



- ◆ **"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me . . ."** Luke 1: 1-4; 4: 14-21

Isaiah's vision read by Jesus in today's Gospel includes us: the Spirit of God "is upon" us, too, leading us to the other side of doubt, setting us to the work of creating God's Kingdom here and now, enabling us to see our lives and world illuminated with the peace and hope of our Creator. As Jesus realizes his identity in the Spirit of God at his baptism, we find our identity in that Spirit at our baptisms, as well. **Questions for the Car:** What does it mean for our identity to be "sealed on God's Heart"?

- ◆ **Your Christmas Generosity – Thank you for your extraordinary generosity – remarkable, especially considering COVID -- to Holy Family at Christmas. Generous gifts were received in the Christmas Collection – before Christmas, on Christmas itself, and in the days before New Year's. We are also most grateful for the "end-of-the-year giving", from IRA's and other funds, which several folks exercised -- benefitting both our Christmas collection and our Capital Campaign, Heart of a Shepherd, and Endowment Funds. - ◆ **Heart of a Shepherd – Thank You** to several parishioners who have already responded quite generously to my **"Heart of a Shepherd"** letter which I sent just before Christmas. I deeply appreciate your willingness to help us with our parish commitment to this worthy project.
- ◆ **2022 Catholic Charities Annual Appeal – "Be the Light!"**-- kicks off in January. During the week of 25 January, close to 100,000 households will receive a letter from Bishop Malesic encouraging support for the 2022 Appeal and asking each of us to "help our brothers and sisters in need." The Appeal Goal this year is \$14 million throughout the Diocese. It is sought to continue to serve more than 400,000 people in need. **Parish Appeal: Feb. 19-20** -- All parishes are asked to conduct the In-Pew Appeal the weekend of 19-20 Feb. We are grateful for the support of our priests and volunteers who faithfully promote the appeal at the parish level and to our loyal parishioners who, through their sacrificial gifts, are changing lives throughout our diocese. Annually, more than \$4 million is raised on this weekend across the diocese. Thank you for your support.
- ◆ **SS. Anne & Joachim Grandparent Workshops | March 28 & 30, April 4 & 6** Grandparents are vital to passing on the faith. The Vicar for Evangelization, in collaboration with the Office of Missionary Discipleship, Marriage and Family Ministry, Youth Ministry and Young Adult Ministry, will offer Anne and Joachim Workshops. This will be an opportunity to talk about ways that grandparents can share their faith with their grandchildren and will offer some practical tools that can be used. The workshops will be offered at various sites throughout the diocese, and will include a closing Mass. Cost is \$10 per person including brunch. - ◆ **Educational options for local families** are available like never before. The **Educational Choice Scholarship (EdChoice)** Program provides students from under-performing public schools the opportunity to attend participating private schools. **Holy Family School is an EdChoice and EdChoice Expansion Provider.** We would be delighted to provide a well-rounded, Faith-based education for your child. Students eligible to enter kindergarten for Fall 2022 who would be assigned to one of the designated public schools -- or students in grades 1-7 who are attending a public school in their resident district who will be assigned to one of the designated public schools for the upcoming school year -- are eligible to apply. Please note: In order to receive this scholarship, a student must be NEW to Holy Family School. The traditional EdChoice scholarship for the 2021-2022 school year paid up to \$5500 towards tuition. Traditional EdChoice scholarship recipients are required to pay the remaining balance (if any) to the school. **Holy Family School begins registering students in late January. The EdChoice application period is scheduled to open in February.** If you are interested in more information regarding this opportunity -- or would like to tour our School -- please contact Katrine Franklin at 330.688.6412 ext. 314 or kfranklin@holyfamilyschoolstow.org
- ◆ **The wearing of masks in the Church and Chapel is strongly requested at Holy Family – both for your safety and, out of courtesy, for the safety and comfort of your fellow parishioners.** Thank you for your cooperation. I feel that it is my responsibility to make coming to Church as comfortable and safe as possible for all of you (many of whom are vulnerable) – and I will continue to do so. Fr. Pjr
- ◆ **Deacon Phil** – Our retired **Deacon Phil Kamlowsky** continues his recovery at home **following major surgery in July.** He is anticipating several more weeks of physical therapy. He and Karen appreciate your prayerful support. Let's pray for a speedy recovery. And we all say -- **AMEN!!**

