Sacraments

Baptism: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Confirmation: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

Priesthood: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

A Letter From Our Pastor

Dear Friends:

“Do you love me?”

Whenever we hear this question, we know that it comes from a heart that is seeking reassurance. Perhaps because the person is feeling very much alone, questioning their own worth, needing affirmation. Or perhaps something has happened between us and they are seeking clarity as to whether we truly are committed to them in love and friendship.

Jesus does not need affirmation from us. He is deeply rooted in the divine love that passes between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. He is pleased to receive our love, not because He needs it, but because we need to love Him. When He questions our love, it is because we have allowed ourselves to act in a way that seems inconsistent with loving Him. We have allowed something else to take His place in our lives, we have not loved others, or our own self, in a way that is consistent with loving Him. He wants us to turn away from whatever has come between us and His love. He once again asks for our heart.

In this beautiful scene from John’s Gospel, the Risen Lord appears to His disciples. He guides their fishing expedition so that they catch an abundance of fish. Then as they gather before the fire to eat, He asks Simon Peter that question: “Do you love me?”

We know that around another fire Peter had denied that he even knew who Jesus was. Now, he has the opportunity to affirm His love for Jesus around this fire, three times, to walk back the three-fold denial. Jesus heals Peter and brings him back to where he belongs.

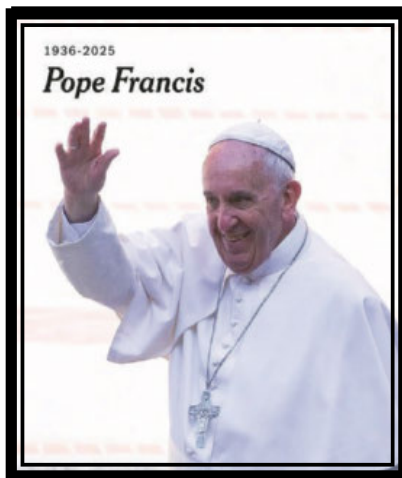
Jesus asks each one of us, this question: “Do you love me?” He asks it of us when we commit to following Him. He asks us when we lose our way. He asks us this question because He loves us, and wants us to love Him in return, knowing that it is only in His love that we find our fulfillment. If we say with Peter, “yes Lord, you know that I love you,” then we will hear that same invitation He gave Peter: “Come follow me.”

The latter part of this passage from Saint John was read at the funeral of Pope Francis. Obviously, there is the connection between this second call of Peter and the Pope. Each are charged to feed the sheep and tend the lambs, the Pope as the successor of Peter. This applies to every disciple as well as we must love Jesus by tending those whom He puts into our lives. This is how we demonstrate our love for Him.

The Pope, as the successor of Peter, has the great and heavy task of tending the worldwide flock of God. For this reason, we pray for him at every Mass. Anticipating the election of a new Pope, we pray for the Cardinals of the Church who are tasked with electing the new Pope.

Pray for them as they enter into the Conclave, that open to the guidance of the Holy Spirit, they will choose the one who will say to the Lord: “you know that I love you” and accept the task of caring for the flock.

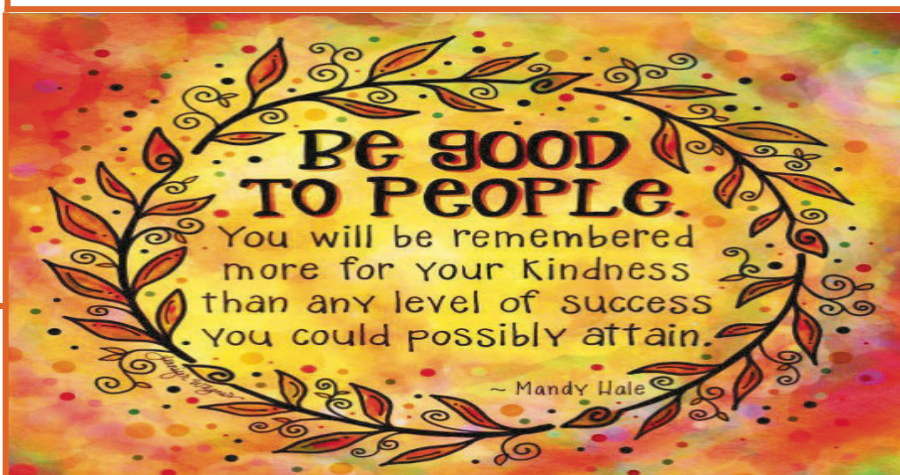



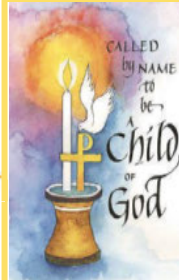
Our Lady of the Valley Parish Picnic 2025

My dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

“And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it.” (Matthew 16:18)

Our Lady of the Valley Society of Saint Vincent de Paul: Always There

Our neighbors in need have reached out to Our Lady of the Valley Help Line as they face overwhelming crisis that affects their family's safety and well-being. We have received 75 calls for assistance since the beginning of the year, and many were referred to Saint Vincent de Paul from agencies in our community who cannot help improve their situation. It saddens the heart: struggling with electric, gas, water, and sewer bills, sometimes to the point of shutoff; delivery of heating oil or propane to keep the furnace running; soaring past due rent balances to the point of eviction; no food on the shelves or in the fridge and no transportation to get to a food bank; no pillow or bed to sleep on, no table or chairs to eat on, no lamp to see by; can't get to work for the new job to break the string of bad luck; no supplies for the joyous occasion of a newly arriving baby. Our Vincentians walk into their homes, offer comfort and hope, and try to resolve the threats to their welfare. Through your generous gifts, 51 families have received over \$13,000 of assistance so far this year. We remember the faces of 40 children to whom you have brought smiles.

Many times this help and guidance is enough to put families on a good path forward. However, for some, it only "keeps their heads above water" and they return because of the kindness and understanding they find with their Vincentian friends. Jane (not her real name) sought our help a few weeks ago after falling behind in her electric, water, and sewer bills. We initially met Jane in late 2023 when her electric was about to be shut off. She is a young mother of three small children who faced crisis when her disabled son was diagnosed with a rare disease requiring intensive medical treatment. Then, in early 2024, a medical emergency brought an unexpected ambulance bill that left her with no way to pay. In the Fall of last year, Jane again reached out for help to enroll in a low income assistance program from Duquesne Light after her husband's job loss.
