## *Of Many Things .....*

- ◆ “[The kingdom of God] is as if a man would scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how . . .
- “It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade.” Mark 4: 26-34
- Today’s Gospel is about those everyday miracles we can work if we possess “mustard seed” faith: the conviction that, in the smallest acts of compassion and generosity, we can transform the most barren stretches of our lives into great gardens of hope and possibility. We may have little or no expectation of a harvest; nurturing what we have planted may be a frustrating and futile undertaking — but Christ calls us to embrace the faith of the Gospel farmer and the hope of the mustard seed: to be willing to plant whatever “seeds” of Gospel hope and compassion we possess, wherever and whenever we can, in the certain knowledge that it will, in some way, result in its own “miracle”: the revelation of the kingdom of God in the everyday blessedness of our lives. **Question for the Car:** Where can I plant a “mustard seed” today?
- ◆ **Some recent points of information:**
    - \* **The Bishops of Ohio** have invited and encouraged those of us who are able to return to the regular “in person” celebration of the Sunday Eucharist. While many of us have felt comfortable doing this for some time now – we recognize that many folks have continued to make use of the “COVID Dispensation” until now. Hopefully, many of our friends have received the vaccine – or have observed the decline in the COVID “numbers” – and will feel comfortable returning on Sundays. As always, the usual dispensation applies for those who are ill, for those caring for someone who is ill, or for other reasonable situations. **Welcome all!**
    - \* Recall that many folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
    - \* **Face masks** are no longer required -- but those who have not been vaccinated or are otherwise vulnerable are strongly encouraged to wear one. I personally plan to continue to wear a mask in the church – in solidarity with those (including children) who have not been vaccinated and with those who are still getting used to returning to church and other crowded situations. I invite others to join me in this gesture of welcome – at least for the next few weeks.
    - \* **Holy water** will once again be available, as will the **Sign of Peace**. If you wish to remain cautious about these, that is your choice. **Social distancing** is relaxed – but we should still respect each other’s “comfort zones”. **Hand sanitizing** is still encouraged. Space will still be available for seating (with Livestreaming) in the Lower Church Hall – if you find the church uncomfortably crowded. **Livestreaming** – for those at home – will continue.
    - \* **Construction** -- Once we begin work (in a couple weeks, hopefully) on the **HVAC systems** in the church, there may be times that some pews may be temporarily unavailable. We will stop the HVAC work briefly when we have a **funeral** – but will generally be unable to make the church available ( as has become more common since COVID) for visitation before the funeral. Funeral directors are aware of this and will work with us.
  - ◆ **Capital Campaign -- As of June 7: 707 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$2,937,982 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$1,905,284 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! Thank you for your support.**
  - ◆ **Thank you** to Pam Nervo and Mary Hird, our Art and Environment Committee, for keeping our altar area nicely decorated during the Lent – Easter – Pentecost Season.
  - ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.

- ◆ **We will “any day now” begin work on this Summer’s phase of the HVAC replacement in the Church.** We have recently accepted a bid (\$878,944.00) for this work – and have now received Diocesan approval to get started. The brick “connector” between the Church and the Rectory was completed last Fall. Most of the equipment for the new HVAC system will be installed on the “roof” of this structure. Ductwork, etc. will be installed throughout the Church and Lower Church Hall. **We expect some disruption – especially on weekdays/workdays in the coming months –** and we will need to be “creative and patient” when it comes to scheduling during the construction period. **We hope to limit disruption over the weekends. We also hope and pray that the “old” AC system will continue to operate until the new system is fully operational.**
- ◆ **Catechists – Thanks** – As the Parish School of Religion and Holy Family School draw to a close for this year, a special **THANK YOU!** to our teachers, catechists, administrators, and all our volunteers who have made our program possible. Thank you to parents for their diligence in making sure that their children participate fully in the religious education programs. Here’s hoping that the children and young people – and their teachers/catechists -- will have a restful Summer. Don’t forget to join us each Weekend for Mass with your families. We might not have classes – but we still have Masses!
- ◆ **Congratulations to our Graduates** – Many of our young people are celebrating transitions this Spring, as they complete various phases of their education – Pre-school, Grade School, High School, College, and Graduate Studies -- and move on to new challenges and adventures. We share their joy as they finish this phase of their lives. *We hope that they will carry God’s love with them wherever they go – and always see Holy Family as a place they can call “Home”.*
- ◆ **Garden Volunteers** – If you would like to “adopt a plot” – one of the 14 gardens scattered around our parish property – please contact **Fr. Rosing**: 330-688-6412, Ext. 215 or [pjrosing@holyfamilystow.org](mailto:pjrosing@holyfamilystow.org) – or **Jim Coudriet**: [jcoudriet@holyfamilyschoolstow.org](mailto:jcoudriet@holyfamilyschoolstow.org). We will be happy to assign you a garden area and arrange for materials and plants.
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you – for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*


**Social Concerns:**

**“Condemnation of Recent Rise in Antisemitic Incidents By President of U.S. Bishops’ Conference and Chairman for Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs**

