

STEWARDSHIP


“As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied grace.” (1Pt 4:10)



This past Thursday our Haiti Ministry began a new project to build a sense of prayerful connection between Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church and St. Isidore Catholic Church in Anse-a-Galets, La Gonave, Haiti. The project will take several months to play out.

Parishioners in each church will have a chance to inscribe a message or sign a prayer card/bookmark. The card design includes the names of both parishes and the promise to pray for each other in English and Kreyol. The project began through a presentation during religious education class for teens.

Once each parish has signed cards and they're collected, they will be blessed and sent to the other parish for distribution. When we're done, members of each parish will have a tangible reminder of the 40-plus year relationship between our parishes and our people.

While we often think of parish twinning as a one-way street, a flow of funds, true accompaniment means walking together, supporting each other in the ways we're capable. Our ministry members are always moved by the deep faith of the Haitian people, no matter how many difficulties they face. And today, they're facing more than usual.

They bolster our faith, and we think they'll bolster yours, too. They publicly pray for us every week in Mass, even though we've abandoned that practice here.

During this multi-month project, we'll also begin a series of bulletin posts to introduce more people to our twin parish relationship and answer questions about our parish twin, parish twinning in general and Haiti writ large.

We hope you'll join us in praying for members of our twin parish and their greater community. And help us by supporting our ministry so we can help Father Dieudonne serve his parish, including those most in need.

Saint of the Week


You may recognize the name St. Frances Xavier Cabrini (1850 – 1917) as the first United States citizen to become a saint. Known for her deep trust in God, she was a courageous woman doing the work of Christ.

Her life of service began when she was first refused admission to the religious order which had educated her to be a teacher. Not one to take things face value, she instead focused her charitable work at the House of Providence Orphanage in Cadogno, Italy, and in 1877, professed vows there and took the religious habit.

When the bishop closed the orphanage in 1880, he named St. Frances Xavier Cabrini prioress of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. However, she had a dream she was determined to fulfill. Since her early childhood, she had dreamed of being a missionary in China. Pope Leo XIII, however, urged her to see the need in the west. She traveled with six of her fellow religious sisters to New York City, where they worked with the thousands of Italian immigrants residing there.

Although she experienced many disappointments during this time, she persevered. When she arrived in New York, the house intended to be her first orphanage in the United States was not available. Rather than come back to Italy and the order she oversaw, she instead found a way to establish that orphanage elsewhere — plus a few more. Throughout her life, she is known for founding 67 institutions dedicated to caring for the poor, the abandoned, the uneducated, and the sick. She died of malaria in her own Columbus Hospital in Chicago in 1917.
