

Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever deeper love. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8). Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing. Arrangements are made by calling the Pastoral Center.

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

As a society we are not good at waiting.

We have so many means of instant communication; we can call, text, email, instant message people from anywhere at any time. Whole libraries of information are a click away and can be accessed by devices that we carry in our pocket or purse. Events occurring on the other side of the globe are known to us as they are happening.

This ability to instantly connect makes waiting difficult. To be told to wait is aggravating because we are used to instant gratification of our wishes. We anticipate the next thing even before we finish what is before us. Halloween candy was in the stores in August and gone by mid-October. Christmas decorations began appearing in stores before Halloween and will be gone by Christmas Day to be replaced with Valentine's Day items. Waiting is not a strong suit in our culture. Yet that is what we are being told to do in Advent: wait and watch.

In our broader culture, Advent is barely a thought. But the Church invites us to stop the mad rush to Christmas and spend time waiting and watching for God. Our first reading from Isaiah shows that a certain level of impatience has always been part of the human condition: "Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down!" Reflecting on the condition of the people, the prophet realizes that they are not prepared for that coming. We too wish that God would come down in a spectacular way, but are we ready for such a coming?

In many ways we are like the people of Isaiah's time, we are not always in tune with God's will. We still need shaping by His hands. The time we must spend waiting is time that we can use to allow God to renew us and reshape us according to His plans. That requires us to wait and watch.

God moves at His own pace, not on our demand. God knows that true, fundamental growth and change require time. Organic things grow slowly, unlike our artificial devices, but the growth process is profound. God is refashioning us each day—if we allow Him. We need patience to wait and receive, to allow His grace to take root in us, watching for those opportunities to encounter Him.

Saint Paul reminds us that we have been given so many graces already that will prepare us for the encounter with Christ and the coming of the Kingdom.

Don't rush past Advent this year. Stop, reflect, wait, and watch for the ways that God is speaking to us today so that we will be ready, not just for the celebration of Christmas, but for the Kingdom of Heaven.

Friday December 8th is a Holy Day of Obligation and the Patronal Feast of the United States, The Immaculate Conception of Mary. Don't forget to join us for Mass.

Mark your calendars: The Light is On for You: confession will be available at all of our churches on the evening of December 13th.





Communal Anointing of the Sick Saturday, December 9th at 10:30 a.m. Mass in Saint Cecilia Church. Our parish invites all those Catholics who may be ill to this sacred encounter, that they might know that Christ, who often visited and healed the sick, loves them in their illness.

The first week of Advent is the candle of hope. Also known as the "prophecy candle," it is in this first week of Advent that we remember Old Testament prophecies of the coming Messiah. The candle's color is purple to symbolize the royalty of Jesus Christ.


