Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Confirmation: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

There is an old saying 'familiarity breeds contempt.' In its original context it has to do with class or hierarchical distinctions. If those in charge don't maintain a healthy distance, their subordinates may lose a sense of their authority and the respect that should be part of that authority.

But we can also see in the phrase something true about how we tend to treat things to which we have become accustomed. We overlook the familiar, the everyday. We take things and people for granted. We no longer allow ourselves to be surprised by the commonplace.

Sometimes the most familiar and, therefore, the most easily disregarded is the voice of God coming to us through the Church. In Tradition and Sacred Scripture, the essential part of Tradition, God speaks to us. Yet the temptation arises to ignore that wisdom. We've heard it before, it's the same old thing. In place of a respect for the Wisdom of the ages, they look for, and are impressed by, novel substitutes. The Catholic apologist G. K. Chesterton observed this kind of tendency over a hundred years ago:

"For the modern world will accept no dogmas upon any authority; but it will accept any dogmas on no authority. Say that a thing is so, according to the Pope or the Bible, and it will be dismissed as a superstition without examination. But preface your remark merely with "they say" or "don't you know that?" or try (and fail) to remember the name of some professor mentioned in some newspaper; and the keen rationalism of the modern mind will accept every word you say."

The people of Jesus' village were so familiar with Jesus they didn't want to accept that He was the One sent by God. They put no faith in Him. Because of their lack of faith, He could do little for them.

We pray that we may always be open to the wisdom of Jesus, His Church, and to all the true sources of His wisdom.

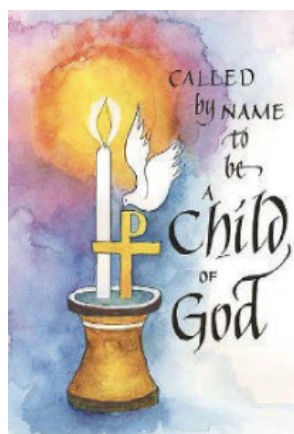

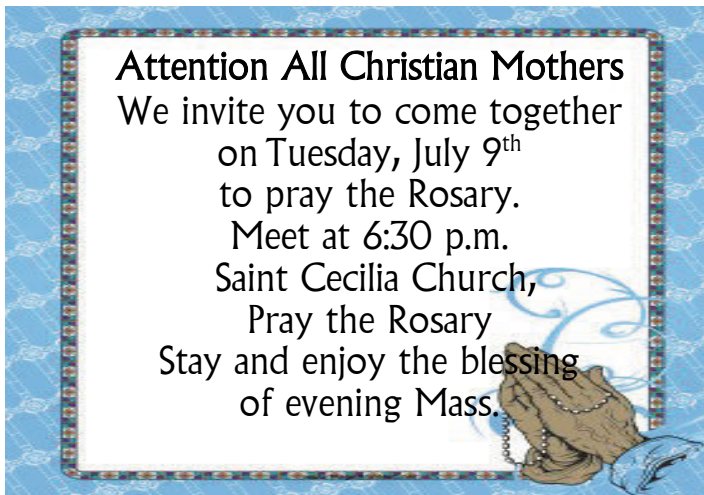

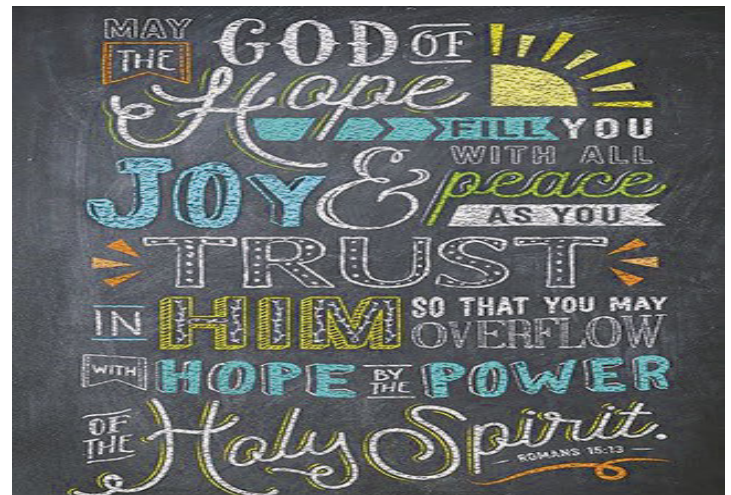

Safe Environment

Our Lady of the Valley Parish will be audited this summer. Our goal is to be 100% compliant with all of the safe environment clearances and training. ***All volunteers and employees with expired clearances will not be able to volunteer or be employed. Your file will be archived until these requirements are updated.***

Have you been notified to update your child abuse clearances? The Pennsylvania Child Abuse History Certification and FBI Fingerprint Clearance must be renewed every five years. You can check the status of your clearances by logging into www.virtusonline.org.

