

## *Of Many Things .....*

- ◆ ***“A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house.”*** Mark 6: 1-6

In Baptism, God calls us to be his witnesses, his “prophets” in the spirit of Jesus, to proclaim God’s word. The work of the prophet requires of us a faith that never falters in the conviction that the justice of God will triumph over injustice-- that God’s mercy will triumph over hatred -- that God’s light will triumph over the darkness of sin and death. **Question for the Car:** Am I willing to stand up and proclaim God’s word?

- ◆ **Information and Update regarding Holy Family Parish and the Paycheck Protection Program** -- As we all know, the COVID pandemic significantly changed our daily life in the spring of 2020 in response to the health risk created by COVID-19. Companies and organizations were impacted as staff started to work from home, business activity slowed, and unemployment rose dramatically. You may be aware that the federal government created the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP Program) as a way to provide emergency funding to help organizations pay their employees and normal operating expenses for a six-week period. The goal was to keep as many people as possible employed, support the organizations employing them, and help cushion the economic downturn.

The Small Business Administration (SBA) managed the program and organizations seeking PPP funding submitted detailed applications requesting loans that could range up to six weeks of payroll and operating expenses. A wide range of organizations qualified for PPP funding: companies, professionals, service industries, educational entities, nonprofits, and churches. Holy Family Parish and School were eligible to apply for the PPP program. The business staff of the Parish completed a complicated loan application for approximately six weeks of payroll and operating expenses and submitted it to the SBA with the approval of myself, the Finance Council and the Cleveland Diocese. Our Holy Family PPP loan application was approved and the funds were received in April 2020. The funds from the loan supported six weeks of parish and school payroll and operating expenses through June 2020.

A second part of the PPP program allowed for the loan to be subsequently “forgiven” with no payback required if the loan was properly used and approval obtained from the government. A separate governmental process and application was required to apply for “forgiveness of the loan”. Under the direction of the Cleveland Diocese, the business staff of the parish submitted the application for the forgiveness of the Holy Family loan to the SBA in March 2021. The SBA forgave the total amount of the Holy Family loan in April 2021.

I am grateful for the continuing support and generosity shown by the Parishioners during this past year. This generosity, along with the receipt and forgiveness of the PPP loan is a blessing to the Parish as it helped support the ongoing payroll and operating expenses of the Church and School – allowing us to proceed in a relatively “normal” way during the worst of the pandemic. Because of this, I can say, Our Parish, Our Home, is in a stable financial position and we can move forward with confidence. Additional information regarding the PPP loan and forgiveness will be included in the June 2021 fiscal-year-end financial report to the Parish – to be published, as usual, in the Fall. If you have any questions or would like further information in the meantime, please contact myself, Ed Coia (Operations Manager) or Amy Rich (Business Manager). ***Thank you, Fr. Paul J. Rosing***

- ◆ **Capital Campaign -- As of June 21: 707 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$2,937,982 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$1,954,313 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! *Thank you for your support.***
- ◆ **We will “any day now” begin work on this Summer’s phase of the HVAC replacement in the Church.** We have recently accepted a bid (\$878,944.00) for this work – and have now received Diocesan approval to get started. I am very grateful for your generous response to our Capital Campaign – which allows us to move forward with this project. The brick “connector” between the Church and the Rectory was completed last Fall. Most of the equipment for the new HVAC system will be installed on the “roof” of this structure. Ductwork, etc. will be installed throughout the Church and Lower Church Hall. **We expect some disruption – especially on weekdays/workdays in the coming months – and we will need to be “creative and patient” when it comes to scheduling during the construction period. We hope to limit disruption over the weekends. We also hope and pray that the “old” AC system will continue to operate until the new system is fully operational.**
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.

◆ Some recent points of information:

