Of Many Things

- ◆ **“Because of the hardness of your hearts, [Moses] wrote this commandment . . . “[T]hey are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate.” “ . . . Whoever does not accept the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it.”** Mark 10: 2-16

Marriage demands not perfection but commitment; it requires the hard work of patience, understanding and humility. In every stage of a couple's life, a marriage centered in the love of God always moves beyond “hardness of heart” to embracing God's spirit of generosity and selflessness. In such a marriage, Christ is the ever-present Wedding Guest who makes a couple's simple, everyday life together a miraculous sacrament in which the love of God is revealed to all. **Question for the Car:** Can I enter the Kingdom as a child?

- ◆ **Parish 75th Anniversary** – Holy Family Parish was founded in October, 1946. This year we celebrate the 75th Anniversary of our establishment by Archbishop-Bishop Edward F. Hoban, the Bishop of Cleveland. We are planning an **Anniversary Mass – celebrated by Bishop Edward C. Malesic – at 11:30am on Sunday, November 28, 2021.** All will be welcome to attend.

Some recent points of information:

- * **I was able to have successful surgery on September 22.** It was an appendectomy and removal of a large abscess that had formed in recent weeks and caused considerable concern. Fortunately, everything went smoothly and there was no need for further treatment. I've been recovering without added concern. I would, of course, appreciate your prayers for a good prognosis and peaceful recovery.
- * **I was able to attend the funeral** on Tuesday for our retired **Bishop Anthony M. Pilla.** I have known Bishop Pilla for 60 years -- since he taught me World History at Borromeo Seminary High School – where he was a young priest/teacher and I was a high school freshman in 1961. We have worked together throughout his ministry as our Bishop. I particularly valued his vision that led to the **Church in the City** Initiative and the opportunity I had to collaborate with Bishop Pilla and other diocesan leaders in the writing and implementation of that vision. He's been a wonderful mentor and cherished friend. May he rest in God's peace.
- * **Bishop Malesic has issued the following...** “The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, **I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors.** All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings, especially for those not yet fully vaccinated... Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.”
- * **R.C.I.A.** – We are currently in the planning stage for the next Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults process – to begin in late September. Please be aware of items we will be posting in the Bulletin in coming weeks. Even more important – please keep aware of folks who might be potential Candidates and Catechumens. Encourage them to let one of the Priests or Barbie Byrne know of their interest.
- * **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** continues his recovery at home **following major surgery on July 6.** He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. I was to see them last weekend, and they send their love and gratitude. Let's pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- **AMEN!!**
- * Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed..
- * **Capital Campaign -- We have GREAT NEWS !! A recent pledge has "put us over the top" as far as Pledges toward our goal -- and payments on pledges continue to be strong. As of September 20: 713 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$3,043,375 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$2,110,788 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! Thank you for your support.**

- ◆ **Progress is being made on the HVAC replacement in the Church.** So far, considerable work has been done in the Lower Church Hall – electrical connections, removal of the old system, etc. The brick “connector” between the Church and the Rectory was completed last Fall. Most of the equipment for the new HVAC system was installed on the roof of this structure last week. Ductwork, etc. will be installed throughout the Church and Lower Church Hall in the coming weeks. **We expect some disruption – especially on weekdays/workdays in the coming months** – and we will need to be “creative and patient” when it comes to scheduling during the construction period. **We hope to limit disruption over the weekends. We also hope and pray that the “old” HVAC system – patched and held together with prayer and Duct tape -- will continue to operate until the new system is fully operational.**
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.**

October is the Month of the Rosary

The Rosary is a key part of Catholic prayer life, and it has been since it was given in its present form to St. Dominick in the twelfth century.

The liturgical **feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7.** It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V (1504-1572) in the year 1571 and October has been dedicated as the Month of the Rosary.

October is the Month of the Rosary and for the third year our parish is holding a celebration. We will be praying the Rosary before each Mass in October.

The Saturday dates are: October 2nd; October 9th; October 16th, October 23rd and October 30th.

The Sunday dates are: **October 3rd, October 10th, October 17th, October 24th and October 31st.**

Immigration:

“Tell Congress to Support our Brothers and Sisters in Afghanistan!”

