

Of Many Things

- ◆ **[Jesus] was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them.** Mark 9: 2-10

The challenge of the call to discipleship is to let the love of God transfigure our lives and our world. In dying to our own hopes and expectations, we can “transfigure” our own small piece of the world -- breaking down walls and shattering facades, overcoming the limits of prejudices and labels -- so as to re-create in our time and place, here and now, the God who dwells within us. **Question for the Care:** Where am I called to “transfigure” my world?

- ◆ **Our observance of Lent -- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. **Fasting** is expected for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal each day. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. **Abstinence** (from meat and meat products) is expected – on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent -- for all who have reached their 14th year. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is, as an option, continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. **Why do Catholics observe Lent?** Lent is the 40 day period of fasting and prayer which prepares us for the celebration of Easter. At the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., this period of 40 days of fasting and preparation was established. The number "40" may have its origins in the 40-day fast observed by Moses, Elijah, and Jesus. Ash Wednesday was added to begin the fasting period in the 7th century so that 40 days would be achieved, absent Sundays. In recent centuries meat was added except for Fridays. Vatican II shifted the emphasis from the physical suffering to other forms of penance including prayer and works of charity. (From the Modern Catholic Encyclopedia).
- ◆ **Neighborhood Lenten Communal Penance** – will be held at **Holy Family Church on Sunday, March 21st, at 2:00 p.m.** Several of our neighboring priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All are welcome to participate.
- ◆ **The annual Collection to Aid the Church in Central and Eastern Europe** is held in our parishes each year during February/March. The collection supports pastoral, educational and construction projects in Central and Eastern Europe and Central Asia, which were formerly under Soviet control. The collection helps to provide a stable future for the Catholic Church in Central and Eastern Europe, a region long suffering spiritual repression and economic hardship. The funds generated focus on repairing and building Church structures, strengthening Catholic education and social services, and assisting in the development of Church leadership to ensure a solid future for the Church. Envelopes for this purpose are in our envelope packets. **Faith Direct** participants are able to designate contributions online.
- ◆ **I have been asked by our Bishop** to assume the assignment (in addition to Holy Family) of Administrator Pro-tem of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Norton. **Fr. Lou Thomas**, currently assigned to St. Andrew Parish, underwent **liver transplant surgery on Monday, February 1, at the Cleveland Clinic**. He is now recovering – a process that will take several months – during which time I am responsible for maintaining pastoral ministry at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish. Fortunately, retired priests living near Norton are able to help with their Mass schedule. Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and I anticipate that one of us will travel to Norton each weekend while the other two remain in Stow. We will cover other needs as they arise. I appreciate Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Dennis for helping to make this possible. **Please remember Fr. Lou Thomas – and his donor, Anna, in your prayers during these coming months.**
- ◆ **The Demkee Family Scholarship Fund** of the Catholic Community Foundation will award one \$1,200 scholarship to a student enrolled at the University of Akron or satellite. Applicants must be a parishioner at a Catholic parish in Wayne or Summit County and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Scholarship applications are available online at: www.catholiccommunity.org/grants or call toll free at 800-869-6525 x4080.
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **Winter Weather Advisory** – Our “senior” parishioners should be cautious about coming to church when the weather is severe – or when the streets and sidewalks are icy. You are not expected to take your life in your hands to fulfill your Sunday obligation (dispensed during COVID). It would be better to pray at home safely – so that you can be healthy enough to attend Mass the following week when the weather is, hopefully, better.

- ◆ **Facial Coverings and Vaccines** – As it has been since we began publicly-celebrated Masses again in late May, the wearing of masks while in the building is required. Overall, our compliance has been tremendous and I truly thank you for your cooperation! Now that people among us are being vaccinated, I want to address a question that has begun to surface – “I have been vaccinated. Do I have to continue wearing a facial covering or mask in the building?” It is safe to say – Yes! I think we will probably be asking you to wear masks for the foreseeable future. The issue is not only that you are “safe” – but that the virus particles can still be present in your nose and throat – potentially a risk to others when you breathe, sneeze, or cough. An expert opinion: “People who have been vaccinated will be recommended to wear masks until at least the public health emergency is somewhat behind us,” says infectious disease expert Amesh A. Adalja, M.D., senior scholar at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security. “The general public is not going to have access to this vaccine until the summer of 2021. There are still a lot of people who can get infected and die [in the meantime],” Dr. Adalja says. Beyond this, Dr. Marie Kuchinski-Burdick, chair of the Health and Wellness Ministry at St. Joseph Parish (Strongsville) has shared with Fr. Joe Mamich: “the vaccine is protecting you from severe manifestations of the virus. One could still get the virus and be asymptomatic but now be a carrier that can infect others. It will be awhile before many of us are vaccinated and get that ‘herd immunity’”. Here at Holy Family, I am grateful that we are continuing to navigate this pandemic well and hope we will continue to be able to do so. Our continued vigilance not only helps us each personally, but is truly an act of love for our “neighbor”! Thank you again for all that you are doing!

Social Concerns:

“Administration’s Racial Equity Actions on Housing and Prisons Welcomed by U.S. Bishop Chairmen

FEBRUARY 1, 2021 BY PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE OF USCCB

WASHINGTON – Following recent executive actions to promote racial equity in housing and the criminal justice system, Archbishop Paul S. Coakley of Oklahoma City, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, and Bishop Shelton J. Fabre of Houma-Thibodaux, chairman of the USCCB’s Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism, issued the following statement:

“We welcome the Biden Administration’s actions to promote racial equity. Specifically, the executive order directing the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to examine the effect of repealing the Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing rule is a step in the right direction to restoring needed protections against housing discrimination. Repealing this rule minimized the affirmative responsibility of the government to promote fair housing. The federal government has a critical role to play in overcoming and redressing our nation’s history of discrimination, and we hope the administration follows through on the important work of promoting fair housing and human dignity.”

“We also welcome the new administration’s announcement that the U.S. Department of Justice will not renew contracts with private prisons. The bishops have long questioned the efficacy of private companies running prisons, and this step is a positive development in criminal justice reform. We encourage the administration to consider similar policies in the future regarding civil immigrant detention facilities.”

The USCCB and Catholic Charities USA filed comments in March 2020 calling for the full implementation of the Affirmatively Furthering Fair Housing rule.”

"USCCB Migration Chairman Welcomes Administration's Actions to Rebuild Immigration System, Restore Due Process, and Recognize Human Dignity of Immigrants and Refugees"

FEBRUARY 3, 2021 BY PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE of the USCCB

WASHINGTON—Yesterday, President Joe Biden issued three migration-related Executive Orders related to removing barriers and restoring due process in the legal immigration system. The actions include orders to: (1) address root causes of migration from Central America and expand opportunities for legal migration; (2) create a task force to reunify families separated during the prior administration; and (3) strengthen integration and inclusion efforts for new Americans. Bishop Mario E. Dorsonville, auxiliary bishop of Washington and chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Migration, issued the following statement:

'We welcome these Executive Orders on migration, which will help to ensure that immigrants and refugees are treated humanely and in accordance with their God-given dignity. Actions implemented by the prior administration on these issues have directly impacted and harmed immigrants' and refugees' lives, in many cases needlessly instilling fear and creating or perpetuating family separation. The Catholic Church teaches that each person is created in the image and likeness of God and that we must uphold the inherent dignity of each person. As a society, we must remain consistent in our openness and treatment of all persons, regardless of whether they were born in the United States or immigrated here. We know that changes will take time but applaud President Biden's commitment to prioritize assisting our immigrant and refugee brothers and sisters. We also offer our assistance and cooperation on these urgent matters of human life and dignity.'