- \* **The Bishops of Ohio** have invited and encouraged those of us who are able to return to the regular “in person” celebration of the Sunday Eucharist as of June 6. While many of us have felt comfortable doing this for some time now – we recognize that many folks have continued to make use of the “COVID Dispensation” until now. Hopefully, many of our friends have received the vaccine – or have observed the decline in the COVID “numbers” – and will feel comfortable returning on Sundays. As always, the usual dispensation applies for those who are ill, for those caring for someone who is ill, or for other reasonable situations. **Welcome all!**
- \* **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** has suffered from some health troubles recently. Poor circulation in his right leg has led to several corrective surgeries. At this point, he is recovering and anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. Let’s pray for a speedy recovery – And we all say -- **AMEN!!**
- \* **As we return** to fuller attendance at Masses, we need to re-establish and reorganize such ministries as lectors, commentators, servers, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, ushers and hospitality ministers. We plan to have training sessions for each of these ministries during the next couple of months. We hope to welcome back those who may have been unable to serve during COVID – and welcome new volunteers for any of these ministries. Please watch for announcements about sign-ups and training.
- \* Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
- \* **Face masks** are no longer required -- but those who have not been vaccinated or are otherwise vulnerable are strongly encouraged to wear one. I personally plan to continue to wear a mask in the church – in solidarity with those (including children) who have not been vaccinated and with those who are still getting used to returning to church and other crowded situations.
- \* **Holy water** will once again be available, as will the **Sign of Peace**. If you wish to remain cautious about these, that is your choice. **Social distancing** is relaxed – but we should still respect each other’s “comfort zones”. **Hand sanitizing** is still encouraged. Space will still be available for seating (with Livestreaming) in the Lower Church Hall – if you find the church uncomfortably crowded. **Livestreaming** – for those at home – will continue.
- \* **Construction** -- Once we begin work (in a couple weeks, hopefully) on the **HVAC systems** in the church, there may be times that some pews may be temporarily unavailable. We will stop the HVAC work briefly when we have a **funeral** – but will generally be unable to make the church available ( as has become more common since COVID) for visitation before the funeral. Funeral directors are aware of this and will work with us.

Due to the Fourth of July holiday falling on the first weekend of the month we have scheduled July's Rosary recitations for **July 10th and 11th.**

As in the past the prayers will start one half hour before scheduled Mass time.

The Rosary will be prayed in the main church except for the session before the 11:30 Sunday Mass. That session will be held in the daily chapel.

**Social Concerns:**

**“USCCB President and International Justice and Peace Chairman Commend President Biden for Donation of COVID Vaccines to World’s Poorest Countries**

‘As world leaders work together to help bring an end to this pandemic, we are grateful for President Biden’s leadership to aid the poor and vulnerable around the world who remain most at-risk.

‘In his 2021 Easter message Pope Francis said, ‘Vaccines are an essential tool in this fight. I urge the entire international community, in a spirit of global responsibility, to commit to overcoming delays in the distribution of vaccines and to facilitate their distribution, especially in the poorest countries.’ This gesture of global solidarity is timely, responding to those regions with the greatest need, particularly in Africa and South Asia.

‘We encourage the Administration to partner with Catholic and other well established and broad reaching faith-based health care structures throughout the developing world to facilitate and strengthen vaccine distribution as we work together to save and restore lives.’

Archbishop José H. Gomez of Los Angeles, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, chairman of the USCCB’s Committee on International Justice and Peace commended President Biden for his commitment to provide 500 million COVID-19 vaccines to lower-income countries in their statement above. The amount was recently matched by the G-7 nations, bringing the total of vaccines to one billion.”

**Immigration:**

**“U.S. Bishops’ Migration Chairman on the Observance of World Refugee Day**

‘In the face of each refugee, we see the face of Christ, calling us to be a neighbor. It is this—our shared humanity—that should motivate us to respond to those in need, so as to imitate the Good Samaritan in Luke’s Gospel.

‘We know that it will take time for our country to return the refugee program to the historic norms that have come to be expected in its efforts to assist refugees. However, my brother bishops and I remain committed to those who live each day seeking to free themselves from violence, poverty, and persecution. As Catholics, we recall that many in our own community came as strangers. We must never forget that experience, nor the related challenges of integration, which the Church is uniquely qualified to ease.

‘As Pope Francis teaches, ‘Being compassionate means recognizing the suffering of the other and taking immediate action to soothe, heal, and save. To be compassionate means to make room for that tenderness which today’s society so often asks us to repress.’ Today, we possess an opportunity to welcome the refugee with dignity and share the many blessings we enjoy as a country. Let us seize it.’

In advance of this year’s World Refugee Day, Bishop Mario E. Dorsonville, auxiliary bishop of Washington and chairman of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committee on Migration, issued the above statement.

For the last twenty years, World Refugee Day (June 20) has been observed annually in the United States and around the world to increase awareness of the plight of refugees and other forcibly displaced persons. The United States has resettled an all-time low number of refugees during the last three consecutive years.

As restrictions related to the COVID-19 pandemic loosen, together with a revised Presidential Determination for this year, there is now a path for the U.S. Refugee Admissions Program to regain its historical prominence. Currently, the world faces the largest forced migration crisis since World War II, with almost 80 million forcibly displaced people around the world and 25 million refugees among them, around half of whom are children.


