## *Of Many Things .....*

- ◆ **{Jesus said to Nicodemus}: “God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him . . . Whoever lives the truth comes to the light, so that his works may be clearly seen as done in God.”** John 3: 14-21

In his questioning and confusion, in his fears and doubts, Nicodemus is welcomed by Jesus with understanding and compassion. Like Nicodemus, we are all seekers and Christ has assured us of his company on our journey; like Nicodemus, we find ourselves coming to Jesus in the middle of our darkest nights, seeking hope and consolation, direction and comfort — and Jesus neither rejects us nor admonishes us, but welcomes us. **Question for the Car:** When I am troubled like Nicodemus, do I seek out Jesus?

- ◆ **R.C.I.A. -- Please hold in Prayer** – our Candidates for Full Communion (those already baptized) and our Catechumens (those to be baptized on Holy Saturday) – who are entering the last days of their preparation to join us at the Table of the Lord.
- ◆ **Solemnity of St. Joseph** -- This year, the solemnity of **Saint Joseph (March 19)** falls on a Friday. As a solemnity, the requirement to abstain from meat on the Friday’s within the season of Lent is dispensed for that day (see canon 1251). If they chose to make use of this special dispensation, the faithful are encouraged to choose another day during the week March 15-20 to abstain from meat as part of their Lenten observances. We encourage all the faithful to use this solemnity as an opportunity to practice charitable almsgiving, living out the Lord’s command to love our neighbor.
- ◆ **Our observance of Lent** -- **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday** are obligatory days of universal fast and abstinence. **Fasting** is expected for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal each day. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. **Abstinence** (from meat and meat products) is expected – on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent -- for all who have reached their 14th year. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is, as an option, continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection. **Why do Catholics observe Lent?** Lent is the 40 day period of fasting and prayer which prepares us for the celebration of Easter. At the Council of Nicaea in 325 A.D., this period of 40 days of fasting and preparation was established. The number “40” may have its origins in the 40-day fast observed by Moses, Elijah, and Jesus. Ash Wednesday was added to begin the fasting period in the 7th century so that 40 days would be achieved, absent Sundays. In recent centuries meat was added except for Fridays. Vatican II shifted the emphasis from the physical suffering to other forms of penance including prayer and works of charity. (From the Modern Catholic Encyclopedia).
- ◆ **Neighborhood Lenten Communal Penance** – will be held at **Holy Family Church on Sunday, March 21<sup>st</sup>, at 2:00 p.m.** Several of our neighboring priests will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All are welcome to participate.
- ◆ **Catholic Relief Services Rice Bowl** is a faith-in-action program that provides resources for use in parish and school community settings, with complementary materials for families to foster their faith life at home. Through CRS Rice Bowl, US Catholics respond to Pope Francis’s invitation to ‘share the journey’ with members of our human family around the world, and commit our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving to deepening our faith and serving those in need. CRS Rice Bowl contributions support projects that assist the poor both overseas and here in the United States. 75% of CRS Rice Bowl contributions are sent to Catholic Relief Services and help fund development projects overseas that help increase and maintain communities’ access to food. 25% of the contributions fund local poverty and hunger alleviation programs in the Diocese of Cleveland through the Catholic Charities Emergency Hunger and Shelter Fund. CRS Rice Bowl begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021, and ends with Easter Sunday, April 4, 2021. - ◆ **During this Year of Saint Joseph**, the Church has made a plenary indulgence available to all the faithful who satisfy the usual conditions (confession, Eucharist, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, a spirit of detachment from sin, and the intention to gain the indulgence for one’s self or someone in purgatory), as well as perform one of the prescribed works, as follows:

Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Lord’s Prayer, or take part in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on St. Joseph. Following St. Joseph’s example, perform a spiritual or corporal work of mercy. Recite the Holy Rosary with your family or your fiancé. Entrust your daily activity to the protection of St. Joseph. Pray through the intercession of St. Joseph that those seeking work can find dignifying work. Recite the Litany of St. Joseph for Christians who suffer all forms of persecution. Recite any prayer or act of piety legitimately approved in honor of St. Joseph, in particular on March 19, May 1, on the 19th of any month, and every Wednesday. **~continued~**

This gift of a plenary indulgence extends particularly to the elderly, the sick, the dying, and all those who, for legitimate reasons, are unable to leave their homes, if, detached from all sin and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as possible, the usual conditions, recite an act of piety in honor of St. Joseph, comfort of the sick and patron of a good death, offering with confidence to God the pains and trials of their life.