Have you completed the **Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults 3.2** course? The Diocese of Pittsburgh mandates that all people who work with children and youth in our parishes and schools and vulnerable adults must undergo child abuse prevention training through the VIRTUS program. The Protecting God's Children 3.2 course focuses on how to recognize the signs of abuse, neglect, or exploitation in both children and adults.

Please register for this course by visiting virtusonline.org. You will need to know your USERID and password. If you have attempted to recover your password and/or user ID and have not been successful (including if you have an outdated email address in the VIRTUS system), please communicate with the VIRTUS Help Desk via email at helpdesk@virtus.org or call 1.888.847.8870.

There are two computers available at the Saint Cecilia office. I am very willing to help you complete this course. If you need assistance completing the course or any child abuse clearance requirements, contact Andrea Korcan-Buzza, Safe Environment Coordinator, at 724.775.4111 or andrea@olotv.org.

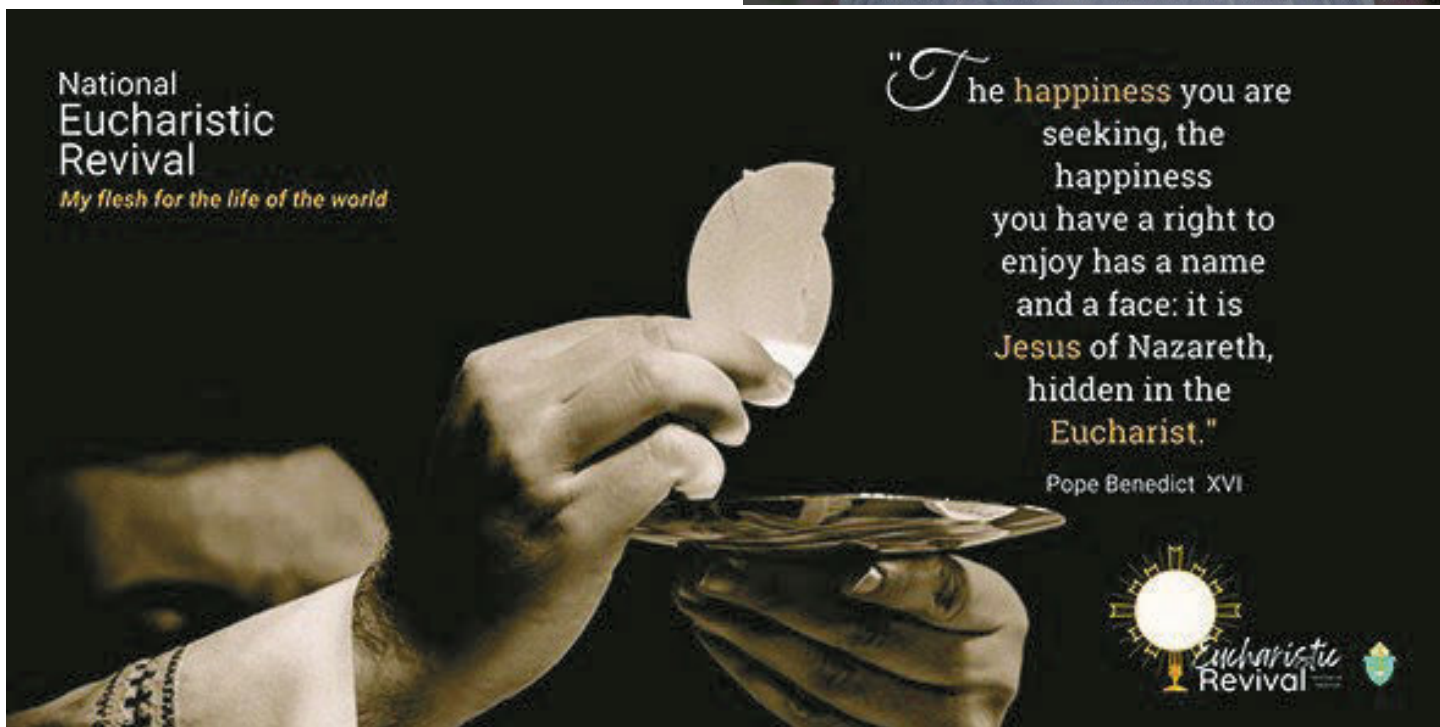
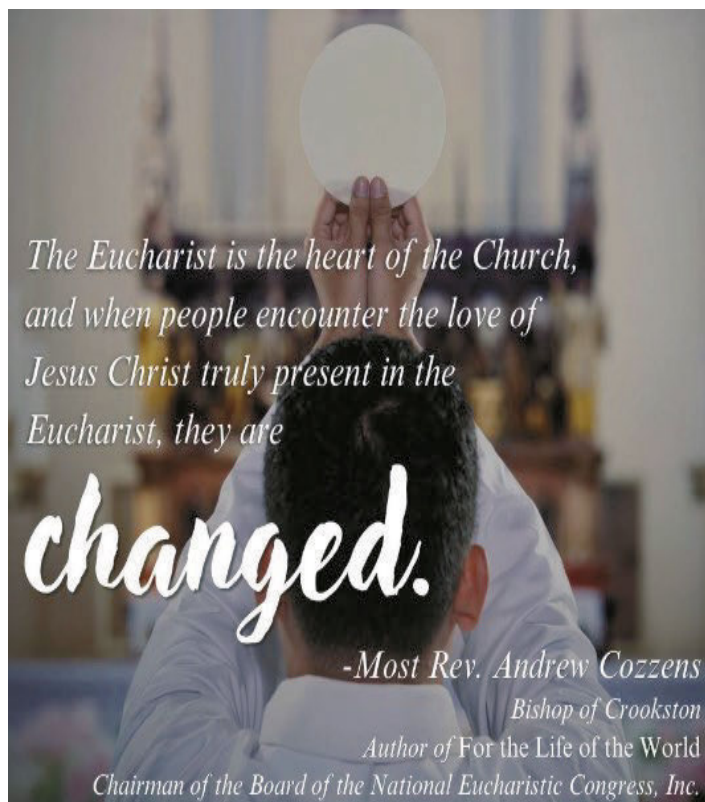