- ◆ **Sacramental Marriage** – Couples who may be in a marriage – or may be planning a wedding -- that has not been recognized by the Catholic Church (civil marriage, destination wedding, etc.), might find that now is a good time to consult with one of the priests to see whether that situation can be rectified or considered more carefully. It could be as simple as repeating your marriage vows quietly in front of a priest and receiving the Church’s blessing. Issues involving divorce and remarriage can also benefit from pastoral guidance. In that way, one would become/remain eligible to receive the sacraments of the Church, especially the Eucharist. The priests are always happy to discuss such matters and offer appropriate pastoral assistance. Just give one of us a call or Email in the coming weeks.
- ◆ **Bishop Malesic has issued the following communication...** “The latest information from federal, state and local public health agencies informs us that the Delta and Omicron variants of the COVID-19 virus are surging in our area, causing increased illness and hospitalizations at levels not seen since the spring. For the safety of all who worship at Catholic parishes throughout the Diocese of Cleveland, **I strongly encourage you -- whether vaccinated or not vaccinated -- to wear a face mask while attending Mass indoors.** All who want to attend Mass, and who are otherwise vulnerable, should feel safe and welcome inside our sacred spaces. Please use charity and patience with those who do not wish to comply with this strongly stated request. You also might want to consider wearing a face mask for other indoor gatherings. Those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immune-compromised or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety about contracting the coronavirus in a large group of persons are not obliged to attend Mass.”
- ◆ **The Latin America-El Salvador Collection** -- supports missionary efforts throughout the Caribbean and Latin America – and is essential to our Diocesan missionary commitments in El Salvador. Today our Cleveland Missionaries, Fr. Paul Schindler and Fr. John Ostrowski, continue our Diocesan Mission. The collection is taken every year during January. Your on-going support of our proud fifty-four years of diocesan commitment to the people of El Salvador will greatly assist our Diocesan Mission’s continued success. Envelopes for this purpose are included in your monthly envelope packets – and can be submitted throughout the month. **Faith Direct** participants can designate a donation online.
- ◆ Recall that some folks have remained **reluctant to be in crowded places** – because of their own health issues or the health of those in their care. They may remain tentative as they return to “in person” worship – and we can do our best to help them feel welcomed.
- ◆ For those with **gluten intolerance** or other reason to refrain from receiving the Sacred Host at Communion time – please check with one of the priests and we will be happy to arrange an opportunity to receive Holy Communion from the Cup or to receive a low-gluten host.
- ◆ **Capital Campaign** -- As of January 4th: 714 Parishioners have pledged a total of \$3,052,325 toward our goal of \$3,000,000 -- and \$2,266,866 (moving up each week!) has been paid on these pledges. A Wonderful Response! Thank you for your support.
- ◆ *I am very much aware that the COVID-19 crisis – and associated financial disruptions – has changed personal financial security for many of you – beyond your “typical” circumstances. I realize that some folks may need to adjust their contributions to Holy Family until they are in a better place. I understand and respect the decisions you have needed to make. We all pray for better times ahead. We will get through this. We are people of love, faith – and hope. Thank you -- for your exceptional generosity to the Parish and the works of the Church.*

**“U.S. Bishops’ Chairman for International Justice and Peace
Commends
Pledge by World Powers to Avoid Nuclear Conflict**

‘On January 3, **the five permanent members of the United Nations Security Council (China, France, Russia, the United Kingdom, and the United States)** issued a joint statement that is an **important acclamation of the need to prevent nuclear war and avoid arms races**. This principled statement affirms ‘a nuclear war cannot be won and must never be fought’ and stresses the importance of abiding by non-proliferation agreements and commitments.

‘**Conflicts and calls to arms have not ceased**. Unfortunately, the Tenth Review Conference of the Treaty of the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons was again postponed in light of the COVID-19 pandemic. In **my letter to Secretary of State Antony Blinker** in September, I expressed our hope that these critical negotiations will be soon advanced as we draw upon the prophetic wisdom of Pope Francis in **Fratelli Tutti** that reminds us, ‘international peace and stability cannot be based on a false sense of security, on the threat of mutual destruction or total annihilation.’

‘I **invite all Americans to continue in prayer and support** of our leaders to advance the critical goals of disarmament.’

Bishop David J. Malloy of Rockford, chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) Committee on International Justice and Peace issued the above statement in response to **world powers’ pledge to prevent nuclear weapons spread.**” From the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB)

It's not uncommon for a cough to hang on for up to six weeks after a respiratory infection, due to lingering inflammation, according to Nisha Rughwani MD, associate professor of geriatrics and palliative medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City. She recommends the use of an over-the-counter steroid nasal spray to help ease the postnasal drip that can cause coughing. A teaspoon or two of honey several times a day may also help, Rughwani adds. Some doctors might prescribe a codeine-containing cough from interrupting sleep, but Rughwani doesn't advise this for older adults because it can worsen memory problems. If your cough persists for longer than six weeks, or your coughing up blood, wheezing, or having chest pain, contact your doctor. You may need to see a pulmonologist, who can order tests such as a chest CT scan, Rughwani says. You might need to use an inhaler for a while to help reduce any inflammation causing the cough, or even to undergo short-term pulmonary rehabilitation therapy. “Annual Collection for Latin America Strengthens Families, Funds Catholic Education, and Fosters Priestly and Religious Vocations

In Cúcuta, **Colombia**, where malnourished refugees pour across the border from **Venezuela**, this collection supports relief ministries that provide food and job training to migrants and a Catholic childcare center for children whose migrant parents labor from dawn to dusk as vendors in the city streets.

Catholics throughout the United States have an opportunity to help the Church’s formation of missionary disciples in Central and South America and the Caribbean islands by giving to the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops’ (USCCB) annual **Collection for the Church in Latin America**. ‘The Collection makes a significant impact in **lives of our brothers and sisters in Latin America**,’ said Bishop Octavio Cisneros, auxiliary bishop emeritus of Brooklyn and chairman of the USCCB’s Subcommittee on the Church in Latin America.

In 2020, the Collection distributed more than \$5.6 million among 334 ministries in **Mexico, Central and South America, and the Caribbean**, to support evangelization, catechesis, marriage and family ministry, pro-life work, youth ministry, prison ministry, pastoral outreach, formation for clergy, religious, and lay leaders, and the implementation of safe environment/child protection programs. ‘When Pope Francis was archbishop of **Buenos Aires, Argentina**, this collection supported his ministry to **the people in the city’s poorest neighborhoods**,’ Bishop Cisneros said.”
