



Of Many Things

- ◆ **A leper came to Jesus and kneeling down begged him and said, "If you wish, you can make me clean." Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him, "I do will it. Be made clean."** Mark 1: 40-45
 Our attitudes and perceptions can reduce others to "lepers": those we avoid for fear of being caught up in their problems or crises, those who don't "fit" our image of class and decorum, those whose politics or religion or race or gender seem to threaten our own. We exile these "lepers" to the margins of society outside our gates; we dismiss them with simplistic labels and unfair stereotypes; we reject them as too "unclean" to be part of our lives and our world. The Christ who heals lepers comes to heal us, as well, of our debilitating sense of self that blinds us to the sacredness and dignity of those we demean as "lepers," to heal us of our own "leprosy". **Question for the Car:** Do I, perhaps unwittingly, treat another person in my circle as a "leper"?
- ◆ **Lent begins this Wednesday – Ash Wednesday – February 17.**
- ◆ **Our observance of Lent -- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. **Fasting** is expected for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal each day. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. **Abstinence** (from meat and meat products) is expected – on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent -- for all who have reached their 14th year. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is, as an option, continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. **Why do Catholics observe Lent?** Lent is the 40 day period of fasting and prayer which prepares us for the celebration of Easter. At the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., this period of 40 days of fasting and preparation was established. The number "40" may have its origins in the 40-day fast observed by Moses, Elijah, and Jesus. Ash Wednesday was added to begin the fasting period in the 7th century so that 40 days would be achieved, absent Sundays. In recent centuries meat was added except for Fridays. Vatican II shifted the emphasis from the physical suffering to other forms of penance including prayer and works of charity. (From the Modern Catholic Encyclopedia)
- ◆ **Distribution of Ashes in Time of Pandemic (so you can know what to expect on Ash Wednesday, February 17):** The Priest says the prayer for blessing the ashes. He sprinkles the ashes with holy water. Then he addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: "Repent, and believe in the Gospel," or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."
 The Priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the Ashes to those who come to him. **The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything. (Please note that physical contact is avoided omitting marking the forehead.)**
 This method of **distributing ashes by sprinkling is a common practice in other countries**, but is not well known in the United States. It may be helpful to explain this fact to the faithful in order to avoid unnecessary confusion. You should also instruct the faithful present for Ash Wednesday that there is no requirement to physically receive ashes, but they may come forward if they so choose in order to receive them in the manner described above.
- ◆ **Lent Begins February 17 -- Lenten Scripture Reflections** – are available at the entrances of the church. The Rice Bowls are part of the effort of Catholic Relief Services to help us in our awareness of global poverty – and the **Almsgiving** that should be part of our Lenten practice. The Scripture reflections (Word Among Us) can be helpful with our **Prayer** component. When it comes to **Fasting**, we are encouraged to be creative: What can – and should – I live without? You are welcome to take these materials – so as to begin your preparation for Lent.
- ◆ **The annual Collection to Aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe** is held in our parishes each year during February/ March. The collection supports pastoral, educational and construction projects in Central and Eastern Europe and Central Asia, which were formerly under Soviet control. The collection helps to provide a stable future for the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe, a region long suffering spiritual repression and economic hardship. The funds generated focus on repairing and building Church structures, strengthening Catholic education and social services, and assisting in the development of Church leadership to ensure a solid future for the Church. Envelopes for this purpose are in our envelope packets. **Faith Direct** participants are able to designate contributions online
- ◆ **I have been asked by our Bishop** to assume the assignment (in addition to Holy Family) of Administrator Pro-tem of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Norton. **Fr. Lou Thomas**, currently assigned to St. Andrew Parish, underwent **liver transplant surgery on Monday, February 1, at the Cleveland Clinic**. He is now recovering – a process that will take several months – during which time I am responsible for maintaining pastoral ministry at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish. Fortunately, retired priests living near Norton are able to help with their Mass schedule. Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and I anticipate that one of us will travel to Norton each weekend while the other two remain in Stow. We will cover other needs as they arise. I appreciate Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Dennis for helping to make this possible. **Please remember Fr. Lou Thomas – and his donor, Anna, in your prayers during these coming months.**
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.

