Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever deeper love. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present — body, blood, soul, and divinity — under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Those who seek priesthood respond generously to God's call using the words of the prophet, "Here I am, send me" (Is 6:8). Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. But even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing. Arrangements are made by calling the Pastoral Center.

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

The Book of Job is a reflection on the meaning of suffering framed by a story. The story that begins and ends the book is how Job, a righteous man who loves God does what is right, experiences tremendous suffering at the instigation of Satan who asserts that if God were to allow Job to suffer, he would reject God. At the end of the story, God restores Job's health and blessings because he remains faithful to God.

In between this story, Job and three friends (joined by a fourth friend later in the book) discuss the meaning of suffering. Job's friends say that suffering comes as a punishment for our sins; if Job suffers it must be for something that he has done. Job protests his innocence and asks God to provide him with an answer. In the end, God speaks to Job and says that the mysteries of existence are too much for Job to understand. Job is satisfied because God has spoken to him.

It's not possible to do justice to this book in such a short summary. But it does invite us to reflect deeply on the meaning of human suffering. Suffering relates to sin, but not in all cases is it necessarily a result of our own personal sins. We are caught up in a web of suffering that encompasses all of humanity. Like Job, we cry out to God for answers. Additionally, like Job, we have received a reply from God. Jesus is God's answer to suffering.

In this week's passage from Mark's gospel, Jesus heals the sick. God does extend healing towards us, sometimes in extraordinary ways and sometimes in ordinary ways through the love of those inspired by the Lord to care for the sick. But, His miracles of healing were only signs of His deeper purpose: to uproot suffering by uprooting sin. Sin alienates us from God. It leads many to destructive behaviors that affect not only themselves, but everyone else. Because of original sin, we do not understand God's purposes and the devil uses that to try to drive a further wedge between us and God. In Jesus, God comes to take upon Himself our suffering, to free us from sin and to reconnect us with God. Once we are connected with God, then the mysteries of existence become bearable, because, like Job, God has spoken to us. More than that, God has visited us and remains with us, inviting us to remain with Him for all eternity.

This picture depicts one of the founding fathers of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul visiting the home of a needy family. That same picture taken today would show modern clothing and furnishings but little has changed over the last 200 years. From the Society's beginning, the central and most basic activity of Conferences has been visiting the needy in their homes. This is the clearest symbol of our Vincentian spiritual gifts, which dictates the highest respect for the dignity of the poor. It symbolizes our Vincentian commitment to truly serve those in need, rather than requiring them to come to us. In their own home, people feel most free to confide their stories of struggle. In that family setting, Vincentians are asked to listen, offer humble advice, and render assistance. Just as in the beginning of the

Society, two Vincentians sit with them, listen to them, and bring their needs before God in prayer. We visit not merely to drop off groceries or pay a bill, but to form relationships based on trust and friendship. Since the founding of Our Lady of the Valley Conference eight years ago, over 600 Home Visits have been made. Look closely at the faces of those in the picture above. What do you see? We are inspired to search for the face of Christ.

RCIA - What are the Scrutinies?

The ritual book for RCIA describes the scrutinies as follows: "The scrutinies, which are solemnly celebrated on the 3rd, 4th, and 5th Sundays of Lent and are reinforced by an exorcism, are rites for self-searching and repentance, and have, above all, a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect {those preparing for the sacraments of baptism, confirmation, and the Eucharist}; to bring out, then strengthen, all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all" (No. 141). Please pray for our RCIA Candidates as they continue to prepare for the Easter sacraments.






