
READINGS FOR NEXT SUNDAY

Of Many Things

- ◆ **[Jesus] rebuked Peter and said, “Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do . . . “Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it.”** Mark 8: 27-35

Today’s Gospel challenges us to think of things like facemasks as “crosses” we take up in the spirit of Jesus to bring healing and peace to Good Friday brokenness. In some of the hardest words he speaks in the Gospel, Jesus reminds his disciples that real discipleship calls us to “crucify” our own needs and comfort for the good of others; to take on, with humility and gratitude, the demanding role of servant to those in need and distress; to intentionally seek the happiness and fulfillment of those we love regardless of the cost to ourselves. Only in “denying ourselves” in imitation of the servanthood of Christ do we experience the true depth of our faith; only in embracing his compassion and humility in our lives do we enable the Spirit of God to renew and transform our world in God’s life and love. **Question for the Car:** Do I resent the “cross” of my facemask – or see it as an opportunity to embrace Christ’s compassion and care for others?

- ◆ **Parish 75th Anniversary** – Holy Family Parish was founded in October, 1946. This year we celebrate the 75th Anniversary of our establishment by Archbishop-Bishop Edward F. Hoban, the Bishop of Cleveland. We are planning an **Anniversary Mass – celebrated by Bishop Edward C. Malesic – at 11:30am on Sunday, November 28, 2021.** All will be welcome to attend.
- ◆ **Some recent points of information:**
 - * **Bishop Malesic has issued the following...** “The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, **I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors.** All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings, especially for those not yet fully vaccinated... Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.”
 - * **R.C.I.A.** – We are currently in the planning stage for the next Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults process – to begin in late September. Please be aware of items we will be posting in the Bulletin in coming weeks. Even more important – please keep aware of folks who might be potential Candidates and Catechumens. Encourage them to let one of the Priests or Barbie Byrne know of their interest.
 - * **Holy Family Parish – Stow – Raises \$169,285 for Catholic Charities Annual Appeal!** Thanks to the generosity of Holy Family parishioners, we are coming close to our parish goal by raising \$169,285 for the 2021 Annual Appeal! We’re thrilled that we have reached 85.05% of our goal (\$188,472) but that does not mean the Appeal is over. Every day, Catholic Charities sees an increase in requests for services and programs that are proven to transform lives. The need continues and we hope your support will also continue. Together, we can make a difference. **Your Support at Work in Summit County:** Trish’s recovery journey began in 2006, but it wasn’t an easy one for her to start. She struggled with her addiction, but despite many setbacks, Trish was able to stay clean. In 2019, Trish began working for Catholic Charities as a peer recovery support specialist at **St John the Baptist Recovery Outreach Center in Akron** where she assists others who are struggling with addiction. “Being a recovery coach is more than just empowering individuals and encouraging them and getting them from point A to point B. It’s about helping them become self-sufficient and teaching them about the resources available in the community -- and then connecting them with those resources and showing them how to use them,” says Trish. Without you, programs like these would not be possible and thousands of people would struggle to find help and hope.  - * **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** continues his recovery at home **following major surgery on July 6.** He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. I was to see them last weekend, and they send their love and gratitude. Let’s pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- **AMEN!!**

- * Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed..
- * **Capital Campaign -- As of August 30: 711 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$2,983,169 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$2,055,078 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! Thank you for your support.**
- ◆ **We are anticipating work on this Fall’s phase of the HVAC replacement in the Church.** We have accepted a bid (\$878,944.00) for this work – and have received Diocesan approval to get started. I am very grateful for your generous response to our Capital Campaign – which allows us to move forward with this project. The brick “connector” between the Church and the Rectory was completed last Fall. Most of the equipment for the new HVAC system will be installed on the “roof” of this structure. Ductwork, etc. will be installed throughout the Church and Lower Church Hall. **We expect some disruption – especially on weekdays/workdays in the coming months** – and we will need to be “creative and patient” when it comes to scheduling during the construction period. **We hope to limit disruption over the weekends. We also hope and pray that the “old” HVAC system – patched and held together with prayer and Duct tape -- will continue to operate until the new system is fully operational.**
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*

**“Emphasis on Ecological Conscience
in Statement for World Day of Prayer for the Care of
Creation**

SEPTEMBER 1, 2021 BY PUBLIC AFFAIRS OFFICE

On the Holy Father’s World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, September 1, 2021, the bishops emphasize developing an ecological conscience, informed by faith, science, and reason that leads to prayer, sound judgment, and action. ‘In his message for the 1990 World Day of Peace, Pope St. John Paul II warned of a ‘profound moral crisis of which the destruction of the environment is only one troubling aspect.’ Twenty-five years later, Pope Francis further developed the important moral dimensions of ecology and its interrelatedness to other human and spiritual concerns in his encyclical, *Laudato si’*. The moral dimension of the ecological crisis demands that each of us cultivate an ecological conscience, one that enables us to see clearly, judge rightly, and act ethically when it comes to the care of ‘our common home.’ Our times require robust consciences, capable of wise discernment in the face of complex moral problems. Pope Francis called for a mature Church, able to respond to our contemporary moral predicaments with the formation of ‘responsible and merciful consciences.’ A mature, merciful and responsible conscience includes, centrally rather than peripherally, the ability to value and address environmental problems. Woe to us if we were to separate ‘the cry of the poor’ from ‘the cry of the earth.’ Faith helps us to face so many looming challenges without becoming discouraged or despondent, and guides us to the ultimate standards of goodness and truth, without which conscience can lose its way. But these challenges also require from us a well-formed reason that can integrate knowledge and information from different secular disciplines. We recall that ‘in fidelity to conscience, Christians are joined with the rest of men in the search for truth, and for the genuine solution to the numerous problems which arise in the life of individuals from social relationships.’ It is a mistake to think that faith alone is sufficient for the Christian life, especially when it comes to complex moral problems that require both faith and reason. We must especially hold reason and conscience to the highest standards. When it comes to the environment, climate change is one of the most serious moral challenges we face.”

"Catholic Charities, Diocese of Cleveland responding to influx of Afghan refugees

Catholic Charities, Diocese of Cleveland is preparing to embrace some of the Afghani refugees and their families who are being evacuated from their country under the Special Immigrant Visa program. Often, these refugees and their families have no place to stay, no money and nothing to eat when they arrive, so the Catholic Charities Office of Migration and Refugee Services assists them. Locally, in the coming weeks, Catholic Charities is preparing to embrace some of these Afghans and their families who are in the SIV program.

MRS has welcomed more than 100 evacuated people from Afghanistan through the SIV program, initiated by the U.S. military in 2009. Many Afghans have worked alongside U.S. troops, diplomats and other government employees as interpreters, cultural advisors and drivers for more than 20 years.

With the U.S. withdrawal from Afghanistan, tens of thousands of Afghan allies and their families have become targets and are in grave danger of retaliation from the Taliban. Now, thousands of evacuated Afghans flee to military bases to save the lives of those who worked side-by-side with U.S. armed forces.

Locally, MRS has been welcoming newly arriving refugees in the Diocese of Cleveland for decades and through different humanitarian crises that cause individuals to flee their homeland for safety.

Catholic Charities officials said that inspired by the Gospel, the organization recognizes the dignity of each person created in the image of Christ by providing a supportive environment. They also celebrate each individual and culture. Building upon the courage, resilience and strength of these newcomers, Catholic Charities seeks to empower them to achieve self-sufficiency and independence.
