LET US NEVER FORGET

Observed on the last Monday in May each year, Memorial Day was first know as Decoration Day. On May 30th, 1868, it was first widely observed to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers, by proclamation of Gen. John A. Logan of the Grand Army of the Republic, an organization of former Union sailors and soldiers. During the first national commemoration, former Union General and Ohio Congressman James Garfield made a speech at Arlington Cemetery:

"We do not know one promise these men made, one pledge they gave, one word they spoke; but we do know they summed up and perfected, by one supreme act, the highest virtues of men and citizens. For love of country they accepted death, and thus resolved all doubts, and made immortal their patriotism and their virtue."

Following Garfield's speech, approximately 5,000 volunteers helped decorate the gravesites of more than 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers who were buried there.

Throughout the years, the number of those that have died to protect and serve our country has only grown. On Memorial Day, we take time to reflect and honor those who have died in service to their country.

The mission of all Americans is clear..... NEVER FORGET.

CITY TRANSPORTATION
