

#### Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever deeper love. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8). Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing. Arrangements are made by calling the Pastoral Center.

#### A Letter From Our Pastor

#### **Dear Friends:**

Someone once described refusing forgiveness to holding on to a porcupine: it feels so much better to let it go.

Peter asks the Lord: how many times must I forgive? Jesus points him towards the generous forgiveness that God extends towards us. As we have been forgiven, we must forgive. If we close our hearts to others, then we also close the door for ourselves. Forgiveness allows us to let go of bitterness and pain.

Forgiveness can be a difficult thing to grasp. Does it mean excusing hurtful, evil behavior? Does it mean that we are ignoring the harm that someone has caused us or others?

Forgiveness is a decision that we make to be willing to forego vengeance for wrongs done to us, to desire for those who wrong us true good, and to place all of this in God's hands. Forgiveness is part of a process that hopefully leads to repentance, reconciliation, and healing. Forgiveness can be extended even if the other party has not asked for it. In this case, it is a decision on our part to no longer be controlled by what they have done. Repentance, reconciliation, and healing can only come when they seek our forgiveness. But it begins with our willingness to extend it to them.

Our motive for doing so comes from the fact that God has decided to forgive us for our sins. In Jesus' parable, the master forgives the servant in debt. God wants to forgive us if we seek His forgiveness. To really receive it, we need to ask, which is the act of repentance. We see that the Lord's attitude towards us is one of mercy. He does not seek revenge. He wants the greatest good for us. He brings us healing. When we reconcile with God, we receive these blessings fully.

The Lord comes to heal our pain and desires that we will extend that mercy to others.








#### Relic of Saint Jude


