

Of Many Things

- ◆ **“The first [of all the commandments] is this: *You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.* The second is this: *You shall love your neighbor as yourself.* There is no other commandment greater than these . . .** Mark 12: 28-34

We are more than just an entry on God’s spreadsheet. Every human life is a revelation of the love of God in our midst. We have to possess the openness of heart to listen to each other’s stories; we have to see one another as God sees us. That requires a very different logarithm than the one we too often use: that another’s “worth” is determined by what they can do for us, that another’s value is measured by how we can use them for our own ends. Love that is total and complete is the true “measure” of our worth and the realization of the kingdom of God here and now. It’s in the compassion and kindness extended to others that our humanity most resembles God; it’s in the respect and honor in which we hold others that we most praise the God of love; it’s in acts of charity and selflessness that we mirror the love of God in our midst. **Question for the Car:** Is there someone whose story I should hear?

- ◆ **Parish 75th Anniversary** – Holy Family Parish was founded in October, 1946. This year we celebrate the 75th Anniversary of our establishment by Archbishop-Bishop Edward F. Hoban, the Bishop of Cleveland. We are planning an **Anniversary Mass – celebrated by Bishop Edward C. Malesic – at 11:30am on Sunday, November 28, 2021.** All will be welcome to attend.
- ◆ **Some recent points of information:**
 - * **Beginning Monday** -- and for the next several weeks -- weekday Mass will be held in the Weekday Chapel rather than the Church. Adoration will be suspended during Mass time and resumed after Mass. This is necessary to accommodate construction work in the Church proper. Please be aware of construction materials in the Northwest corner of the Church -- and scaffolding that will be installed this week -- and exercise caution. Thank you.
 - * **As I continue my recovery** from recent surgery, I am very grateful for the many prayers, cards, and messages of support you have sent my way during this time. Thank you for your concern and well wishes. Let us pray together for all the sick. You may be aware that Fr. Joe Mamich (our Parochial Vicar 2006-2010) has had a case of COVID – even after getting the booster vaccine! His recovery has been slow – with some setbacks – including pneumonia and oxygen issues. He appreciates our prayers.
 - * **Co-op Nursery???** -- Prior to the COVID shutdown, we had a thriving cooperative nursery functioning during the mid-morning Mass. Parents took turns supervising the toddlers during Mass in Room 2 of the Lower Church Hall. As with many other programs, this needed to be suspended during the pandemic. I am wondering if current parents would be interested and comfortable resuming this service during the 9:00am Mass. Please let me know – pjrosing@holymfamilystow.org – if you are interested.
 - * **All Souls Day Envelopes** -- will be found in our October envelope packets. They relate to the long-standing Catholic custom of remembering our beloved deceased during the month of November -- the Month of All Souls. You are encouraged to list those whom you wish to remember on the back of the envelope and turn it in by November 1st. It is our parish custom to bring these envelopes to our Masses during November -- and have them serve as a reminder to include your deceased loved ones in our prayers. An offering may be included -- but is, of course, *never required*.
 - * **Capital Campaign -- As of October 25: 713 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$3,041,864.59 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$2,155,950.50 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! Thank you for your support.**
 - * **Bishop Malesic has issued the following...** “The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus is surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, **I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors.** All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings. Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.”

- * **Prayers for Deacon John Green** – who must have shoulder surgery this week. **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** continues his recovery at home **following major surgery on July 6**. He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. Let's pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- **AMEN!!**
- * Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
- ◆ **Progress is being made on the HVAC replacement in the Church.** So far, considerable work has been done in the Lower Church Hall – electrical connections, removal of the old system, etc. The brick “connector” between the Church and the Rectory was completed last Fall. Most of the equipment for the new HVAC system was installed on the roof of this structure recently. Ductwork, etc. will be installed throughout the Church and Lower Church Hall in the coming weeks. **We expect some disruption – especially on weekdays/workdays in the coming weeks** – and we will need to be “creative and patient” when it comes to scheduling during the construction period. **We hope to limit disruption over the weekends.** Please try to avoid the scaffolding – and the “staging area” for equipment and supplies located in the Northwest corner of the Church.
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will be happy to arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*
- ◆ **Holy Family School – A “Blue Ribbon School of Excellence”:** Parents of school age — or pre-school age — children are encouraged to consider Holy Family School for their children. October is the Month of the Rosary

The Rosary is a key part of Catholic prayer life, and it has been since it was given in its present form to St. Dominick in the twelfth century.

