

 "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." Luke 3: 15-16, 21-22

- If anything troubling beyond COVID-19 -- has kept you away from church for a while, we pray for continued healing
 — and offer our willingness to help if we can. Our Staff members will always be happy to meet with you, if you would
 find this helpful. Let us all make the celebration of the Sunday Eucharist a priority in our lives during 2022.
- Your Christmas Generosity has been truly remarkable this year. Because of early Bulletin deadlines, a full report will be posted in next week's Bulletin. Thank you and may God bless you.
- Heart of a Shepherd Thank You to several parishioners who have already responded quite generously to my "Heart of a Shepherd" letter which I sent just before Christmas. I deeply appreciate your willingness to help us with our parish commitment to this worthy project.
- Christmas Thank You: We continue to feel great gratitude for: all those who put special effort into helping
 with the various liturgical ministries and decorations as we celebrated Christmas for those who have helped those in
 need during this season through the Giving Tree Program and other efforts and for those whose "Merry
 Christmas!" and "Happy New Year!" Greetings continue to brighten our days.
- Sacramental Marriage Couples who may be in a marriage or may be planning a wedding -- that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church (civil marriage, "destination" wedding, etc.), might find that now is a good time to consult with one of the priests to see whether that situation can be rectified or considered more carefully. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church's blessing. Issues involving divorce and remarriage can also benefit from pastoral guidance. In that way, one would become/remain eligible to receive the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. The priests are always happy to discuss such matters and offer appropriate pastoral assistance. Just give one of us a call or Email in the coming weeks.
- Educational options for local families are available like never before. The Educational Choice Scholarship (EdChoice) Program provides students from under-performing public schools the opportunity to attend participating private schools. Holy Family School is an EdChoice and EdChoice Expansion Provider. We would be delighted to provide a well-rounded, Faith-based education for your child. Students eligible to enter kindergarten for Fall 2022 who would be assigned to one of the designated public schools -- or students in grades 1-7 who are attending a public school in their resident district who will be assigned to one of the designated public schools -- or students in grades 1-7 who are attending a public school year -- are eligible to apply. Please note: In order to receive this scholarship, a student must be NEW to Holy Family School. The traditional EdChoice scholarship for the 2021-2022 school year paid up to \$5500 towards tuition. Traditional EdChoice scholarship recipients are required to pay the remaining balance (if any) to the school. Holy Family School begins registering students in late January. The EdChoice application period is scheduled to open in February. - The wearing of masks in the <u>Church and Chapel</u> is strongly requested at Holy Family both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners. Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so. Fr. Pjr

- Bishop Malesic has issued the following communication... "The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta and Omicron variants of the COVID-19 virus are surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors. All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings. Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass."
- The Collection for Catholic University of America will take place during January. Every year, millions of Catholics across the country contribute to the National Collection for The Catholic University of America through their parishes. The collection raises millions of dollars that go directly to support student financial aid at Catholic University of America (CUA). Envelopes for this purpose are included in your January packets and can be submitted throughout the month of January. Faith Direct participants can designate a donation online.
- The Latin America-El Salvador Collection -- supports missionary efforts throughout the Caribbean and Latin America and is essential to our Diocesan missionary commitments in El Salvador. Today our Cleveland Missionaries, Fr. Paul Schindler and Fr. John Ostrowski, continue our Diocesan Mission. The collection is taken every year during January. Your on-going support of our proud fifty-four years of diocesan commitment to the people of El Salvador will greatly assist our Diocesan Mission's continued success. Envelopes for this purpose are included in your monthly envelope packets and can be submitted throughout the month. Faith Direct participants can designate a donation online.
- Children and the Elevator We have experienced a couple of recent events where 911 calls were received by the Stow Police from our Church elevator that turned out to be "false alarms". Without trying to assign blame, the Police and I would suggest that it would be a good idea for parents of small children to explain the proper use of the elevator and that the HELP button is for real emergencies.
- Please be careful when receiving Communion not to drop the Eucharistic Host. If trying to manage moving your mask while receiving Communion is difficult, we would suggest lowering your mask before stepping forward to receive. Please consume the Host immediately as you step to the side. You should not keep the Host in your hand as you return to your pew.

- Protecting God's Children --The Diocese of Cleveland's "Protecting God's Children" program is a continuing effort to instruct and inform everyone about the protection of children from sexual abuse. You are also asked to immediately inform local authorities about inappropriate behavior.
- Deacon Phil Our retired Deacon Phil Kamlowsky continues his recovery at home following major surgery in July. He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. Let's pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- AMEN!!
- Recall that some folks have remained reluctant to be in crowded places because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to "in person" worship and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
- For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time please check with one of the priests and we will be happy to arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- Capital Campaign -- As of January 4th: 714 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$3,052,325 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$2,266,866 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response!! Thank you for your support.
- I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis and associated financial disruptions has changed personal financial security for many of you beyond your "typical" circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. <u>I understand and respect</u> the decisions you have needed to make. Social Concerns:

"Inmates at Grafton Correctional Institution welcome bishop as he celebrates Mass

'I am so happy to be here tonight. I've been looking forward to this for a long time,' Bishop Edward Malesic told about 50 Grafton Correctional Institution inmates as he celebrated Mass for them on Dec. 19, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, on his first visit to the minimum/medium security prison that houses about 1,600 men. Sister Rita Mary Harwood, SND, the recently retired head of the Parish Life and Development

Secretariat for the Diocese of Cleveland, whose ministry included working with the incarcerated, also attended. The bishop told the inmates about a parish, where he had been pastor, building a new church and taking a huge mar-

ble altar that needed to be made smaller from the old church. Someone recommended using Big House Industries – which consisted of prison. 'They did a beautiful job,' he said, reminding the men that they have something to offer. The altar and ambo used for Mass at Grafton Correctional Institution were crafted by inmates in the prison woodshop. The bishop noted the inmates found ways to contribute during the pandemic by making more than 40,000 face masks for Catholic Charities, Diocese of Cleveland and growing vegetables, donating them to Catholic Charities for use at the hunger centers. 'I thank you on behalf of the Diocese of Cleveland and those who use the hunger centers,' he told

the inmates gathered for Mass. He told the men that when they receive Communion, they become tabernacles of the Lord, who lives in their hearts. 'Take Christ with you. If you want to give Jesus, you must know him and have him.' Time is a gift, the bishop said, advising the men to use it wisely. 'Read Scripture, pray, learn to be holy. This room is filled with angels and saints. If we had special 'spiritual glasses,' we could see how many angels and saints are packed into this room,' Bishop Malesic said.

'God unites us. There are many signs of life here,' the bishop said, reminding the men, 'you're a life and you are loved. There is a place for all of us in this world. I'll pray for you and I ask you to also pray for me. You support me in my faith and I need your support,' he added."
