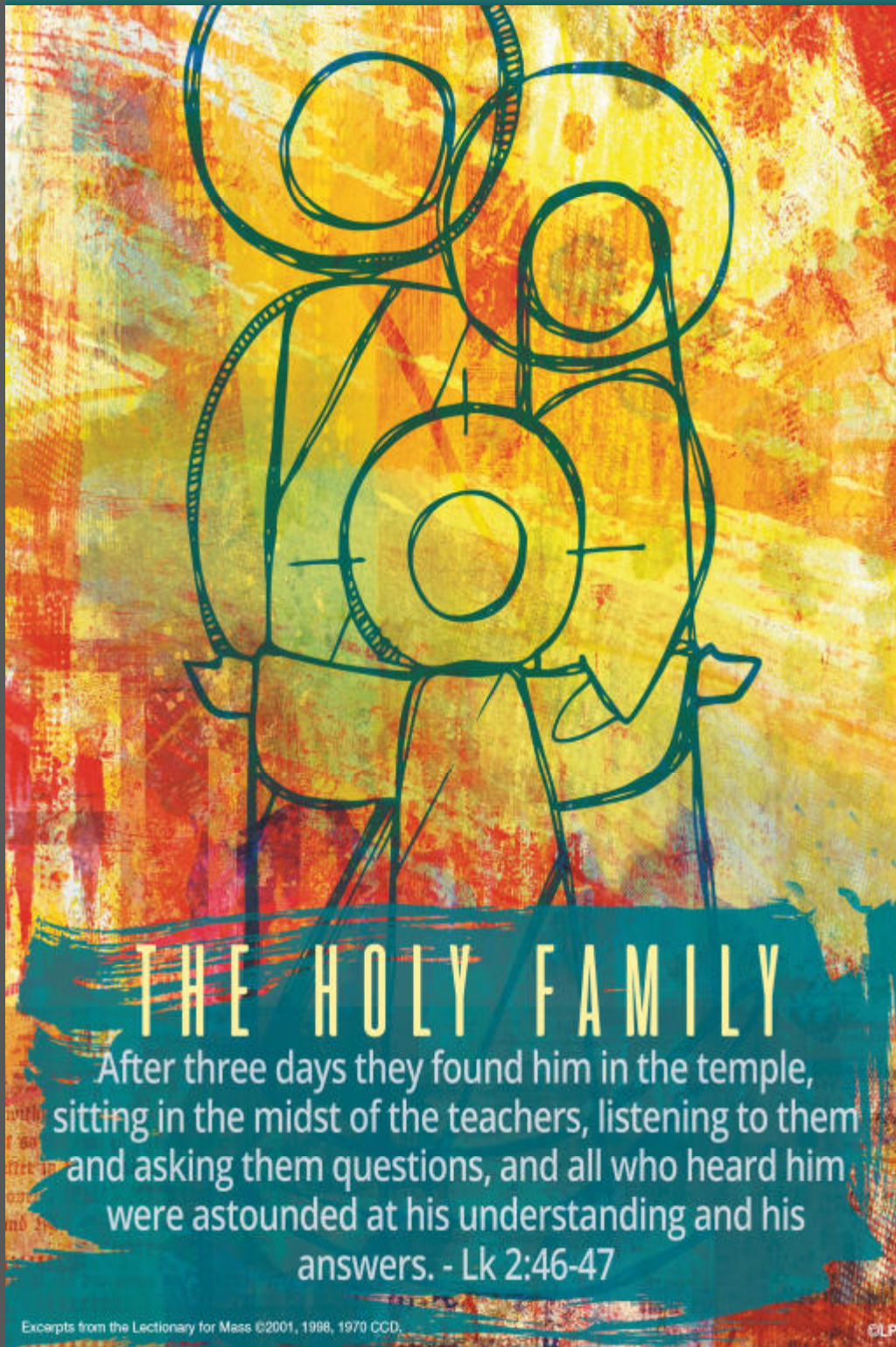

- ◆ **After three days [his parents] found [Jesus] in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers . . .** Luke 2: 41-52