The liturgical **feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on October 7**. It was instituted to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary by the faithful.

The feast was introduced by Pope St. Pius V (1504-1572) in the year 1571 and October has been dedicated as the Month of the Rosary.

October is the Month of the Rosary and for the third year our parish is holding a celebration. We will be praying the Rosary before each Mass in October. The Saturday dates are: October 2nd; October 9th; October 16th, October 23rd and October 30th.

The Sunday dates are: **October 3rd, October 10th, October 17th, October 24th and October 31st.**

Holy Family is planning a celebration. We will pray a different set of mysteries each Sunday

- The Joyful mysteries on October 2nd & 3rd
- The Luminous Mysteries on October 9th & 10th
- The Sorrowful Mysteries on October 16th & 17th
- The Glorious Mysteries on October 23rd & 24th
- The Glorious Mysteries on October 30th & 31st

As in the past the prayers will start one half hour before scheduled Mass time.

The Rosary will be prayed in the main church except for the session before the 11:30 Sunday Mass. That session will be held in the daily chapel.

Immigration:

Voices of Afghanistan: A USCCB Migration and Refugees Services awareness project

USCCB's Migration and Refugee Services has been coordinating with Princeton’s Office of Religious Life on the role that religion plays in the lives of resettled refugees and during their integration process. Of further interest is how local communities use religious language, ideas, symbols to both welcome refugees but also to resist their resettlement. An important aspect of this project is the collection of oral histories. USCCB/MRS and its Princeton partner have launched

a “Voices of Afghanistan” focus, at <https://religionforcedmigration.princeton.edu/voicesofafghanistan>, which highlights the oral histories that we have gathered from this particular population. If you have networks that might be interested, please do pass along this project and link.



Voices of Afghanistan

You have heard the stories of Afghans through media outlets. Here is an opportunity to hear their stories firsthand.

In partnership with Princeton University’s Office of Religious Life, USCCB/MRS is engaged in the Religion and Resettlement Project, which aims to better understand and respond to the role that religion plays in the lives of refugees as they resettle and integrate into the United States. Central to this effort is an oral history project that traces the experiences of refugees and those who help them.

Voices of Afghanistan features oral history interviews with Afghan refugees who shared their experiences with us including reflections on work with the US military, gender in Afghanistan, religious identities and persecution, conditions of their families in Afghanistan, resettling in the US, employment, education, and much more. Some arrived years ago and some more recently.

They all have a story to tell. Please take a moment and listen to them tell it.

Social Concerns:

The Catholic Diocese of Cleveland began its synodal process with a Mass celebrated by Bishop Edward Malesic on Oct. 17 in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. The Vatican announced the Synod on Synodality to listen, as the entire people of God, to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the worldwide Church. The theme for the synod is 'Towards a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission.' Following the opening liturgy, all baptized persons and others will be invited to participate in the process of listening, dreaming and discerning God's call for the Church.

A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, 'journeys together.' The fundamental questions to be answered are: How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your local church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together?' In responding to these questions, we are invited to recall our experiences: What experiences do these questions call to mind? What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited? We are also invited to share what we've learned: Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy

Spirit resound? What is the spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for changes, the steps to be taken? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

The Synod on Synodality is a call to conversion for the Church, to become more Christ-like in communion, participation and mission of all her members. Pope Francis is reminding us that we're journeying together to the Promised Land, and he wants to be certain that everyone is invited. We look forward to experiencing the fruits of the Holy Spirit as we journey together to learn what is on the minds and in the hearts of the people of the Diocese of Cleveland.

'We are a pilgrim people, a community of believers on the way to the Father together. How we get there with one another as a Church is the focus of this synodal process,' said Bishop Malesic. 'My prayer is that with the Holy Spirit to guide us, what flows from this synod will preserve the fire of faith in Jesus Christ as our savior through the ages.'
