Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever deeper love. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8). Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing. Arrangements are made by calling the Pastoral Center.

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

One of the more challenging parables of Jesus is the one that we listen to today: The Parable of the Workers in the Vineyard.

It is challenging because it may upend our sense of fairness. The ones who work a single hour at the end of the workday are paid the same amount as those who labored all day. That is not fair! It's not fair until we stop to reflect on the words of the owner: he gave the first hired what they agreed to accept for the job; it's his vineyard and his money, he can do with it what he wants. He is not fair; that is, one who gives only what is deserved; he is generous. He gives to all abundantly as he wishes.

The parable reminds us of two important lessons: God owes us nothing but is generous in calling us and blessing us; and, it's never too late to respond to His invitation.

God did not have to create us, let alone invite us to know Him and serve Him and to receive His blessings - above all, the promise of eternal life in His presence. Nevertheless, He calls us to this very thing. And He never gives up looking for us to come and follow Him. Even down to the last hour, He seeks us out and calls us to come to His vineyard.

We should never begrudge the last-minute converts, the "johnnies come lately" of life, nor think that's the way to go. None of us knows when the hour is too late to receive the call. So, if you have labored faithfully for most or all your life, you should know the joy of serving the Lord and are grateful for the fact that we have felt, without the sin of presumption, the preview of our reward.

We should be grateful also that God is always ready to give us a last chance - We may need it!

Next Sunday, to mark Respect Life Sunday and as a part of our Eucharistic Revival, following the noon Mass, we will expose the Blessed Sacrament for a period of adoration and prayer, concluding the hour with a brief procession around Saints Peter and Paul Church and ending with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. I hope that you will make some time to come and join us for this time of prayer.

What Sets Saints Peter and Paul Catholic School Apart?

Dear Saints Peter and Paul Families,

Working in a secular school environment, easily the most fraught topic in the school was discipline. The debates surrounding what was and wasn't acceptable behavior in the school often highlighted individuals' personal values, which, more often than not, were incompatible and unable to be rectified into a common vision. After a number of years of this, I found myself asking, how can we agree on the right way to educate these children if we can't even agree on what's right and wrong?

The very idea of discipline in schools is undermined by further changes in our culture. Beyond our loss of a common idea of right and wrong, yet another rapid cultural change has occurred. Instant gratification is the ethos of today's society; it seems like, culturally, everything is now oriented around the idea of pursuing what makes us happy in the moment, and shedding the vestiges of that which holds us back from pursuing our own desires. The idea of "discipline" then, is particularly suspect in such a worldview - why should any of us submit to someone else's idea of right or wrong, especially if it involves a sacrifice of our personal comfort or fleeting desires?

Conversely, within a Catholic educational framework, the concept of discipline is at the forefront of what we know to be right and wrong. The word "discipline" itself, from a Catholic perspective, loses its sole association with punishments. Rather, "discipline" is a word we associate with our vocations or with the self-discipline necessary to fulfill God's commandments and participate in the sacraments and the joy we experience therein. This alone is helpful for beginning to reclaim the concept of discipline and establish a more positive vision of the word. Catholic schools, therefore, do not have the unanswered question of what is right and wrong, as we all have a common moral compass in sacred scripture and the teachings of the Magisterium. What is right and wrong is not up to us, nor is it contingent upon meeting our personal needs or desires. Discipline is not a negative, but a calling for us all to something higher than ourselves.

Recently, I encountered a quote by my patron saint, Teresa of Avila, which perfectly encapsulated the concept of discipline within a Catholic educational setting, especially as it contrasts to secular education. My pastor, Father Frank Kurimsky, had instructed me to read Saint Teresa's writings, as he felt they would better help me understand God's plan for me. As anyone who has read works by this Doctor of the Church knows, Saint Teresa's writing is theologically dense, and not necessarily "easy reading" after a long day at work. Her poetry and other writings having inspired me, I resolved to obey Father Frank and read her seminal work on the soul, *The Interior Castle*. In the prologue, Saint Teresa outlines how she was instructed by her own spiritual advisor to write the book, though she felt tired and unmotivated to do so. She writes:

"But knowing that the strength given by obedience usually lessens the difficulty of things that seem impossible, I resolved to carry out the task very willingly, even though my human nature seems greatly distressed."

Of course, I knew right away that this sentence was Saint Teresa speaking to me through the centuries, encouraging me to read on. But also, as a principal, I felt that nothing has better summed up how discipline manifests in a Catholic school. Though we, as humans, may too find the temptations of our culture to be enticing, we understand, uniquely, that "the strength given by obedience lessens the difficulty of things," and we resolve, "to carry out the task very willingly." Discipline - no matter what form it manifests - is never easy, but our difficulty is lessened, and the reward is eternal.