- ◆ **I have been asked by our Bishop** to assume the assignment (in addition to Holy Family) of Administrator Pro-tem of St. Andrew the Apostle Parish in Norton. **Fr. Lou Thomas**, currently assigned to St. Andrew Parish, underwent **liver transplant surgery on Monday, February 1, at the Cleveland Clinic**. He is now recovering – a process that will take several months – during which time I am responsible for maintaining pastoral ministry at St. Andrew the Apostle Parish. Fortunately, retired priests living near Norton are able to help with their Mass schedule. Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and I anticipate that one of us will travel to Norton each weekend while the other two remain in Stow. We will cover other needs as they arise. I appreciate Fr. Andy, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Dennis for helping to make this possible. **Please remember Fr. Lou Thomas – and his donor, Anna, in your prayers during these coming months.**
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **Facial Coverings and Vaccines** – As it has been since we began publicly-celebrated Masses again in late May, the wearing of masks while in the building is required. Overall, our compliance has been tremendous and I truly thank you for your cooperation! Now that people among us are being vaccinated, I want to address a question that has begun to surface – **“I have been vaccinated. Do I have to continue wearing a facial covering or mask in the church building?” It is safe to say – Yes! I think we will probably be asking you to wear masks for the foreseeable future. The issue is not only that you are “safe” – but that the virus particles can still be present in your nose and throat – potentially a risk to others when you breathe, sneeze, or cough.** An expert opinion: “People who have been vaccinated will be recommended to wear masks until at least the public health emergency is somewhat behind us,” says infectious disease expert Amesh A. Adalja, M.D., senior scholar at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security. “The general public is not going to have access to this vaccine until the summer of 2021. There are still a lot of people who can get infected and die [in the meantime],” Dr. Adalja says. Beyond this, Dr. Marie Kuchinski-Burdick, chair of the Health and Wellness Ministry at St. Joseph Parish (Strongsville) has shared with Fr. Joe Mamich: “the vaccine is protecting you from severe manifestations of the virus. One could still get the virus and be asymptomatic but now be a carrier that can infect others. It will be awhile before many of us are vaccinated and get that ‘herd immunity’”. Here at Holy Family, I am grateful that we are continuing to navigate this pandemic well and hope we will continue to be able to do so. Our continued vigilance not only helps us each personally, but is truly an act of love for our “neighbor”. Thank you again for all that you are doing!

#### **“USCCB Chairmen Affirm Administration’s Order Ensuring All Persons Included in Census and Apportionment**

‘We welcome this return to more than a century of American precedent that ensures all residents will be counted and included in the census and apportionment. This return to our previous policy reflects the inalienable truth that all people matter and are imbued with human dignity. In the words of Pope Francis, we are all ‘fellow travelers sharing the same flesh.’

‘While the process of counting persons in the United States for the purposes of apportioning seats in the U.S. House of Representatives has not always been free of injustice—the Three-Fifths Compromise being a noteworthy example—Wednesday’s executive order stands as a testament to the indisputable reality that immigration status does not negate the inherent value of a human life, nor should it undermine any person’s ability to contribute to the growth and wellbeing of our nation. Citizens and noncitizens alike must continue to be recognized as members of the same human family.’



On January 20, 2021, President Joe Biden signed an executive order requiring all U.S. residents to be counted in the U.S. census and reversed the prior administration’s unprecedented policy of excluding undocumented immigrants from the apportionment base. In addition to apportionment of congressional representatives, the decennial census impacts the allocation of hundreds of billions of dollars in federal appropriations for programs designed to uphold human dignity and advance the common good. Archbishop Paul S. Coakley of Oklahoma City, chairman of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, and Bishop Mario E. Dorsonville, auxiliary bishop of Washington and chairman of the USCCB’s Committee on Migration, issued the above statement.”

## TIME TO TAKE ACTION ON THE EQUALITY ACT!

Human dignity is central to what we believe as Catholics. Every person is made in the image of God and should be treated accordingly, with respect and compassion. That means we need to honor every person's right to be free of unjust discrimination.

The Equality Act purports to protect people experiencing same-sex attraction or gender discordance from unjust discrimination. Although this is a worthy purpose, the Equality Act does not serve it. And instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act discriminates against people of faith precisely because of those beliefs. In the process, the Equality Act codifies the new ideology of "gender" in federal law, dismissing sexual difference and falsely presenting "gender" as only a social construct.

### **The Equality Act:**

- exempts itself from the bipartisan Religious Freedom Restoration Act, in an explicit and unprecedented departure from one of America's founding principles, thereby infringing on religious freedom and making it more difficult for individuals to live out their faith
- forces religiously operated spaces and establishments, such as church halls, to either host functions that violate their beliefs or close their doors to their communities
- requires women to compete against men and boys in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower facilities with men and boys
- forces faith-based charities that serve all people to violate their religious beliefs, and threatens the welfare of thousands of beneficiaries of charitable services such as shelters and foster care agencies, by forcing a multitude of them to be shut down
- jeopardizes existing prohibitions on the use of federal taxpayer funds for abortion, likely pressuring or even mandating the performance of abortions by health care providers in violation of their consciences, and ultimately ending more human lives
  - hinders quality health care, by forcing health care professionals, against their best medical judgment, to support treatments and procedures associated with "gender transition."

The Catholic Church is the largest non-governmental provider of human services in the United States, helping millions of Americans in need through its parishes, schools, hospitals, shelters, legal clinics, food banks, and charities. Our core beliefs about the dignity of the human person and the wisdom of God's design motivate both our positions on marriage, life, and sexuality, and our call to serve those most in need and the common good. By running roughshod over religious liberty, the Equality Act directly undermines the Church's ability to fulfill that call.


