TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading:

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

First Reading: In the closing remarks of the speech delivered to the Israelites in the desert, Moses reflects on God's fidelity and love for them. In return for God's favor, the Israelites are instructed to keep God's statutes and commandments. Why do you think so many people are resistant to this divine expectation?

Second Reading: Paul sees the Holy Spirit as integral to our identity as "children of God" and "joint heirs with Christ." How do you sense our Triune God at work in your life?

Gospel: We hear today the closing words in the Gospel of Matthew — Jesus' final commissioning of the disciples to evangelize and baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What insights to the nature of God does this divine relationship offer?

WHY DO WE DO THAT? * CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: If it isn't only for people who are dying, when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Answer: One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed. The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).

We are officially fundraising for two new property related projects.



Carpet – The Parish Center was built in 1983 and the chapel, office and conference/class rooms have the original carpet (38 years old). Over the years the carpet has been stained and in a couple places, burned so it's time for it to be replaced.

Concrete – The Parish Center sidewalk is also original from 1983 and had raised over the years causing cracking and in the winter months, it raises up to create a trip hazard. We are replacing the sidewalk at the Center and also replacing a section of the sidewalk at the church to install a ramp by the double doors for use during funerals or for wheel chairs.

These two projects will cost nearly \$19,000 and we've had a few families give contributions and hope others will consider giving as well. If you would like to contribute drop envelope in offering basket or see Janet in the office.

The Most Holy Trinity:

This is something so mysterious that we believe it because Our Lord taught it to us and we believe in him.

Thank God the Father for creating us and revealing himself to Israel as the One True God.

Thank God the Son for obeying his Father in Heaven and coming down and becoming man to show us that God was Our Father and enabling us to become his adopted children.

Thank the Holy Spirit for transforming us into God's adopted children and for bringing the Holy Trinity into our hearts and helping us to understand and live this great mystery of our faith.

Thank God — literally — that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is — and remember the thanks we owe the Giver.


