

**The Most Reverend
 Anthony M. Pilla, DD, MA

Anthony M. Pilla was born in Cleveland on November 12, 1932. He attended Cathedral Latin High School. He spent his first two years of college at St. Gregory College Seminary in Cincinnati, then returned to Cleveland in 1953 to attend Borromeo College, from which he graduated in 1955, and Saint Mary Seminary, from which he graduated in 1959.

Ordained on May 23, 1959, in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist, Bishop Pilla served as a parochial vicar at St. Bartholomew Parish in Middleburg Heights before beginning service as a full time Professor and administrator at Borromeo Seminary in Wickliffe, where he was appointed rector in 1972. He also served in several other diocesan positions before being appointed auxiliary bishop of Cleveland on June 30, 1979. His episcopal ordination took place on August 1, 1979, in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist.

Bishop Pilla was appointed apostolic administrator of the diocese on July 29, 1980, after Bishop James A. Hickey was appointed archbishop of Washington, D.C. He was appointed the ninth bishop of Cleveland on November 18, 1980, and was installed on January 6, 1981, in the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. He served as diocesan bishop until May 15, 2006, when Pope Benedict accepted his resignation for health reasons. At that time, he became bishop emeritus.

Throughout his retirement, Bishop Pilla continued to serve as a resource for the diocese and his successors, the late Bishop Richard Lennon, Bishop Nelson Perez, now archbishop of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Bishop Malesic. He also continued to support the diocesan seminaries, the seminarians and his fellow clergy.

Bishop Pilla, 88, died on September 21. He was the first son of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland to serve as its bishop. He was well



loved, and those who knew him said he touched the lives of many through his kindness, genuine concern and care for others, and his priestly heart. He reminded the clergy, laity, and religious that they were good people and good priests, which made for a great diocese.

Faith Enrichment Opportunities

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Background: Once again, Jesus rebukes his disciples for drawing boundaries too tightly around God's compassionate love. God's Spirit, in some way, can come to rest on any person of good will. What we need to worry about is our exclusion of others while we are blind to our own failings—especially how we scandalize others.

Discussion Questions

1. Which person has been most responsible for bringing you to Christ? How did they do so?
2. How has the church scandalized you and made it hard to come to Christ? Or inspired you and drawn you to him?
3. How has wealth blinded our society? How can you change that situation?
4. What do you need to give up if you are going to give yourself completely to the building of God's kingdom/reign?

Practice: Every evening this week prayerfully and reflectively watch a different news channel. At the end of the week, reflect upon which one not only seemed most factual but also brought you a sense of compassion and connection with others.

Time to Pause and Reflect:

- In essence, he said, for God to be good, God can be one (but we always have doubts about a lone monarch). Bishops’ Statement on Vaccines

As COVID-19 vaccines are now available to recipients across the country, the chairmen of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops’ Committee on Doctrine - Bishop Kevin Rhoades, and Committee on Pro-Life Activities - Archbishop Joseph Naumann issued a statement on the new vaccines.

“Receiving one of the COVID-19 vaccines ought to be understood as an act of charity toward the other members of our community. In this way, being vaccinated safely against COVID-19 should be considered an act of love of our neighbor and part of our moral responsibility for the common good,” they wrote. The Social Action Ministry of the Cathedral has recently studied the Seven Principals of Catholic Social Teaching. These Principals are the basis for our work as a ministry. We would like to share the Principals with those who worship at the Cathedral with hope that you might take time to reflect on them for your personal life journey.


- 1. Life and dignity of the Human Person**
- Human life is sacred and the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society.
- 2. Call to Family, Community and Participation**
- How we organize our society in economics and politics, in law and policy, directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community.
- 3. Rights and Responsibilities**
- Every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities.
- 4. Option for the Poor and Vulnerable**
Tradition instructs us to put the needs of the poor and vulnerable first.
- 5. The Dignity of work and the Rights of Workers**
- The basic rights of workers must be respected: the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to the organization and joining of unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.
- 6. Solidarity**
- We are one family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic and ideological differences.
- 7. Care for God’s Creation**
- We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation.