‘The recent rise in anti-Semitic attacks across the nation is deeply troubling. We cannot remain silent when we witness our brothers and sisters suffering on account of being Jewish, and we will never tire of our commitment to decry every form of hatred, especially those formed in contempt of faith.  
 ‘Any attack on a community or individual on the basis of faith or otherwise is contrary to who we are called to be as the People of God. Pope Francis continually reminds us of our duty to build a culture of encounter by building bridges that transcend differences and divisions (cf. Fratelli Tutti, 215-217). In doing so, we must denounce violence unconditionally and take up dialogue.  
 ‘We remain steadfast in the promise of the Second Vatican Council to decry ‘all hatred, persecutions, and manifestations of antisemitism directed against the Jews at any time by anyone’ (Nostra Aetate, 4). This is integral to the irrevocable friendship we have cultivated and continue to build with our Jewish brothers and sisters.  
 ‘Our prayers are with those who have been harmed. May all people of good will unite in fostering a culture that rejects all forms of hatred, most especially antisemitism.’  
 Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles and president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), and Bishop David P. Talley of Memphis and chairman of the USCCB’s Committee on Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs issued a call for prayers and unity in fostering a culture that rejects all forms of hatred in the above statement.”

## Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation of Mass Effective 5/6 June 2021

The celebration of the Eucharist at Mass is the source and summit of our life and mission as Catholics.

As of March 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, all Roman Catholics throughout the entire Province of Cincinnati, which comprises all six dioceses of Ohio, have been dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. However, with the decrease of cases in our state, the widespread availability of vaccines, and following the guidance of public health officials, we are now able to safely accommodate more parishioners for Masses. Therefore, **effective June 5/6**, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, the **general** dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is hereby lifted throughout the state of Ohio.

Except for the unique situations as described below, those who are otherwise healthy are obliged to return to Sunday Mass by the weekend of June 5-6, 2021:

- \* Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease (including quarantine due to exposure).
- \* Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issue).
- \* Those who are homebound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.
- \* Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.
- \* Those who are caretakers of person who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract Covid virus.

If you have any questions about any specific needs, concerns or protocols, you are urged to contact the parish directly. Your priests, who have the authority to dispense in **individual** cases, may be helpful in addressing individual concerns.

### St. Vincent DePaul Society Report to the Parish-2020

Through this last year of the pandemic the St. Vincent DePaul Society has continued to serve those in need within our Stow and Munroe Falls neighborhoods.

Due to covid-19 the Society’s members suspended home visits. This has not prevented us from continuing our outreach ministry to pay rents and utility bills, purchase groceries, provide essential furnishings and bedding, medicines and made car repairs for those in need.

The Society’s “Help Line” (330-688-6412 Ext 456) remains active with members monitoring messages daily as we stand by to help.

Total funds distributed to those in need this past year was \$29,230 while helping 333 individuals. In addition to direct financial aid, the Society works to refer individuals and families in need of medical and dental care, psychological and consumer counseling, shelter, clothing, furniture and food assistance to appropriate social service agencies throughout Summit County.

**“The Financial Contributions of Dreamers: What the U.S. Economy Stands to Lose**

**Update:** Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) was implemented in 2012. Although the DACA program is safe from elimination for the time being, it is essential that the U.S. Senate act to provide more permanent protection to DACA recipients. Now more than ever it is imperative that the Senate passes legislation that will provide permanent relief to DACA and Dreamer youth. USCCB supports Dreamers and has advocated for the DREAM Act and H.R. 6 the American Dream and Promise Act.

**How much do DACA-eligible immigrants contribute to the U.S. economy?**

DACA recipients bring in billions of dollars to the U.S. economy every year. Currently, DACA youth alone add an estimated \$42 billion to the GDP every year. This means that the positive economic contributions of DACA recipients are almost six times more than the roughly \$7 billion that program costs the United States. If DACA were to be ended in the United States, the loss to the U.S. economy could be as much as \$21 billion.

**What are some of the ways that DACA-eligible immigrants contribute to the U.S. economy?**

**Paying Taxes:** DACA recipients contribute billions of dollars to the economy every year. One of the most common ways is through the paying of taxes. Despite common misunderstanding, undocumented immigrants pay billions of dollars in federal and state taxes. In 2017, the New American Economy found that DACA eligible individuals contributed \$4 billion in taxes for that year - almost \$2 billion of that amount being contributions to state and local taxes.

**Participation in Workforce:** Participation in the workforce is another major way that DACA recipients contribute to the national economy. Most immigrants who receive legal status under DACA are employed in some capacity. As of 2017, the employment rate of DACA-eligible individuals stood at 93%. This rate was 33% higher than that year’s average employment rate for the U.S. population as a whole.

**Creating Jobs:** DACA eligible individuals aren’t only working for other businesses: in 2017, 5% of the DACA eligible population owned their own businesses - a higher percentage than their U.S. born counterparts. The types of employment that DACA recipients pursue cross dozens of disciplines, from agriculture, to education, to healthcare.

**Consumer Spending:** The DACA eligible population also contributes through their spending on goods and services in the U.S. economy. The United States relies on consumer spending to function, as it affects virtually every part of the economy. In 2017 alone, the DACA-eligible population earned 23.4 billion dollars, which translates to 19.4 billion dollars in spending power after taxes.”
