Sacraments

<u>Baptism</u>: In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. Please contact Gary or Tina Grimm at 724.495.2385 one week prior to class.

Reconciliation: The Sacrament of Penance is God's gift to us so that any sin committed after Baptism can be forgiven. In confession, we have the opportunity to repent and recover the grace of friendship with God.

Eucharist: In the celebration of the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. Christ is truly present – body, blood, soul, and divinity – under the appearances of bread and wine. This is what the Church means when she speaks of the "Real Presence" of Christ in the Eucharist.

Confirmation: In the Sacrament of Confirmation, the baptized person is "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit" and is strengthened for service to the Body of Christ.

Matrimony: The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act. Arrangements should be made with a priest at least six months in advance. Pre-marriage classes, and meetings with the priest, are necessary. One party to be married must be a registered parishioner and a practicing Catholic.

<u>Priesthood</u>: Ordination to the priesthood is always a call and a gift from God. Christ reminded his Apostles that they needed to ask the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into the harvest. Contact our Pastor.

Anointing of the Sick: When the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is given, the hoped-for effect is that, if it be God's will, the person be physically healed of illness. Even if there is no physical healing, the primary effect of the Sacrament is a spiritual healing.

Dear Friends:

The Fourth Sunday in the Easter season is unofficially called Good Shepherd Sunday because the Gospel passage for this Sunday in each of the three-year cycle of readings comes from the tenth chapter of Saint John's Gospel where Jesus identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd.

An interesting note about this Sunday's readings is that Jesus is identified as both shepherd and as the Lamb of God. In our reading from Saint John's Gospel, Jesus emphasizes His protecting care of the sheep which flows from His oneness with the Father. Jesus is One with the Father and thus able to care for the sheep as no other shepherd can.

In our reading from the Book of Revelation, Jesus is referred to as the Lamb. He stands before the throne, washes His chosen ones in His blood and shepherds them to life giving water. He is one like us and can lead us as no other shepherd can.


Jesus is God and, therefore, able to do for us that which we cannot do for ourselves, but He does so as one of us so that, as a member of humanity, He accomplishes what we need to do to affect our salvation. Only God can save us, but we need to have a role in our salvation. Saint Augustine says, "God would not save us, without us." In the Incarnation, God makes it happen.

This way of bringing us salvation also extends to the way in which the salvation of Jesus, the mission of Jesus comes to us and continues among us. We receive His grace through the ministries of fellow humans. They teach us about Him, they give His gifts to us in the Sacraments, together we tend to one another as the shepherd tends the flock, as the mother ewe cares for her young.

God reveals Himself to us in Jesus, and Jesus continues to reveal Himself to us through one another. Popes, bishops, priests, deacons, religious, parents, teachers, each of our fellow disciples reveal Jesus to us when they tend to us according to the example of Jesus, the Good Shepherd. Though faith is a gift from God, it's planting in us and its growth comes from the care that others have shown us in leading us to Jesus and showing us His compassion in the way that they care for us. We are called to imitate them as they imitate the Good Shepherd. Cared for by Jesus, we are called to care for others as well.

We first experienced that tender care from our parents. It's fitting that this Good Shepherd Sunday is also Mother's Day. Our mothers modeled for us the tender care of the Lord in the way they cared for us. They fed us from the substance of their own lives in our earliest stages of life. They showed us the way that leads to life. Today, we thank God for them and pray for them that they may always live in the Presence of the Good Shepherd.



Our Lady of the Valley Society of Saint Vincent de Paul: Good Stewards

Our Lady of the Valley Conference of the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul has cared for the needy of our community since 2016. In that time, more than 7,000 individuals have sought our help as they faced crisis in their homes and insecurity within their family. Vincentians visit their homes to help with bills, and invite them into our Food Pantry to confront hunger. It has been a labor of love supported by members of our parish; your care and concern funded over \$250,000 of aid in food and monetary assistance. We pause to reflect on the good that has come through God's providence.

As we look to the future, we see the needs of those in our community who are less fortunate continue to grow. So far in 2025, we have received almost 30% more calls for help with bills, and over 40% more Food Pantry visitors than the same time last year. We are blessed to have parish members join this mission of love and mercy and share their treasure. We can face these challenges with determination and confidence. The Food Pantry is a formidable undertaking as we serve over 100 families each month and require \$3,500 to operate every time the doors open. Additionally, it is a daunting task to meet the needs of 20 to 30 families in crisis who call our Help Line each month and devote another \$4,000 to address their suffering and offer hope. We are humbled by your response to help our Friends In Need restore their lives, keep safe their children, and regain their dignity. We pause to reflect on the good that has come through God's providence.

Vincentians strive to live our lives inspired by Gospel values as Saint Vincent taught his followers. One of these lessons was shown by the early Christians who believed everything comes from God and they were to be good stewards of these gifts shared for the common good. This was more than friendship; this was love – love of neighbor. With this mindset of love, they shared with the church, with the community, and with the kingdom of God. The Holy Spirit poured out His gifts lavishly upon those early Christians as they were united in love for each other. They witnessed the love of Christ, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and the unity of the Christian faith. We pause to reflect what has come through God's providence: Today, the Our Lady of the Valley community gives freely to do good and fills the entire family with acts of charity and good will. Witness our Catholic faith at work in acts of mercy, generous giving, and fervent prayer, serving our brothers and sisters as Christ taught.