- ◆ **Wishing a Blessed and Happy Christmas to all of our Parishioners and Visitors – and to all whom you hold dear.** *May the simplicity of our Savior's birth in the village of Bethlehem fill us with awe and transform our lives. All of us at Holy Family – Fr. Gonzalez, Fr. Denk, Deacon Green, the Pastoral Staff and Office Staff, and our Holy Family School Community – all join me in wishing you Christ's Peace. Fr. PJR*
- ◆ **This Bulletin serves us for both** the Feast of Christmas – December 24 and 25 – and the Feast of the Holy Family – December 26. Please enjoy reading it whenever you are with us this weekend. Because of early deadlines, some information will be delayed until the next Bulletin.
- ◆ **Welcome!! — to everyone joining us this weekend.** We are happy to come together as a family to celebrate the Christmas Feast. Many come from some distance to be with family and friends — many others come from nearby. Whether we last were together a few days ago — or five years ago — it is great that you are here with us today! A special welcome to our young people home from college or military service — or new jobs (and new lives) located far away. We celebrate all of God's People. ***If anything troubling has kept you away from church for a while, we pray for continued healing — and offer our willingness to help if we can. Our Staff members will always be happy to meet with you, if you would find this helpful.*** Let us all make the celebration of the **Sunday Eucharist** a priority in our lives during 2022.
- ◆ **A Sincere Thank You** – to our helpers who have strung the Christmas lights around the outside of the church. **Thank you, as well,** to the volunteers who worked so hard decorating the inside of our church building. Take a moment to visit the manger scene, to enjoy the lights and poinsettias, and savor the quiet and peace.
- ◆ **Sacramental Marriage** – Couples who may be in a marriage – or may be planning a wedding -- that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church (civil marriage, "destination" wedding, etc.), might find that now is a good time to consult with one of the priests to see whether that situation can be rectified or considered more carefully. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church's blessing. Issues involving divorce and remarriage can also benefit from pastoral guidance. In that way, one would become/remain eligible to receive the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. The priests are always happy to discuss such matters and offer appropriate pastoral assistance. Just give one of us a call or Email in the coming weeks.
- ◆ **Educational options for local families** are available like never before. The **Educational Choice Scholarship (EdChoice)** Program provides students from under-performing public schools the opportunity to attend participating private schools. **Holy Family School is an EdChoice and EdChoice Expansion Provider.** We would be delighted to provide a well-rounded, Faith-based education for your child. Students eligible to enter kindergarten for Fall 2022 who would be assigned to one of the designated public schools -- or students in grades 1-7 who are attending a public school in their resident district who will be assigned to one of the designated public schools for the upcoming school year -- are eligible to apply. Please note: In order to receive this scholarship, a student must be NEW to Holy Family School. The traditional EdChoice scholarship for the 2021-2022 school year paid up to \$5500 towards tuition. Traditional EdChoice scholarship recipients are required to pay the remaining balance (if any) to the school. **Holy Family School begins registering students in late January. The EdChoice application period is scheduled to open in February.** If you are interested in more information regarding this opportunity – or would like to tour our School -- please contact Katrine Franklin at 330.688.6412 ext. 314 or kfranklin@holyfamilyschoolstow.org .
- ◆ **Catholic Charities – 2021 – From the Campaign Office:** "This November, our Diocesan Campaign exceeded our 2021 goal and raised over \$385,000, putting us at **more than \$13.5 million raised** for the 2021 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal throughout the Diocese. **Locally, Holy Family -- Stow, has 459 parishioners pledging \$189,286 (with \$180,264 paid on pledges so far) – 100.43% of Holy Family's goal of \$188,472!! Congratulations!!**

"We are so appreciative of the support from all our parishes and especially the efforts of Holy Family Parish – Stow, this year. Together, we are making a difference for the families who are struggling to keep food on the table, to the migrants looking for a safe place to call home, to the addicts fighting to stay sober, and to the disabled who feel isolated. **On behalf of those we serve...thank you!!**"
- ◆ **As you know – the wearing of masks in the Church and Chapel is strongly requested at Holy Family – both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners.** Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so. Fr. Pjr

- ◆ **Bishop Malesic has issued the following communication...** “The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta and Omicron variants of the COVID-19 virus are surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, I **strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors.** All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings. Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.”
- ◆ **Please be careful when receiving Communion** – not to drop the Eucharistic Host. If trying to manage moving your mask while receiving Communion is difficult, we would suggest lowering your mask before stepping forward to receive. Please consume the Host immediately as you step to the side. You should not keep the Host in your hand as you return to your pew.
- ◆ **Annual Diocesan Mass for Life** | January 21, 2022, 10am | Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. In addition to the annual Mass, there will be two contests for school-aged children; details and advertising materials are available on our [website](#). We kindly ask that you **register** online to attend so that we can plan accordingly. Contact **Mary von Carlowitz** with questions.
- ◆ **Protecting God's Children** --The Diocese of Cleveland's “Protecting God’s Children” program is a continuing effort to instruct and inform everyone about the protection of children from sexual abuse. To report any past or present suspected inappropriate behavior toward children by priests, deacons, religious, lay ecclesial ministers or personnel associated with the Church, please contact the Diocesan Response Service Office at 216-334-2999 or via email at response_services@dioceseofcleveland.org. You are also asked to immediately inform local authorities about inappropriate behavior.
- ◆ **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** continues his recovery at home **following major surgery in July**. He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. Let’s pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- **AMEN!!**
- ◆ Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will be happy to arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **Year-End Giving** -- In this season of giving, consider making a year-end gift to our parish in gratitude for all the blessings you have received in life. As you plan to make the most of your charitable donations in 2021, know that we gratefully accept gifts of cash and appreciated assets such as stocks or bonds. We wanted to take this time to remind you of some important CARES Act provisions that are scheduled to expire at year’s end. These provisions may affect you—and even make it easier for you to make a gift to your parish. They include:
 - * An expanded charitable giving incentive that allows taxpayers who take the standard deduction to make up to \$300 in charitable cash contributions for single filers (\$600 for married couples) to qualified charities like ours this year.
 - * For those who do itemize their deductions, the law allows for cash contributions to qualified charities such as ours to be deducted up to 100% of your adjusted gross income for the 2021 calendar year.

