Dear Parishioners and Friends of the Cathedral,

Did you ever have a nickname? Well the Saint that we celebrate on January 28th did, and it wasn't all that flattering of a name. Because of his large size and quiet demeanor, Thomas Aquinas was nicknamed the 'dumb ox.' But the irony of ironies was that Saint Thomas was far from dumb, in fact, he is probably the most brilliant Christian thinker who has ever lived. His philosophy constitutes the official philosophical outlook of the Catholic Church, and is still in the service of the Church's intellectual tradition to this day.

Thomas was born to a noble Italian family around 1225 AD, near the Benedictine Abbey of Monte Cassino, where he was sent to study at the age of five. His parents sent him to study with the monks, hoping that he would choose to enter religious life there and eventually become abbot of the monastery. Recognizing his intellectual gifts, the monks encouraged his parents to send him to study at the University of Naples, which they did. It was there that he discovered the philosophy of Aristotle, which would come to highly influence his way of thinking, but it also introduced him to the relatively new Dominican Order. When Saint Thomas returned from his studies and it was time for him to choose his state in life, he announced his plans to join the Dominican Order. His family, however, was bitterly opposed to the idea, because they could not envision their son, who was of noble birth, traveling around as a poor itinerant preacher, as a member of this new and somewhat untested religious order. So his brothers kidnapped him and locked him away in the family castle, in order to help him change his mind. They even went so far as to send a woman into his room to try and seduce him, but Saint Thomas took a flaming brand from the fire and chased her out of his room. Then he shut the door and burned a cross into it. In that instant, God gave to him a special grace, from that point forward his passions (emotions) would always reside under the reign of his intellect, and this gift gave him incredible clarity of thought. He escaped his captivity and entered the Dominican Order, completing his studies in Paris and then in Cologne under Saint Albert the Great. Eventually Saint Thomas was ordained a priest, and would go on to hold two professorships in Paris, until he was called to Rome to teach by Pope Urban IV. He was a personal friend of Saint Louis, the king of France, who often consulted Thomas for advice. Aquinas was a skilled homilist and a man of great piety when it came to celebrating the Church's sacraments. Among his greatest contributions to the Church, though, were his writings (comprising over 20 hefty tomes which are filled with amazing lucidity and clarity) which bring faith and reason into a beautiful synthesis with one another. In fact, at the Council of Trent, his *Summa Theologiae* was placed on the altar along with the Scriptures for easy reference. Towards the end of his life, he ceased writing all together after a mystical experience, claiming that what he had experienced made all his writing appear as nothing more than straw. Saint Thomas Aquinas died in 1274, while complying with the Pope's request to come to the Council of Lyons and help reconcile the Latin and the Greek Churches.

After Aquinas had completed the section of the *Summa Theologiae* on the Eucharist, he was praying before the crucifix, and there heard a voice speak to him from the cross: "Thomas, you have written well of me, what would you have as a reward?" to which Thomas replied: "I will have nothing but you O Lord." If there is one lesson that we can learn from this brilliant man, it is that we should prefer nothing to God and not allow anything to stand in the way of doing His will.

The Cleveland Cares Packages will contain a variety of items including essentials, clothing, nonperishable food, and items that make the clients feel loved. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

## Virtual Youth Rally & Mass for Life

from the Archdiocese of Washington DC: coverage on **January 29th** starts at 8:30 am with Mass beginning at 10 am. Josh Brahm from the Equal Rights Institute will speak on 'The Good, The Bad, and The Ugly' ways to talk about pro-life issues. Registration is now open for youth groups, school groups, or classrooms. The Youth Rally and Mass for Life, traditionally held at the Capital One Arena in downtown Washington, DC, occurs in conjunction with the annual National March for Life. **Year of St. Joseph** - Pope Francis has proclaimed a special "Year of St. Joseph," beginning on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception 2020 and extending to the same feast in 2021. In a new Apostolic Letter entitled *Patris corde* ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a tender and loving, obedient father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows. This Apostolic Letter marks the 150th anniversary of Blessed Pope Pius IX's declaration of St Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

**Centering Prayer** is a spiritual practice of our Catholic contemplative tradition that opens us more deeply to a relationship with God in faith and intimacy. Our group meets on Monday evenings from 6:30-8:00 pm in the Lower Sacristy.

**Bishops' Statement on Vaccines** - As the first doses of the much-anticipated COVID-19 vaccines make their way across the country and to the first round of recipients, the chairmen of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on Doctrine - Bishop Kevin Rhoades, and Committee on Pro-Life Activities - Archbishop Joseph Naumann issued a statement on the new vaccines.

*"Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good,"* they wrote


