to return people to the U.S. who have already been deported—and pose no community or national security threats—in order **to reunite them** with their families.

Settle the pending TPS litigation to **ensure that TPS status is restored** and extended for TPS holders involved in the litigation.

Encourage legislation to modify the family-based immigration system to clear the current backlogs and **ensure timely family reunification.**

Such reforms would help provide **viable family unity pathways** to lawful permanent residency and citizenship under a forthcoming legalization program or other means.

**“USCCB President's Statement on  
the Inauguration of Joseph R. Biden, Jr.,  
as 46th President of the United States of America**

From Most Reverend José H. Gomez, Archbishop of Los Angeles, President, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, in part:

My prayers are with our new President and his family today.

I am praying that God grant him wisdom and courage to lead this great nation and that God help him to meet the tests of these times, to heal the wounds caused by this pandemic, to ease our intense political and cultural divisions, and to bring people together with renewed dedication to America's founding purposes, to be one nation under God committed to liberty and equality for all.

Catholic bishops are not partisan players in our nation's politics. We are pastors responsible for the souls of millions of Americans and we are advocates for the needs of all our neighbors. In every community across the country, Catholic parishes, schools, hospitals, and ministries form an essential culture of compassion and care, serving women, children, and the elderly, the poor and sick, the imprisoned, the migrant, and the marginalized, no matter what their race or religion. When we speak on issues in American public life, we try to guide consciences, and we offer principles. These principles are rooted in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and the social teachings of his Church. Jesus Christ revealed God's plan of love for creation and revealed the truth about the human person, who is created in God's image, endowed with God-given dignity, rights and responsibilities, and called to a transcendent destiny.

Based on these truths, which are reflected in the Declaration of Independence and Bill of Rights, the bishops and Catholic faithful carry out Christ's commandment to love God and love our neighbors by working for an America that protects human dignity, expands equality and opportunities for every person, and is open-hearted towards the suffering and weak.

For many years now, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has tried to help Catholics and others of good will in their reflections on political issues through a publication we call Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship. The most recent edition addresses a wide range of concerns. Among them: abortion, euthanasia, the death penalty, immigration, racism, poverty, care for the environment, criminal justice reform, economic development, and international peace.

On these and other issues, our duty to love and our moral principles lead us to prudential judgments and positions that do not align neatly with the political categories of left or right or the platforms of our two major political parties. We work with every President and every Congress. On some issues we find ourselves more on the side of Democrats, while on others we find ourselves standing with Republicans. Our priorities are never partisan. We are Catholics first, seeking only to follow Jesus Christ faithfully and to advance his vision for human fraternity and community.

I look forward to working with President Biden and his administration, and the new Congress. As with every administration, there will be areas where we agree and work closely together and areas where we will have principled disagreement and strong opposition.

Working with President Biden will be unique, however, as he is our first president in 60 years to profess the Catholic faith. In a time of growing and aggressive secularism in American culture, when religious believers face many challenges, it will be refreshing to engage with a President who clearly understands, in a deep and personal way, the importance of religious faith and institutions. Mr. Biden's piety and personal story, his moving witness to how his faith has brought him solace in times of darkness and tragedy, his longstanding commitment to the Gospel's priority for the poor — all of this I find hopeful and inspiring.”



## The Sunday TV Mass is moving to a new TV channel, and a new time.

The weekly television Mass produced by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland is moving.

**Starting on Nov. 22, the Sunday television Mass will be seen at 10 a.m. on WUAB Channel 43, the CW43.** This change provides viewers with an opportunity to take part in the weekly celebration of the Mass at a much more convenient time. In addition, WUAB Channel 43 is an over-the-air station that is accessible even to those without cable TV. Those with cable TV need only to check their local cable system listings to determine where WUAB is located on their local channel line-up.

The weekly TV Mass is produced by the Diocese of Cleveland and it originates from the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist in downtown Cleveland. The televised Mass has been a staple of religious programming on Northeast Ohio airwaves for decades, cultivating a dedicated and faithful following. It is hoped that viewers will continue to tune in on this new station at this new, more convenient time.

The TV Mass also can be accessed on demand starting Saturday evening and running throughout Sunday on the Diocese of Cleveland website, [dioceseofcleveland.org](http://dioceseofcleveland.org). In addition, the Mass can be heard on the radio, at 4 p.m. Saturdays and 10:30 a.m. Sundays on AM 1260 The Rock. Also, radio station WINT-1330 AM airs the Mass at 9 a.m. each Sunday and Cox Communications cable subscribers can view the Mass at 11:30 a.m. Sunday on channel 45.


