

Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Confirmation: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

Arise to Glory

Dear Friends:

For most people, today is Groundhog Day with its ritual gathering in Punxsutawney awaiting the weather forecast of the groundhog: an early Spring or an extension of winter? Groundhog Day is a bit of fun, but it captures our longing for new life, sunlight and warmth in the dead of winter. We want the shadows of life dispelled and the light to shine brightly on us.

For the Church, today is the Feast of the Presentation. The Infant Christ is brought to the Temple in Jerusalem to be dedicated to God in keeping with the Law. As He is brought there by Mary and Joseph, an elderly man, Simeon, hails Him as a "light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel." Because Jesus is hailed on this day as the light, the Church takes this day to bless candles for use in worship, for this reason the day became known as Candlemas Day.

The same theme that is present in our folk festival: light and shadow is the focus of our worship today. Only in our prayer, we are not so much focused on the passage of the seasons, or physical light and darkness as we are on spiritual realities. Jesus comes to dispel the darkness of sin and death that cast their shadows over our lives. He comes to offer us the light of God's wisdom and grace.

Whether or not Spring is around the corner, today's celebration reminds us that Jesus brings us the light and warmth of the Spirit each day, each season.




