Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

<u>Reconciliation</u>: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present -- body, blood, soul, and divinity -- under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

<u>Confirmation</u>: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

<u>Priesthood</u>: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

<u>Anointing of the Sick</u>: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

Arise to Glory

Please remember in your prayers the soul of **Robert Cercone**, and all the faithful departed. May they rest in peace. Please also pray for the consolation of those who grieve for the dearly departed.

Dear Friends:

In an essay written in 1942 titled "The Weight of Glory", C. S. Lewis spoke of the glory that awaits us in the Kingdom to come.

Life presents us with hints of this glory in the longings and joys we feel in life. When understood properly, these point us to the deepest longings of the human heart: God Himself. Our goal in life is to dwell in the Presence of the Lord forever, to see His face and to know that we are seen by Him with delight.

To live in this kind of communion with God will fill us with a radiant light, a joy that never ends. We will at last be as He intended all humanity to be at the time of creation, truly God's image and likeness.

Jesus, the true and perfect image of the Father, reveals His glory to the disciples at a crucial moment on the mountain where the Transfiguration takes place. Jesus comes to lead us back to the original state that God intended for us, He will lead those willing to follow Him to the Tree of Life.

As He had previously revealed to the disciples, the real Tree of Life will be His cross; on the cross He will reveal the depths of His love for us, He will give Himself for us and to us. The fruit of the cross is the Eucharist, a sharing in Christ's own life. With the cross still ahead of them, He wished them to see what the cross will lead to - the shining glory of the Resurrection. If we live in Christ, sharing His cross, we too will shine with that glory.

In regard to that glory, Lewis observes that while it may be consoling for us to ponder our future glory if we stay united with Christ, it is necessary that we reflect on our neighbor's potential future glory. The people we encounter each day are not ordinary, each of us will be either "an eternal splendor or an everlasting horror." And as Lewis says: "All day long we are, in some degree, helping each other to one or the other of these destinations."

Lewis goes on to say: "our charity must be a real and costly love, with deep feeling for the sins in spite of which we love the sinner—no mere tolerance or indulgence which parodies love as flippancy parodies merriment. Next to the Blessed Sacrament itself, your neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses. If he is your Christian neighbor, he is holy in almost the same way, for in him also Christ, *vere latitat* (truly hidden)—the glorifier and the glorified, Glory Himself, is truly hidden."

May our Lenten journey help us to help each other on this path of transfiguration.

Bishop Zubik will be joining us accompanied by our diocesan seminarians, including our parishioner Anthony Perini, to lead the Stations of the Cross on Friday, March 21st, at Saint Cecilia's at 7:00 p.m.

Our Lady of the Valley Society of Saint Vincent de Paul: Healing and Peace

Calls for assistance from the many needy in our communities continue to come in to our Help Line. The winter has been long, the days cold, and nights dark. The impact on those who have fallen into crisis is devastating when the lights go off, the heat quits, the water stops running, the food cupboard is empty, and the apartment is padlocked. Where do you turn? Our Help Line "Hello!" and our Home Visit "Hi!" are the first signs of comfort and consolation. So far this winter 43 families have reached out when they had no place else to go. Nineteen families had utility bills that could not be met, with six facing impending shut off. Twenty one families could not pay the rent and four faced eviction. Some lost hope as they had fallen so far behind in all their bills, as there were also needs for transportation, food, and household items. Vincentians answered the calls, visited their homes and pledged more than \$8000 of assistance to help these families find some relief and discover a way forward leading to renewed hope. Vincentians met the innocent faces of thirty one children and turned them to smiles.

Maria (not her real name) has settled into a comfortable life with a great job and cozy apartment not far from one of our churches. She loves her job as an in-home caregiver for special needs individuals. Unfortunately she was hit by a car and sustained injuries that prevent her from returning until she obtains full mobility, expecting to be fully recovered over a two month period. She is waiting for approval for short-term disability and has fallen behind in rent, gas, and electric bills. During the Home Visit two Vincentians went to work to see how they could help Maria get through this period until fully healed. The landlord agreed to waive all late fees with our pledge to bring the rent bill current; and both Duquesne Light and Columbia Gas also accepted our pledge to pay the past due amounts on Maria's behalf. She is now in a position to stay current with all of her bills and return to work without a financial burden when life returns to normal. Maria is a hard working Christian mother and grandmother. She is doing everything in her power to pay what she can under these unexpected circumstances until she is cleared for her full time duties. Vincentians and Maria prayed together at the Home Visit for continued healing and peace. Please join in this prayer.