- ◆ **Facial Coverings and Vaccines** – As it has been since we began publicly-celebrated Masses again in late May, the wearing of masks while in the building is required. Overall, our compliance has been tremendous and I truly thank you for your cooperation! Now that people among us are being vaccinated, I want to address a question that has begun to surface – “I have been vaccinated. Do I have to continue wearing a facial covering or mask in the building?” It is safe to say – Yes! I think we will probably be asking you to wear masks for the foreseeable future. The issue is not only that you are “safe” – but that the virus particles can still be present in your nose and throat – potentially a risk to others when you breathe, sneeze, or cough. An expert opinion: “People who have been vaccinated will be recommended to wear masks until at least the public health emergency is somewhat behind us,” says infectious disease expert Amesh A. Adalja, M.D., senior scholar at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security. “The general public is not going to have access to this vaccine until the summer of 2021. There are still a lot of people who can get infected and die [in the meantime],” Dr. Adalja says. Beyond this, Dr. Marie Kuchinski-Burdick, chair of the Health and Wellness Ministry at St. Joseph Parish (Strongsville) has shared with Fr. Joe Mamich: “the vaccine is protecting you from severe manifestations of the virus. One could still get the virus and be asymptomatic but now be a carrier that can infect others. It will be awhile before many of us are vaccinated and get that ‘herd immunity’”. Here at Holy Family, I am grateful that we are continuing to navigate this pandemic well and hope we will continue to be able to do so. Our continued vigilance not only helps us each personally, but is truly an act of love for our “neighbor”! Thank you again for all that you are doing!
- ◆ **Winter Weather Advisory** – Our “senior” parishioners should be cautious about coming to church when the weather is severe – or when the streets and sidewalks are icy. You are not expected to take your life in your hands to fulfill your Sunday obligation (dispensed during COVID). It would be better to pray at home safely – so that you can be healthy enough to attend Mass the following week when the weather is, hopefully, better.
- ◆ **2020 Catholic Charities Appeal** – Holy Family has shown our traditional generosity. 505 parishioners pledged a total of \$200,381 – 108.45% of our goal of \$184,776!! **Thank you very much!!**

Social Concerns:

“Catholic Leaders Express Hope with President’s Announcement that U.S. Will Rejoin the Paris Agreement on Climate Change JANUARY 21, 2021 BY PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE of USCCB

WASHINGTON – Archbishop Paul S. Coakley of Oklahoma City and Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, respective chairmen of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committees on Domestic Justice and Human Development and International Justice and Peace, and Sean L. Callahan, president and CEO of Catholic Relief Services, have released the following joint statement: “President Joseph R. Biden announced yesterday that the United States will rejoin the Paris Agreement on climate change. It is our hope that the United States will not only seize this challenge to meet the goal of net-zero emissions by 2050, called for by the U.S. bishops in 2017, but also become the global climate leader by implementing successful policies that both preserve the environment and promote economic development through innovation, investment and enterprise. “On the fifth anniversary of the Paris Agreement, Pope Francis called for ‘a culture of care, which places human dignity and the common good at the center.’ The environment and human beings everywhere, especially the poor and vulnerable, stand to benefit from the care of our common home. For this reason, we urge the United States to do more to help poorer nations adapt to the changes in climate that cannot be prevented. “The Second Vatican Council asserted that ‘nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in’ the hearts of Christians. Climate change is a genuine human concern that affects all peoples, and the decision to rejoin the Paris Agreement is an important step in the path of care for the environment and respect for the human family.”

Immigration:

“Administration’s Initial Effort to Reform Enforcement and Protect Families Welcomed By USCCB Migration Chairman

JANUARY 21, 2021 BY PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE of the USCCB

WASHINGTON—On January 20, 2021, President Joe Biden revoked Executive Order 13768 of January 25, 2017 on ‘Enhancing Public Safety in the Interior of the United States’ and implemented a 100-day moratorium on certain deportations, allowing for a comprehensive review of current immigration enforcement policies. Bishop Mario E. Dorsonville, auxiliary bishop of Washington and chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committee on Migration, issued the following statement:

‘Wednesday’s actions by the new Administration are important first steps toward ensuring that immigration enforcement in our country is balanced and humane. Too many people have experienced harsh and heavy-handed enforcement at the U.S.-Mexico border and within the U.S. interior, causing families to be needlessly torn apart. Our Catholic faith recognizes the right of nations to control their borders, but we can still uphold the rule of law without denying refuge to the vulnerable, all while recognizing the importance and necessity of family unity.

‘We pledge to work with the new Administration as it reviews enforcement policies that preserve our national sovereignty and, at the same time, recognize the inherent human dignity of every person, regardless of immigration status.’





This drive was incredibly successful. A big quantity of large and small durable items such as cribs, high chairs, changing tables, car seats and play pens were donated. Many other items such as clothing, diapers, toys and blankets were also collected. The total of all these "goods" took up 4 full truck loads as well as 2 full loads of a large SUV. It's hard to place a dollar value on these items but it's substantial. The help it will provide to young mothers and their new born child is immense. **Please be aware that there is a bin in the LCH for continuing donations to Embrace Clinic that you can utilize anytime.**

Equally important, we collected a grand total of \$2,535 in cash and checks. Of this total, \$1,850 came from donations collected after all the Masses at Holy Family over two recent weekends. In addition, \$325 was received from Council members and \$360 was mailed to us from individuals in the surrounding communities. The love and generosity shown by so many Holy Family parishioners with not only this collection but with all the other activities, events and fundraisers conducted by our Council, is touching and reflective of your caring for all those in need. 