Vincentsians at Our Lady of the Valley help needy families and individuals within our communities with material and financial support. 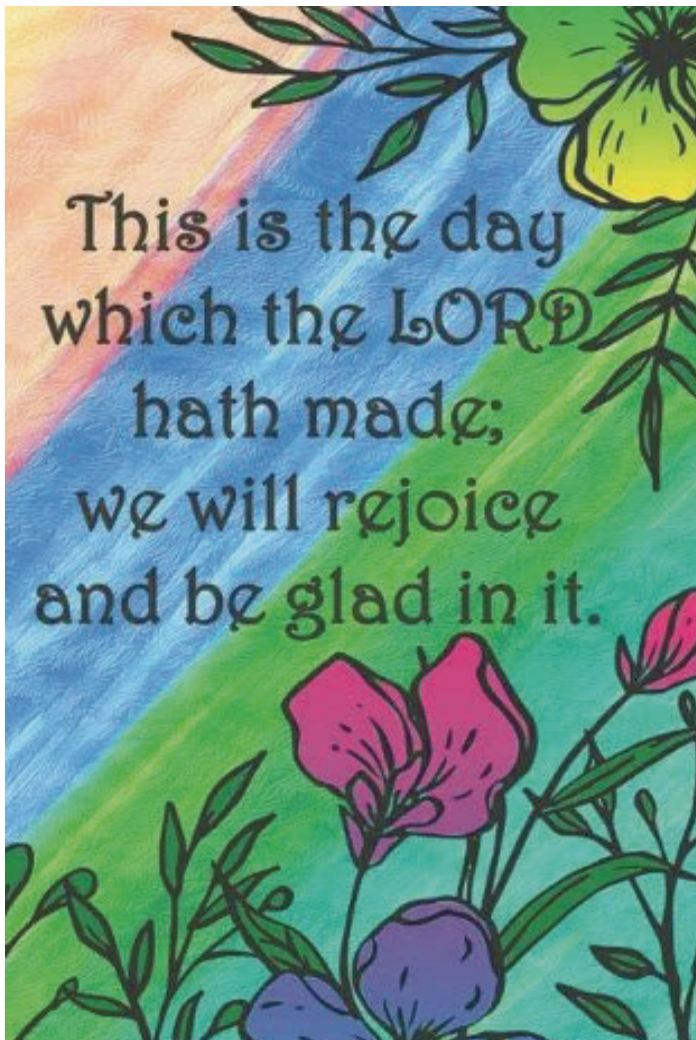

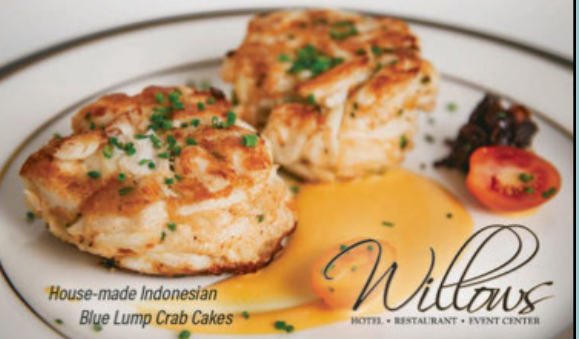
