



## QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

### **First Reading:**

We hear today of Jesus' own struggle with his impending death. During this Lenten season, what has been a struggle for you?

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? \* CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

### **Question:**

What is spiritual communion, and do you need to be in a state of grace to receive it?

### **Answer:**

The practice of making a "spiritual communion" dates back several centuries and St. Thomas Aquinas described it as "an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Holy Sacrament and a loving embrace as though we had already received Him." Traditionally, a prayer of spiritual communion has been used by those who are unable to receive sacramental communion because of health, inability to attend Mass, or who cannot receive communion because of grave sin. This practice has been encouraged by many saints and spiritual writers and most recently Pope Francis encouraged the practice when the realities of the COVID-19 pandemic prevented so many Catholics from taking part in the Mass or receiving sacramental communion.

Although the graces offered in spiritual communion are not the same as those offered in the sacramental communion of the Mass, this practice is still a powerful opportunity to express our desire for union with the Lord and to be united with Christ and the Church, even in an imperfect way.



### 5th Sunday of Lent: Giving Jesus a Chance:

We only have a couple more weeks of Lent. Nothing would please the heart of Christ more than if we made a real effort to spend more time with him in prayer during these weeks, to let him be our Savior.

True prayer is much more than just saying prayers. It is a heart-to-heart conversation with God, with the God who loves us so much that even while we were still sinners he climbed up onto a cross and suffered in his own body and soul the consequences and penalty of our sins.

There are special graces during Lent, but we will miss them unless we take time to sit close to the Lord and talk with him.

We are all busy, and it may not be easy to make time to spend in prayer. God understands that. But if we try, I am sure we can find ways.

Maybe it is just a matter of saying an extra decade of the Rosary while you're driving to the store or to work.

Maybe it's just a matter of going to bed fifteen minutes earlier than usual, so that you can get up fifteen minutes earlier and spend that time reading a chapter of the Bible or of a good spiritual book, and speaking to the Lord about what you read.

Maybe it could be skipping your favorite TV show for the next two or three weeks and coming to the parish to do a Holy Hour (or a Holy Half-Hour) in front of the Eucharist instead - praying for yourself and for all your loved ones.

God will never let himself be outdone in generosity. If we give him a bit more time, he will shower us with a lot more grace - that's just how he is: his heart never gets tired of giving.

We just need to give him a chance to be our Savior. Let's promise him that we will.

**EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP -  
RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS**  
*When Our Own Hour Comes*

We parents know that it's tricky, tackling the topic of fear with our kids. We want them to know that it's okay to be scared, that it's something we all feel from time to time. We want them to understand that bravery isn't the absence of fear, but the choices we make in persevering despite that feeling.

Most of all, we want to model the right kind of behavior for our kids. Whatever our scary situation is — illness, a job loss, life changes — we want them to see us make a choice to face that fear head-on.

Jesus seems to be the parent who is gently broaching the topic of fear with his children. A great sense of foreboding hangs over these readings. Jesus knew what was coming. He knew it was going to be hard, both for him and for his followers, who did not have his courage. Even he admits to being "troubled" and he speaks of "the time of judgment." There is the dramatic raising of Lazarus, the talk of how a grain of wheat must die in order to bear fruit, the depiction of Christ as an obedient student of his own suffering.

"Yet what should I say?" he asks them. "Father, save me from this hour?" But it was for this purpose that I came to this hour."

This week, Christ gives us a very parental gift: He shows us his fear, and he shows us how to conquer it. He challenges us to embrace the purpose for which we came to this hour — whatever that hour may hold.

# Teens Encounter Christ

**TEENS ENCOUNTER CHRIST (TEC)**

TEC is a diocesan spiritual movement for older high school teens and young college students. It begins with a retreat weekend filled with dynamic reflections, music, sacraments, adoration, small group dialogue, prayer, and community building. Afterwards, the TEC community (TECITES) evolves into a network of mutual support that both reinforces their parish involvement and personal spiritual growth. TEC leads participants to integrate Christ's Paschal Mystery (dying, rising, and going forth) at a time of passage through which they are preparing for adult life after high school and college.

TEC is effective in helping young people focus on their spiritual life as well as their secular life. It also empowers them to speak openly and courageously to their friends about their faith in Christ and their living out of Christian values.

TEC began in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston in the late sixties under the leadership of Fathers Ed Bell and Jody DeBias (both deceased). Father Leon Alexander was a team member of the very first TEC in Wheeling, serving as a confessor for the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

In recent years, TEC became dormant, but it is currently being revived under the leadership of Mr. Daniel Maul, the Diocesan Director of Evangelization, Catechesis, and Youth. Daniel has formed a Diocesan TEC Steering Committee consisting of Ralph Modena of Princeton, Kathy Lynch of Beckley, Theresa O'Leary of Charleston, Fr. Leon Alexander of Charleston, Father John McDonough of Morgantown, and many more. They are meeting often via ZOOM conferencing.



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


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