And, if you are 70 ½ or older, you may be able to make a gift of a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA that will help us in our ministry and reduce your taxable income. Talk to your advisors and IRA administrator for more information and to be sure that your IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution gift is made directly from an IRA to a qualified charity such as our parish. - ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*

“After the Angelus on Sunday, 28 November 2021, in Saint Peter's Square, the Holy Father Pope Francis continued:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Yesterday I met members of associations, groups of migrants, and people who share their journey with a spirit of fraternity. They are here in the Square with that large banner! Welcome!

But how very many migrants are exposed, even during these days, to great dangers, and how many lose their lives at our borders! I feel sorrow hearing the news about the situation in which so many of them find themselves. I think of those who died crossing the English Channel, those on the borders of Belarus, many of whom are children, and those who drown in the Mediterranean. There is so much sorrow when thinking about them. Of those who are repatriated to North Africa, they are captured by traffickers who turn them into slaves: they sell the women and torture the men... I think of those who, also this week, have tried to cross the Mediterranean seeking a better land and find instead their grave there; and so many others.

I assure my prayers to the migrants who find themselves in these crisis situations. Know also that from my heart I am always close to you, in prayer and action. I thank all the institutions both of the Catholic Church and elsewhere, especially the national Caritas agencies and all those who are committed to alleviating their suffering. I renew my heartfelt appeal to those who can contribute to the resolution of these problems, especially civil and military authorities, so that understanding and dialogue may finally prevail over any kind of instrumentalization and guide the will and efforts towards solutions that respect the humanity of these people. Let us remember migrants, their suffering, and let us pray together in silence... (moment of silence).”

ANGELUS

*Saint Peter's Square
Sunday, 28 November 2021*

Dear brothers and sisters, *buongiorno!*

The Gospel of today's liturgy, the First Sunday of Advent, speaks to us about the Lord's coming at the end of time, with bleak and distressing events. But precisely at this point **He invites us not to be afraid**. Why? Because everything will be okay? No, but **because He will come**. Jesus will return as He promised. This is what he says: "**Stand erect and raise your heads** because your redemption is at hand" (Lk 21:28). It is nice to hear this encouraging Word: stand up straight and raise our heads because right during those moments when everything seems to be coming to an end, the Lord comes to save us. We await Him with joy, even in the midst of tribulations, during life's crises and the dramatic events of history.

But how do we raise our heads and not become absorbed with difficulties, suffering and defeat? Jesus reminds us: "Beware that **your hearts do not become drowsy**... Be vigilant at all times and pray" (Lk 21:34, 36). "Be vigilant": *vigilance*. From the words of Christ, we see that vigilance is tied to alertness: be alert, do not get distracted, that is, stay awake! Vigilance means this: **not to allow our hearts to become lazy or our spiritual life to soften into mediocrity**.

Be careful because **we can become "sleepy Christians"** – and we know there are many Christians who are asleep, who are anesthetized by spiritual worldliness - Christians without spiritual fervor, without intensity in prayer, without enthusiasm for mission, without passion for the Gospel; Christians **who always look inwards, incapable of looking to the horizon**. **And this leads to "dozing off"**: to move things along by inertia, to fall into apathy, indifferent to everything except what is comfortable for us. This is a sad life going forward this way since there is no happiness. We need to be vigilant so that **our daily life does not become routine, and**, as Jesus says, so **we are not burdened by life's anxieties (cf. v. 34)**. So today is a good moment to ask ourselves: what weighs on my heart? What weighs on my spirit?

What makes me go to sit in the lazy chair? It is sad to see Christians "in the armchair"! What are the mediocrities that paralyze me, the vices that crush me to the ground and prevent me from raising my head? And regarding **the burdens that weigh on the shoulders of our brothers and sisters, am I aware of them or indifferent to them?** These are good questions which *guard our hearts against apathy*. Apathy is a great enemy of the spiritual life and also of Christian life. Apathy is a type of laziness that makes us slide into sadness, it **takes away zest for life and the will to do things**. It is a negative spirit that traps the soul in apathy, robbing it of its joy.... Guard your heart: that means to be vigilant! Stay awake and guard your heart.

And let us add an essential ingredient: **the secret to being vigilant is prayer....** Prayer is what keeps the lamp of the heart lit. This is especially true when we feel that **our enthusiasm has cooled down**. **Prayer re-lights it**, because it brings us back to God, to the center of things. **Prayer reawakens the soul from sleep and focuses it on what matters**, on the purpose of existence. **Even during our busiest days**, we must not neglect prayer.... For example, during Advent, we could **make a habit of saying, "Come, Lord Jesus."**... Let us repeat this prayer all throughout the day: the soul will remain vigilant! "Come, Lord Jesus", is a prayer we can all say together three times. "Come, Lord Jesus", "Come, Lord Jesus", "Come, Lord Jesus".

And now we pray **to the Madonna: may she who awaited the Lord with a vigilant heart** accompany us during our Advent journey." From Vatican.va