USCCB Department of Justice, Peace and Human Development Action Alert

At the start of 2021, half the population of Afghanistan—including more than 4 million women and nearly 10 million children—already needed humanitarian assistance. More than 500,000 people have been displaced since the end of May, and those numbers continue to rise. Thousands of people who have worked as interpreters, translators, and in other capacities alongside the United States military, government personnel, and contractors over the past twenty years, including Special Immigrant Visa (SIV) applicants, find themselves and their families in danger. USCCB staff, Catholic Relief Services, Catholic Charities, and others are working to ensure safe passage for as many evacuees as possible, including assisting up to 30,000 people with resettlement in the United States.

The United States must remain committed to the people of Afghanistan and continue to support credible, accountable humanitarian efforts that benefit these millions of vulnerable people.

Bishop chairmen of the Committee on Migration and the Committee on International Justice and Peace urged prayer and support for the Afghan people and refugees in their recent statement. ‘We know that time is of the essence to help our brothers and sisters in need, and we call on our government to act with the utmost urgency, considering all available avenues to preserve life.’

Take action now to urge Congress, in discussions with the Administration, to ensure that robust and flexible funding be provided through respected and credible organizations with experience in Afghanistan. We must help people who remain in Afghanistan and Afghans being resettled.”



Due to the pandemic, the St. Bernard’s clothing drive **WILL NOT begin in October.** St. Bernard’s is still conducting ‘to go’ meals and attendance at these is only about 50 people. Typical indoor meals averaged 250 – 300. Also, shoes, boots, hats, gloves and socks can be dropped off in the LCH St. Bernard’s wooden bin. **PLEASE NO CLOTHING.** I have no place to store it and large quantities are just not needed at this time. Three Vaccinations You Need

October Health Bulletin News Letter

Getting vaccinated against the virus that causes influenza, pneumonia and Covid-19 will help protect you against heart attack and stroke.

Flu season is around the corner, so why not schedule your annual flu shot now? It's particularly important if you are older or have cardiovascular disease (CVD) or lung disease.

If you have not received the Covid-19 vaccine, a flu shot should be high on your list to prevent you from becoming infected simultaneously with the influenza and SARS-Covid -2 viruses,

"The flu shot doesn't protect against all strains of circulating influenza virus in any given year, but it will prevent about half of flu cases and lessen the severity of the illness, should you get it," says Cleveland Clinic preventive cardiologist Leslie Cho, M.D.

Why Should You Care

Being infected with the influenza virus causes body wide inflammation. Swollen lung tissue can make breathing difficult, lowering blood oxygen levels and stressing the heart. This can cause or worsen heart failure, or trigger a heart attack or transient ischemic attack (TIA), also known as a mini-stroke. Receiving the flu vaccine helps prevent these events from occurring.

In 2020, researchers looking for flu vaccination rates in patients at high risk for flu found that those who received the vaccine had a 28% lower risk of heart attack, a 47% lower risk of TIA and a 73% lower risk of dying the following year.

Protection against pneumonia

The annual flu shot will not protect you against the pneumonia virus that causes pneumonia. This requires being vaccinated once in your lifetime with the Prevnar 13 (or Prevnar 20) and/or Pneumovax 23.

Pneumonia, like influenza, is a major killer of older adults. Studies have found that patients with heart failure, particularly heart failure with preserved ejection fraction, are three times more likely than the average adult to get pneumonia and four times more likely to die from it.

Covid-19 Vaccination a "Must"

Recent studies confirmed COVID-19 is an independent risk factor for heart attack and stroke. These risks increase by eight-and six-fold, respectively, the first week after contracting the virus. Patients with CVD or its risk factors, particularly obesity, diabetes, hypertension or history of smoking, are at increased risk of catching COVID-19 and developing severe symptoms, particularly if they are older.

After COVID-19, many people have persistent symptoms that suggest ongoing heart involvement, including chest pain, breathlessness, fatigue and palpitations.

" I strongly urge patients with heart disease or it's risk factors to be vaccinated against COVID-19 and pneumonia and to take advantage of the annual flu vaccine," says Dr. Cho. "These are additional tools for preventing serious complication of CVD in people who are already at increased risk"


